WRESTLING . . . Bald Eagles STC champs for second year

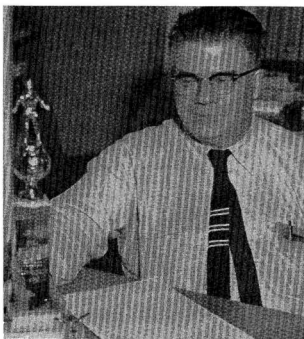
Winning six out of eight final matches in the Pennsylvania STC Wrestling Tournament, Lock Haven is the STC champion for the second year in succession. In regular season competition the Bald Eagles won seven out of nine meets against very worthy opposition. The only two defeats were at the hands of the University of Pittsburgh and Waynesburg College.

Coach Hubert Jack's grapplers entered the Wilkes College Tournament on December 28-29 and won a very respectable second place behind the powerful Pitt Panthers—one of the top teams in the East.

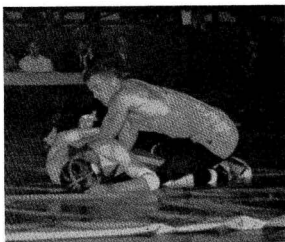

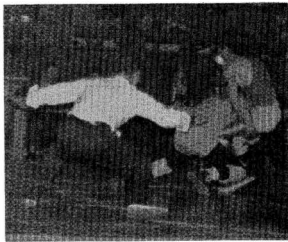
Two valuable seniors lost by graduation are Charles Goldthrop and John Ellwood.

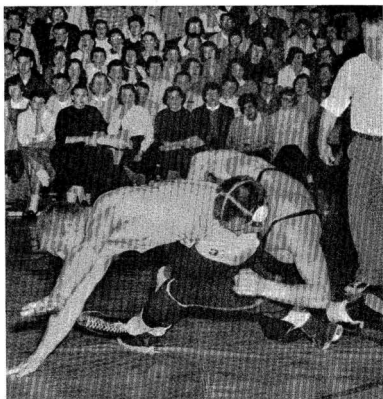

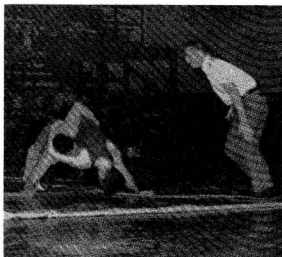
