The Oswego wrestling team embarked on its third season with an ambitious schedule of four meets at home and five on the road. The team was composed almost entirely of freshmen, including three, Brian Pederson 123 lb., Bob Moore 130 lbs., and Phil Hurwitz heavyweight, who had never wrestled before coming to Oswego.

Veterans John Button, 147 lbs., with one season's experience and Nick Argona 177 lbs., with two seasons, helped greatly to form a nucleus around which to build a team. Chuck Donahue 157 lbs., with high school experience, and Ed Kreuscher 177 lbs., an experienced wrestler from Long Island, and Walt Wheeler 167 lbs., helped to give the much needed strength in the middle weights. Pat Augustine 137 lbs., with the experience of three years wrestling in the Marine Corps, finished the season with a record of 8 matches won and one loss.

Chuck Donahue, Pat Augustine and Maynard Matteson, a 157 pounder went to the Wilkes College wrestling tournament.

This tournament, held annually in December, is the largest in the country. Some 260 amateur wrestlers, representing 50 college, high school, YMCA and independent teams were entered. Thirty-five of the teams scored points in the meet; and of these, Oswego tied for 20th with Rutgers and Girard College.

The coaches, David See, and Joseph Scandura feel that the team has done well, and that prospects are bright for a better season next year.
