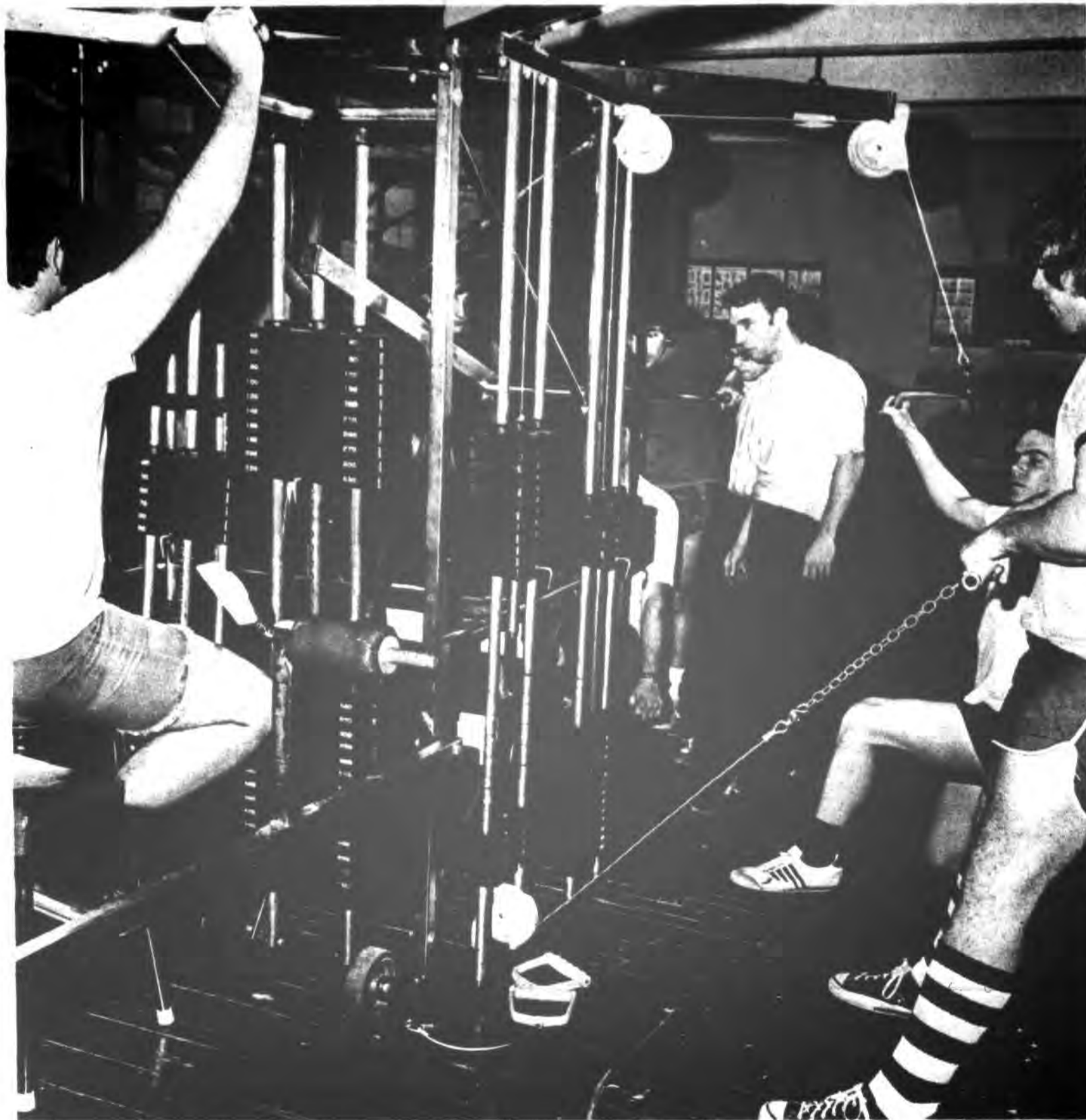

If Janet competes in the XII Games in Denver in 1976 it will be her third Olympics. At the age of 14 she was one of the youngest competitors in the 1968 Games at Grenoble. She finished ninth.

The Canandaigua Braves and the Geneva High Panthers loom as the top contenders in the Wayne-Finger Lakes, Eastern Division wrestling tournament, which gets underway tonight and ends tomorrow night in the Mynderse Academy gym in Seneca Falls.

The Braves will go into the annual mat war with five number one seeded wrestlers and two second seeded wrestlers while Geneva has three grapplers seeded number one and three seeded number two.

The Braves, unbeaten in the league during the regular season, are favored, but the Panthers, beaten only by Canandaigua in the league, could put up a stiff fight.

After these two league powers, it seems pretty much of a toss-up among four of the remaining seven teams. The top four challengers to Canandaigua and Geneva are Penn Yan, Mynderse, Midlakes and Wayne Central. Newark, Waterloo and Palmyra-Macedon probably will be battling to stay out of the bottom of the heap.

Mynderse has two wrestlers top seeded while Midlakes, Wayne and Penn Yan each have one. Midlakes however, has three second seeded men while Penn Yan and Wayne have two second seeded wrestlers apiece.

Newark has one second seed while Waterloo and Palmyra-Macedon have no seeded wrestlers.

The top seeded wrestlers from Canandaigua are Gene Giliotti (98), Mike Chapelle (105), Dennis Jones (119), Bruce Hadsell (126), Jim Hartwell (138).

Number one seeded from Geneva are Ed Notebaert (112), Steve Bero (132), and Steve McConnell (177).

Lynn Chuley and Matt Nozzolio of Mynderse are number one seeds at 145 and unlimited respectively while Al Keller of Midlakes is seeded number one at 167. Steve Horrigan of Penn Yan is the choice at heavyweight.

Horrigan, one of three returning champions, is seeking his third straight title.

The other two champions, hoping to repeat are Canandaigua's Hartwell at 138 and Geneva's Bill Welsh. Welsh, second seeded at 119 pounds, copped the 112 pound championship last year.

The eliminations will be held tonight at 6, with first round action to follow. Tomorrow, things will get underway at 4 p.m. with the consolations slated for 7 and the finals for 8:30.

While the W-FL East tourney is going on, two more wrestling tournaments in the area will be in progress.

At Dundee, the Lakes Region tournament will be taking place while at Marion, the W-FL West Division teams will be fighting it out.

The Lakes Region tournament should

be loaded with excitement, as Dundee, Watkins Glen and Odessa-Montour, all finished the regular season with identical 3-1 records and tied for first place in the standings.

Because of the three-way tie at the end of the regular season, the team which racks up the most points, either Dundee, Odessa or Watkins, will be crowned the overall league champion.

The top seeded wrestlers from Dundee are Sam Maruzarz (98), Carl Davidson (119), Mike Neufeld (126) and Bill Carruthers (177).

Top seeded from Odessa-Montour are Gordon Craver (105), Dave Hanville (.12), Dave Grover (145) and Nick Barra (155).

George Bond and Dan Fransese, both of Watkins Glen are top seeded at 132 and 138 respectively while South Seneca's Brian Walawender is top seeded at 177 and T-Burg's Mark Swanhart rates as the top heavyweight.

The Lakes Region tourney will begin tomorrow at 2 p.m. with first round action, followed by the consolations at 6:30 and the finals at 7:30.

Tickets at the door will be sold on a first-come, first served basis, because of the small seating capacity in the Dundee gym.

Victor rates a solid favorite to walk off with honors in the W-FL West tourney.

Actually, this tourney is just a duplicate of the event held last year, only this time it is called the pre-quarter-final round of the Section 5 Class B tourney.

Last week Victor ran away with the title, winning six of the final matches. North Rose-Wolcott was a distant second, followed by Marion, Sodus, Lyons, Honeoye and Whitman.

The top seeds from Victor are Rich Johnson (105), Mark Ferris (132), Brad Ahonen (138), John Toomey (145), Mike Guinan (117) and Dan Congdon (unlimited).

North Rose-Wolcott's Dennis Verkest is number one at 98 pounds while teammate John Abrams is tops at 112.

From Marion, Hugh Mason is number one at 167 while John Loveless is tops at heavyweight. Curley McKenzie at 126 and Carl Fitzsimmons at 119. Bill Wigent of Lyons is top seeded at 155.

The preliminaries will begin at 1 p.m. tomorrow and run through to 5 p.m. The finals will begin at 7.

All three tourneys act as a pre-quarter final round of the Section 5 tourney.
