

Dundee has six champions —

Scots capture Lakes tourney, league titles

DUNDEE — With six champions, the Dundee Scotsmen captured the Lakes Region wrestling tournament and also laid claim to the league championship, Saturday.

In the final conference tournament (the Lakes Region dissolves after this school year), the Scots wound up with 103½ points to finish ahead of Odessa-Mountour with 96, Watkins Glen with 85, Trumansburg with 64½ and South Seneca with 49½.

The Scots needed just about every championship they got to win the title.

Going into the finals, Dundee had 83½ points while Odessa-Montour had 83 and Watkins Glen had 81.

Since Dundee, Odessa-Montour and Watkins Glen all finished the league season with 3-1 records, the league championship was listed as a bonus prize in the tournament.

Sam Marusarz got the Scots going when he won the 98 pound title with a 5-0 decision over Arky Phillips of Odessa-Montour.

Odessa's Indians forged into the lead

when Gordon Craver decided Tom Boyce, 7-4, at 105 pounds and Dave Hanville beat Garry Groom, 4-0 in overtime at 112 pounds in head to head matches between Odessa and Dundee.

But the Scots went back on top when Carl Davidson scored an 8-3 win over Calvin Crouch of Watkins at 119 pounds and Mike Neufeld pinned T-Burg's Gary Miller in 3:40 of the 126 pound test.

George Bond of Watkins helped the Scots when he became the only winner from his school, pinning Odessa's Greg Phenés in 5:12 of the 132 pound contest.

The Scots then wrapped things up with a pair of surprise winners as Harold Smith scored a 13-7 decision over Dan Franzese of Watkins at 138 pounds and Randy Cotton upset Lee Grover of Odessa, 11-4, at 145 pounds.

Odessa's Nick Barra, voted the outstanding wrestler in the tournament, proved his right to the honor when he pinned Dundee's 155 pounder, Claude Andrews in 34 seconds.

The Scots finished their scoring with their sixth title when 167 pound Bill Carruthers scored a pin over John Bianco of Watkins Glen at 3:54.

Odessa then clinched second place when Bill Merrill upset South Seneca's big hope, 177 pounder Brian Walawender, 5-4.

Mark Swanhart put Trumansburg into the title picture when he scored a pin in 5:13 against Odessa heavyweight Tim Havens.

Tom Brown of Trumansburg then won the unlimited Class title with a pin in 19 seconds against Al Foster of Watkins Glen.

Both the winners and runnersup will advance to the Section 5 quarterfinal matches at Victor on Friday, when the Lakes Region wrestlers meet the Wayne-Finger Lakes West Division champs and runnersup.

Dundee leads the list with nine wrestlers slated to compete at Victor while Odessa-Montour has eight, Watkins Glen five, Trumansburg three and South Seneca one.

Survivors of the action at Victor will go on to the Section 5 semi-finals, finals and the Class A vs. Class B tournament at Fairport on Saturday.
