Host Tonawanda High School, unbeaten in 16 regular-season matches, had three champions and five runners-up Saturday to earn the Section VI Division III wrestling championship with 97 points.

Niagara - Wheatfield High of Canboro, also 16-0 in dual meets, finished second with 93½ points. The school was shooting for its seventh straight Section VI title. Williamsville South High and Lewiston-Porter High School of Lewiston were tied for third with 86½ points.

Tonawanda's winners were: Guy Miller (101 pounds), Jeff Toth (115) and Rick Silvestri (148). Finishing second for the champions were: Glenn Whitlock (106), Dan Doll (129), Steve Gatt (135), Steve Marone (170) and Ron Snyder (253).

Niagara - Wheatfield claimed four champions - Nick Perry (106), Mike Martino (122), Bill Mowrey (129) and Pat Pittman (141).

Orchard Park High School's Pete D'Errico was named the event's outstanding wrestler. The 158-pound champion, seeded third, defeated both the top and second-seeded entrants en route to the title.

Jim Listens To Chris And Wins

BOCA RATON, Fla. (AP) - Top-seeded Jimmy Connors stayed on good behavior Sunday and capitalized on mistakes by Jurgen Fassbender to beat the German star 6-4, 6-2 in the finals of a \$30,000 men's tennis tournament.

Connors, with Chris Evert watching, earned the \$5,000 top prize while Fassbender took home \$3,000 for second place.

In the doubles finals, Juan Gisbert of Spain and Clark Graebner of New York defeated Fassbender and Ion Tiriac of Romania 6-2, 6-1.

Fassbender made crucial mistakes, hitting long shots and a backhand into the net on important points. But he served well, collecting six aces.

In the first set, each player held service until the final game when Connors broke Fassbender at 4-5 and won the match 6-4.

Earlier, Connors was leading 40-love in the sixth game when Fassbender won the next three points for deuce. At one time, Fassbender held break point. But a controversial call on a Connor's shot was ruled just in on the baseline.

"It was a bad call," Fassbender said. "Everybody saw it. It's just one of those things. You can't complain about it.
