

Salamanca's Lee pins at unlimited:

# Olean wins third straight Invitational

Olean, with five individual winners, coasted to its third straight title this weekend in the eighth annual Salamanca Invitational Wrestling Tournament.

The tournament, originally scheduled for 18 teams, saw 13 of them attend despite the closing of several high schools Friday and the forecast for snow and high winds.

Final team scores were as follows: Olean 223½, Sweet Home, 172, Maple Grove 151, Notre Dame of Elmira 145½, Portville 89½, Geneseo 85½, Salamanca 75½, Churchville-Chili 59½, Southwestern 59, Wellsville 52½, Xaverian 28½, Cattaraugus 27½ and Allegany 9½.

Of the 19 undefeated (at least six wins) wrestlers who entered the tourney, seven remain unbeaten. They are Clair Anderson of Olean (16-0) at 105 pounds, Kevin Richard of Geneseo (14-0) at 112, Eric Simpson of Olean (14-0) at 119, Kevin Forrest of Olean (16-0) at 126, Tim Hitchcock of Notre Dame (17-0) at 138, Bob Vogel of Sweet Home (12-0-2) at 145 and Chris Leichtweis of Olean (16-0) at 155.

Anderson was named the outstanding wrestler of the tourney as the sophomore won all four of his matches. He took the final, 5-4, over John McHugh of Sweet Home as all the scoring was done in the first period.

Anderson, seeded second to McHugh, picked up his first period points with two on a takedown, one on an escape and two more on a later takedown. McHugh scored on two reversals.

In Anderson's semi-final match against Scott Sheehan of Notre Dame, Anderson was behind by 4-1 but came back to win, 5-4. He won his first bout with a 13-0 decision over George Bryant of Salamanca and then pinned Dan Carmen of Geneseo in 4:53.

Anderson won in the 91 pound class last year and was one of four repeat winners. The others were Kevin Forrest of Olean at 126, Chris Leichtweis of Olean at 155 (last year at 145) and Pete

Lee of Salamanca at unlimited. Lee was one of only three wrestlers in the unlimited class and he drew a bye into the finals as he was seeded first. In that championship bout, Lee was leading by 7-1, when he took down John Quigley of Olean and pinned in 3:13.

The Salamanca sophomore, who raised his season's mark to 9-2, took his second tourney title this year as he also won at Geneseo.

Others receiving votes for outstanding tourney wrestler were Hitchcock of Notre Dame and Simpson and Forrest of Olean.

Hitchcock picked up three back points and two on takedowns in the first period as he went on to a 12-3 decision over Bill Thomas of Olean at 138 pounds.

Two takedowns, for four points, in the second period and another takedown and escape in the third period gave Hitchcock his 17th straight win without a loss on the year.

Simpson, upping his mark to 14-0, scored all of his nine points in the first two periods before he pinned Kevin Sullivan of Notre Dame at 3:07.

Forrest, at 126 pounds, was tied at 2-2 with Mark Hitchcock of Notre Dame after two periods but then the Huskie picked up an escape and takedown to win his 16th match without a loss.

The other of three pins in the finals went to Kris Meekins of Maple Grove at heavyweight. The senior was tied at 9-9 into the third period but then he took down Doug Wheeler of Churchville-Chili in 5:28 to raise his mark to 12-1-1.

Leichtweis, now 16-0 took a big 6-2, first period lead in his 155 pound match with Jerry Cordier of Notre Dame and then picked up eight points in the third period on two takedowns, back points and an escape to win the 16-4 decision.

Kevin Richard scored two points on a takedown and two for back points in the first two-minute period and then got another takedown and two more back points in the third to come away with an 8-3 decision over Metzger Wilkin of Sweet Home at 112.

Bob Vogel of Sweet Home, at 145 pounds, led by just 4-3 after two periods but took an 8-6 decision over Steve Sawm of Southwestern to drop Swan to 11-1 on the year and raise Vogel to 12-0-2.

Other winners were Pat Hughes of Notre Dame with a 6-5 decision over Craig Weber of Sweet Home at 91 pounds, Dave Proctor of Southwestern in a 9-1 decision over Bill Hettrick of Maple Grove at 98, Paul Reed of Sweet Home by 9-1 over Steve Pancio of Olean at 132, Kirk Stephen of Olean by 6-3 over Mark Jaekle of Portville at 167 and Cedric Hinton of Sweet Home by 4-2 over Rick Fie of Olean.

Olean had nine wrestlers in the finals while Sweet Home placed six, Notre Dame five, Southwestern and Maple Grove two each and Salamanca, Churchville-Chili, Portville and Geneseo one each.

Other place winners for Salamanca were Dan Dry with a third at 138 pounds, Randy Dry at 119 and Marty Redeye at Heavyweight for fourths, and George Metzler at 98, Dan Ciolek at 155 and Jay Weitzel at 167 for fifths.

Randy Dry won his first match but then lost his second, to weight class winner Simpson, and was sent to the wrestlebacks where he won his two matches before losing to Dave Tolnay of Sweet Home for third.

Dan Dry took a decision before losing in the semi-finals and then, in wrestlebacks, won both of his matches to place third, beating Gallon of Sweet Home, 2-1.

Redeye, who took a 10-1 mark into the tourney, won his first two bouts before losing a 6-4 decision to winner Meekins. Redeye then lost a 7-4 decision to Brad Konert of Southwestern for third.

ELLICOTTVILLE — Avenge a loss to the same team last Tuesday, the Eagles of Ellicottville found their home court to their liking as they topped the Wildcats, 69-49, Saturday.

The win moved the Eagles to 4-2 in the league and into a second place tie with Limestone. West Valley drops into fourth with a 3-3 record.

Ellicottville dominated the boards, hit for 40 percent from the field and forced West Valley into many turnovers to win its second straight game.

Mark McLean, who led the game's scoring with 24 points, controlled the boards with 15 rebounds while Eagle teammate Jeff Hinz grabbed 10.

The Eagles made 30 of 77 shots from the field while West Valley hit on 19 of 48 for 39 percent.

Eagle guards Jeff Howard, Jason Curtis, Mark McAndrew and Dan Widger forced the Wildcat turnovers and set up scoring plays for McLean and Dan Delity (16 points). Delity came off the bench in the second quarter to hit five of seven from the field.

West Valley's Cory, Creeley and Don Ford, who had 15 points apiece in last Thursday's win, were held to just six points apiece Saturday.

West Valley won the JV game, 69-57. Ellicottville now has a few days off before they host C League unbeaten, Franklinville Friday. West Valley hosts Limestone Tuesday.

Trouble Makers took just one point but holds onto a lead of eight points over Kool Kats and Early Risers in the Friday Morning Mixed league at Central Lanes.

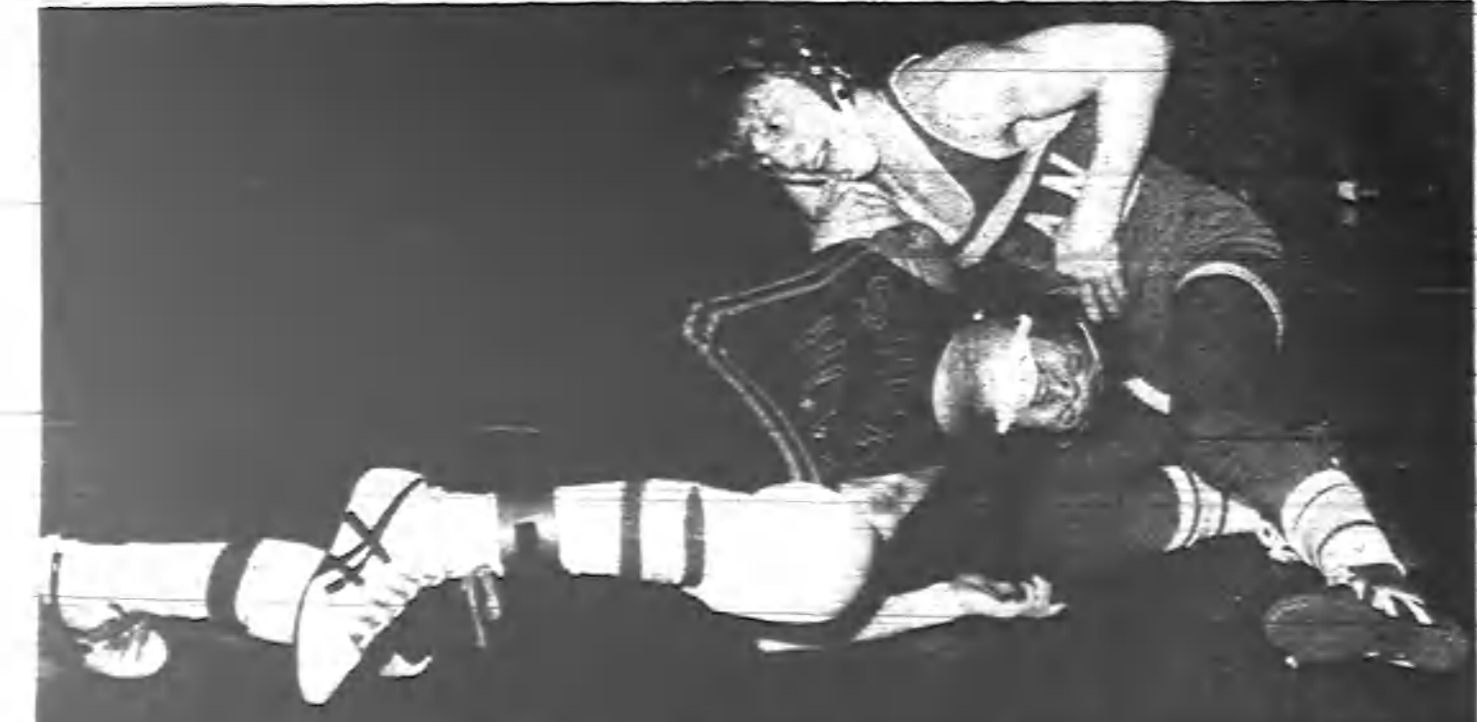
