

Ninth annual Invitational tourney begins Friday with 18 high schools

The preliminary seedings have been organized and everything else is set, except maybe the weather, for this weekend's ninth annual Salamanca Invitational Wrestling Tournament.

Tournament Director George Whitcher set up a preliminary seeding last night and will finalize it later as entries from a total of 18 high schools make up this year's field.

Invitees this year are host Salamanca, Olean, Maple Grove, Sweet Home, Southwestern, Allegany, Wellsville, Pioneer, Medina, Geneseo, Churchville-Chili, Warsaw, Williamsville East, Notre Dame of Elmira, Athens, Pa., Portville, Cassadaga Valley and Cattaraugus.

Wrestling gets underway Friday at 5 p.m. and continues with the first two

rounds through to completion. Action begins again Saturday morning with the finals scheduled for that night.

Two of those squads are undefeated—Olean with an 8-0 mark and Geneseo at 5-0—while eight others have just one loss. The combined won-lost record for the teams is 91-43-1.

Fifteen wrestlers bring undefeated marks into this year's competition and Salamanca has two of those—Marty Redeye with a 15-0 record at heavyweight and Pete Lee with a 9-0 slate at unlimited.

Both were seeded first in their respective weight classes while Dan Ciolek, 14-1 at 169 pounds, rated a second.

The number of top seeds belongs to Olean with five while Salamanca,

Medina and Notre Dame each have two and Geneseo, Southwestern and Portville one each.

Olean, riding a 55-dual meet win streak and returning for a try at its fourth straight title, has top seeds in Bruce Taylor (13-2) at 100 pounds, Clair Anderson (15-0) at 114, George Pancio (14-2) at 128, Robbie Parks (14-2) at 147 and Kirk Stephen (13-1) at 179.

Medina's top two are Tim Menz (10-3) at 93 pounds and Kurt Orsentreter (15-1) at 134; Notre Dame's are Pat Hughes (6-0) at 107 and Scott Sheehan (7-0) at 121; Geneseo has Paul Richard (11-0) at 140; Southwestern has Steve Swan (10-0) at 157; and Portville has Mark Jaekel (16-0) at 169.

The rest of the Salamanca seeded wrestlers are Chris LoPresto (11-5)

fifth at 93 pounds, Randy Dry (14-2) seventh at 121, Mike LoPresto (13-2) sixth at 134, Jeff Earley (9-4) eighth at 140 and Todd Bullers (9-5) eighth at 157.

Cattaraugus has three seeds with Joel Dudley (8-4) sixth at 147 pounds, Mike Hill (9-3) sixth at 157 and Mike Miller (10-3) fourth at 169.

The once beaten teams are Athens at 9-1, Wellsville at 8-1, Salamanca at 6-1, Williamsville East at 3-1, Cassadaga Valley at 6-1, Notre Dame at 4-1, Pioneer at 6-2 and Sweet Home at 1-1.

Salamanca brings one of the youngest teams into the tourney as the Warriors list just one senior—Randy Dry. The rest of the squad consists of 10 juniors, two sophomores and one freshman.

Top Salamanca records are Redeye with a 15-0 mark at heavyweight, Lee at 9-0 at unlimited, Ciolek at 14-1 at 169 pounds, Mike LoPresto at 14-2 at 134, Dry at 14-2 at 121 and Chris LoPresto at 11-5-1 at 93.

Juniors George Metzler (9-3) and Jeff Earley (9-4) are close to the double figure mark, as are juniors George Bryant (8-3) and Todd Bullers (8-5).

SKI YOU CAN DO IT

KLISTERS

Klister wax conditions will often offer very enjoyable skiing. However, handling the gooey stuff is almost universally dreaded. This need not be if you follow these simple rules.

1) Apply the klister in a warm room where the wax, the ski, and your hands are warm. If a warm room is not handy, you must heat the klister tube and ski bottom with a propane torch or the like before applying the wax.

2) When applying klister, hold the tube as in the photo, squeeze it

lightly applying a thin line on both sides of the groove. Then take a plastic applicator and smooth the klister to cover the running surface of the ski.

3) Make sure to apply a thin coat. More klister can always be added later if needed.

4) The klister need only be applied in the kick area of the ski.



5) When your skis are completely waxed, let them cool outside before you start skiing on them.
