

Pete Lee wins third straight title:

Olean grabs fourth straight invitational crown

It's the same story since 1976 as Olean won its fourth straight Salamanca Invitational Wrestling Tournament title Saturday night.

The Huskies had four individual winners as they easily out-distanced Athens, Pa., in second place, for their 16th straight tournament championship.

Final team scores in the two-day, 18-team tourney were as follows: Olean 234, Athens 201½, Sweet Home 132, Churchville-Chili 130½, Medina 109½, Williamsville East 97, Pioneer 94½, Geneseo 78, Salamanca 63½, Elmira Notre Dame 67, Southwestern 57, Maple Grove 47, Wellsville 49, Cassadaga Valley 46, Allegany 39½, Warsaw 18 and Cattaraugus 8.

Named as the tourney's outstanding wrestler was Eric Nannen of Allegany, a dark horse at 140 pounds. The senior was unseeded with his 9-2-1 record but came through to beat the first and third place seeds for his title.

He won all four of his bouts by decisions, including the last with a 6-5 defeat of Churchville-Chili's Scott Trainor in the final.

Salamanca's Pete Lee won his third straight individual title as he won all four bouts — three by pins — in the unlimited class. The junior pinned Ricky Mott of Portville in 52 seconds of the first round, pinned Scott Lempe of Medina in 1:40 of the second, took a major, 12-1, decision over Alan Ervin of Athens in the semis and took down Olean's John Quigley in 1:42 of the finals.

Last year, Lee also pinned Quigley, in 3:13, to earn his second straight title.

Other repeat winners were Notre Dame's Pat Hughes at 107 pounds (93 pound champ last year), Olean's Clair Anderson (last year's top wrestler) at 114 (107 last) and Olean's Kirk Stephen at 179 (169 last).

Hughes ran his record to 10-0 as the sophomore gained three decisions, including a pin over Daryl Rogers of Pioneer in 49 seconds in the final.

Anderson, running to 19-0 for the campaign, opened with an 8-0 decision over Salamanca's Jamie Reynolds and then totaled three pins — over Norm Grabbit of Portville, Jeff Bumbarger of Churchville-Chili and Kevin Kelly of Athens.

Stephen had two pins and a decision before the finals as the 13-1, top seeded senior pinned Mark Magulski of Williamsville East in the finals.

Other winners were Phil Shaffer of Athens at 93 pounds, Craig Weber of Sweet Home at 100, Gary Webster of Athens at 121, George Pancio of Olean at 128, Jim Bender of Athens at 134, Robbie Parks of Olean at 147, Steve Swan of Southwestern at 157, Mark Wolcott of Athens at 169 and Doug Wheeler of Churchville-Chili at heavyweight.

Nannen picked up two takedown points in the first period of his championship match while Trainor gained one for an escape in the second period.

Nannen gained the rest of his points in the third period on two takedowns while Trainor got two for a reversal and two for a takedown in the final two minutes.

Anderson, Stephen and Lee picked up three of the six pins in the finals with the others going to Hughes of Notre Dame, Pancio of Olean and Wheeler of Churchville-Chili.

Two of the finals resulted in defaults as Swan of Southwestern won over Rick Fie of Olean, who never showed up due to an injury, and Parks of Olean who won by injury over Eric Walter of Athens. That match never went past the first period as Walter was injured early in the bout.

Olean and Athens both sent seven wrestlers to the finals and both had four winners. Olean losers were John Hickey at 93 pounds, Fie at 157 and Quigley at unlimited while Athens losers were Manley Frisbee in overtime at 100 pounds, Greg Schumann at 128 and Walter at 147.

Gaining third places in the consolation were Jeff Kling of

Wellsville at 93 pounds, Doug Court of Churchville-Chili at 100, Dana Richard of Geneseo at 107, Jeff Owens of Pioneer at 114, Andy Taylor of Olean at 121, Marvin Wilson of Pioneer at 126, Neil Thomas of Churchville-Chili at 134, Paul Richard of Geneseo at 140, Don Carman of Geneseo at 147, Bob Flagor of Williamsville East at 157, Mark Jaekel of Portville at 169, Steve Pettine of Medina at 179, Bob Bolschmenter of Medina at heavyweight and Alan Ervin of Athens at unlimited.

Jaekel gained his third place with a 3-1 decision over Dan Ciolek of Salamanca. The two wrestlers were scoreless through the first two periods of their bout but Jaekel gained an escape and reversal for three points in the final two minutes while Ciolek gained his one point via an escape.

This year's tourney, which saw the entire field compete for the first time since 1976, proved successful as all 18 teams showed up. In 1977, the 'Blizzard of 1977' cut the field to seven teams and a one-day event while another snowstorm last year narrowed the field from 18 to 13 teams.

"This was a crucial year," said Tournament Director George Whitcher. "We know that before going in and had to get back with a full complement of teams. It is a tremendous amount of work and we have to weight the impact on the facility and the town for its advantages."

Whitcher wants to publicly thank Tom and Ann Ciolek and Julie Ciolek for their time and hard work in posting the results and assistance in the seedings and Jeff Davis for his work as announcer at the tourney.

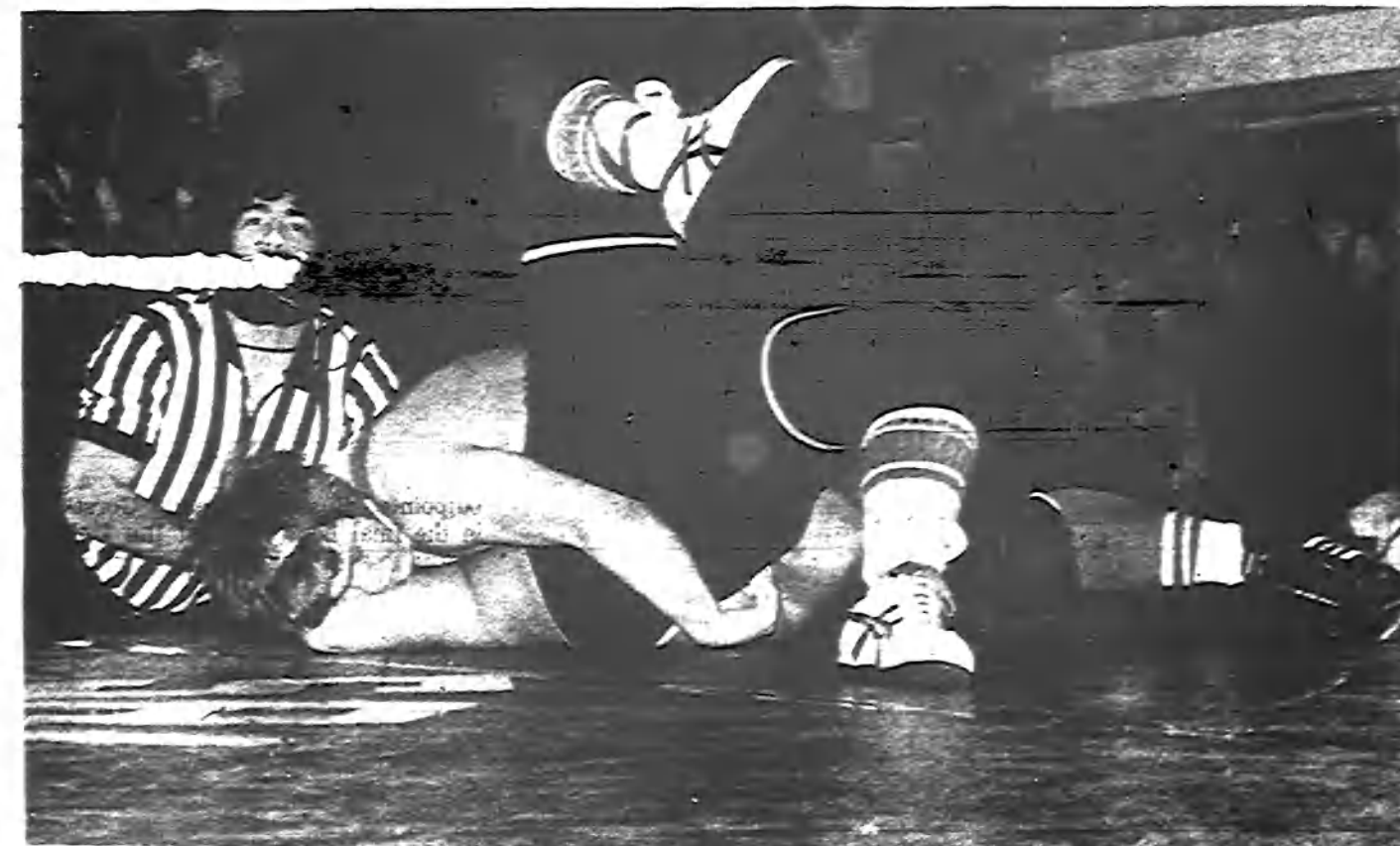
