


During the meet with Harborfields, undefeated wrestler Brian Gaffney picks up the action.




David Brown congratulates JVer Tony Fusaro after he beat his opponent.



During the Conference Finals, Brian Uvena tries to escape from Paul Pastore. Pastore won the match 6-0.




Jeff Thomas controls his Connetquot opponent. Thomas, who is third in the state, won the match 26-6.



The Blue Devil Wrestlers completed their first undefeated season, dominating all opponents. Success was the theme, as the matmen scored 699 points in dual meets, an all time Huntington record. Only two teams, Suffern and Tappanzee, earned more than ten points against Huntington, going down 38-11 and 35-12. The Devils came within one point of a shutout, smashing Woodland 55-1.

Mike Picozzi, Tony Smith, and Brian Gaffney were undefeated in regular season play. Jeff Thomas broke the state scoring record as he ended the season 125-5-3. Huntington had nine conference champions out of fourteen weight classes, and crowned eight county champions.

Seniors Brian Gaffney, John Karcher, Joe Giani, Paul Pastore, Mike Picozzi, Mike Rosenbauer, and Jeff Thomas had a combined 155-13-2 record at the State Tournament. Mike Rosenbauer placed first in his class, and Mike Picozzi and Jeff Thomas placed second and third in their classes.

"This was the greatest group I ever worked with," stated Coach Lou Giani. "They had the desire, were disciplined, and determined. They accomplished the goals they set."
