

Newfield takes tourney; Hoosick Falls wins at S-VE

NEWFIELD — Newfield put eight men into the finals of the Newfield Holiday wrestling tournament here Saturday, and three of them came away winners as the Trojans won their own tourney with a total of 154 points.

Marathon placed second with 104 points while Jasper was third and Thomas Edison fourth.

South Seneca placed fifth, and had four individual champions, while Odessa-Montour was sixth.

Newfield's three individual champs were Jay Belles at 138, Dale Reeves at 155 nad Jim Hollenbeck at 215.

Dave Quail was a winner at 105 for Marathon while Paul Gaylord was the champion at 112.

South Seneca did well in the lower weight classes as all four of its winners wrestled at 132 or below.

Mike Betts was the winner at 91, while Guy Bowers claimed the title at 98. Dale Hollister won at 126 and Dale Updike won at 132 for South Seneca.

Odessa's Tom Starkweather was the individual champion at 177.

Marathon and Odessa both had three winners in the consolation finals.

Jim Collins at 91, Jeff Rounds at 98 and Roy Bailey at 132 all won for Odessa while Ed Quail, Roy Bailey and Mitch Padbury were winners for Marathon.
