JAMESTOWN- The Salamanca wrestling program received some outstanding representation during this weekend's Jamestown Holiday Classic Wrestling Tournament. Warriors' Vic Arena won his second consecutive title at the 152pound weight class, while Jaymee Minner was a pleasant surprise at 130-pounds finishing sixth-place overall in the 39team tournament.

Arena's accomplishments on the mat also earned him a \$250 scholarship award from the Eagles Club. The Salamanca grappler went 5-0 on the weekend and defeated Lockport's Joe Steblin in the finals 25-10.

Salamanca's Joe Conlan (119pound) and Justin Hager (103pound) also took home honors at the tournament as they were named to the All-Academic Team for their respective weight

award is given to the wrestler in each class with the highest gradepoint average.

Hager's father Jud was also presented with a Parent Award for his work behind the scenes and his hard work and dedication to the sport.

Arena upped his career record to 187-25-0 with his effort over the weekend after wins over Pine Valley's Siobhan Bower (pin 1:10), Olean's A.J. Paoletto (24-10 dec.), Panama's Bill Bean (21-6 TF), Canandaigua's Eric Mullen (6-4 dec.), and Joe Steblein (25-10 TF).

In his last four matches, Arena has outscored his opposition 76-30 as he continued to put on the offensive pressure. .
