WRESTLING

ALTHOUGH engaged in the strenuous pastime of wrestling for the past two years under Professor Jones, the men never took up so seriously with the work as this year. The game was taken up systematically during the fall and winter terms, while hard and rigid training was indulged in with the purpose in view of perfecting a team of wrestlers which could contest other schools.

The first real affair was the dual meet with Illinois late in the winter term. Indiana easily carried off the honors, getting two firsts and a draw. In the early part of the spring term a team was sent to Chicago to enter the Conference meet. Here

the boys won one first and a second, Bodenhofer winning the title of all-western middleweight champion.

The personnel of the Crimson grapplers is as follows:

Heavyweights: Pennington and Artman. Middleweight: Bodenhofer. Lightweight: Cochran. Featherweight: Teeter.

Coach Jones considers Bodenhofer one of the best middleweight college wrestlers in the country. His opponents in the dual and Conference meets were the best in the west, but "Body" handled his men with ease. Pennington and Artman are both big and powerful, and about evenly matched. Cochran is strong and game, while Teeter is an eel and quick as lightning.

Another year should find Indiana at the top in this sport.
