

Haverstraw Cops Three Titles In Section 9 Mat Tournament

Sullivan Voted Outstanding Wrestler; McMillan, Harvey Retain Crowns

New City, N. Y. — Haverstraw copped three first places and Red Raider 168-pounder Richie Sullivan was voted the outstanding wrestler award at the New York Public High School Section 9 wrestling tournament at Clarkstown High Saturday.

Other winners for coach Don Daniels team Roman Rodriguez at 115 pounds and Craig Ketchum at 123 pounds. The Red Raiders also had second place finishers 98-pounder Mike Rodriguez and 106-pounder Bill Funcheon. Barry Gelman of Haverstraw took third in the 130-pound class.

The only other school to capture three first places was Liberty. Suffern earned two with 106-pounder Eric Watts and 130-pounder Howie McMillan. Other Rockland County wrestlers taking top honors were Jerry Leo of Nanuet in the 136-pound class, John Harvey of Nyack at 157 pounds, heavyweight Ed Cable of Spring Valley, and 98-pounder Ray Ahrens of Pearl River.

McMillan and Harvey were both defending Sectional champions in their weight divisions. Watts was the 98-pound title holder last year.

In a rematch of the Rockland County 98-pound final, Ahrens nipped Mike Rodriguez, 6-4, on a reversal with 9 seconds remaining.

WATTS, McMILLAN HURT

Crafty Watts, wrestling with a heavily-bandaged arm due to a strain, defeated his arch rival Funcheon, 4-0, for the 106-pound crown. Funcheon was runnerup to Watts in the Section 9 and County 98-pound finals last year and has now lost to Watts 12 times in competition.

Cat-quick Howie McMillan, wrestling with a shaved head and taped shoulder, topped Mike Drapala of Port Jervis, 8-4. He was in pain with the shoulder injury but had command of the match.

An escape in the first overtime gave Leo a 1-0 decision over Jim Wentink of Cornwall to earn the 136-pound title.

Harvey almost wrapped up Tom Auringer of Kingston with a body cradle in the third period but Auringer wiggled free. However, the Nyack grappler retained his title on an 8-4 decision.

Sullivan was voted the outstanding wrestler award on the basis of reversing two previous defeats to Nyack 168-pounder Arnie Giles. Giles took Sullivan in the Nyack-Haverstraw duel match and nipped him, 9-7, in a

CABLE WINS

Cable, the Spring Valley strongman had a visible limp from a foot injury, but battled to a 5-4 win over Howard Travis of Liberty who weighed in just under the 235-pound mark to be eligible for the heavyweight class. Travis almost pinned Cable late in the third period and earned two points for a predicament to lead, 4-3. However, Cable maneuvered an escape with 10 seconds remaining and won it on an additional point for riding time.

Other Rockland second place finishers were Jerry Rickard of Pearl River at 123 pounds and Ken Simons of Suffern at 148. Consolation round wins were recorded by John Ackerson at 115 and heavyweight Dick Schumacher for Suffern, Gelman of Haverstraw, and 183-pounder Keith Jones of Clarkstown.
