Three Gouvernear High wrestlers-two seniors and a fresh-·man — posted undefeated records over the 1962-63 Northern League season which saw the Wildcats of Coach Lacey Jones capture 13 of 14 matches and finish in a tie with Massena for first place.

Veterans Phil Bush and John Denesha emerged as the team's standout performers with perfect 16-0 records in closing out their scholastic wrestling careers. Young Dave Bush turned in a brilliant record in his first season by winning all seven of his matches. All three boys added to their laurels by scoring impressive victories in the sectionals at Massena, along with teammates Joe Pistolesi, Greg Conklin and Gerald Weir.

Freshman Joe Pistolesi amassed 54 points to claim third position. The promising youngster was victorious in 11 matches, dropped two and had three draws. Joe Smith with a 13-3-1 record and Gerald Weir (12-2-1) shared the No. 4 spot in the point column with 52 each.

Denesha and Junior Swem, a third year student, registered the most pins over the campaign for the Wildcats with seven apiece. Swem's performance rates special mention since the youngster had only three other successes.

Seniors Ralph Weldon and Greg Conklin and junior Tom Chilton also fashioned enviable personal records during the past season in that they met defeat only once in regular season competition. Seniors Gerald Weir and Larry Hance and freshman Joe Pistolesi were losers on only two occasions.

Actually the squad boasted a fourth undefeated grappler. Pete Price was a winner in his lone appearance inside the circle.

Taking part in the balloting were sports writers from Ogdensburg, Gouverneur, Canton, Malone, Massena and Tupper Lake. Selectors were asked to pick an "All Opponent" first and second team. Scoring was done by the point system with players receiving anywhere from 1 to 10 points according to the order in which they were rated.

Billy Martin of Tupper Lake's champion Lumberjacks was the top vote-getter with 54 points. He was named to the first team along with Claude Morgan of Canton, Ed Mitchell and Jim Blake of Ogdensburg Free Academy, and Dick Ashley of Mas-
