

# Unbeaten jayvee wrestlers Outscored foes 547 to 69

Fourteen up and fourteen down with nary a close call. That's the story of the Gouverneur High School junior varsity wrestling team that ranks with the greatest of GHS sports teams down through the years. Coach Dick Foster's jayvees experienced the misfortune of performing in the shadow of the equally tremendous Gouverneur High varsity mat contingent, but proceeded to carve a brilliant record that most certainly will stand for many seasons to come.

The jayvees opened the season with a 48-0 trouncing of Hermon-DeKalb and rang down the curtain a couple of weeks ago with an equally impressive 43-2 triumph over Potsdam. In between came a string of lopsided victories over the likes of Indian River, Watertown, Massena, Ogdensburg, Carthage and Canton.

The 48 points against Hermon-DeKalb was the high water mark for the year for the fabulous locals who permitted their opponents to top the 10-point

mark on only two occasions. Aside from the mid-season tussle with Watertown which ended with GHS winning 20-13, the junior grapplers' point totals were consistently in the 40's and 30's. The seven-point spread in the Watertown match was the closest anyone came to giving the Foster-coached squad a run for its money.

In recording 14 consecutive victories the Gouverneur youngsters rang up the almost unbelievable total of 547 points while having only 69 points scored against them.
