1985 N-O League Wrestling Preview

Undefeated a year ago, the Roy-Hart Rams will begin defense of their Niagara-Orleans League wrestling title next Wednesday at rival Medina.

The Rams, who became the fourth different team in as many years to claim the N-O mat crown last winter, are expected to get good challenges for the title this season from Akron, Albion and Starpoint.

Here's a capsule preview on how the N-O loop's seven wrestling teams are shaping up beginning with the defending champion Rams.

Roy-Hart Rams The return of four defending N-O champions and two other grapplers who earned second place finishes at the All-League tourney give Roy-Hart a strong nucleus on which to

build a title defense. Seniors Don Quackenbush (138) and Dan Huntington (177) along with sophomores Ken Copella (145) and Willie Cunningham (167) all captured N-O titles last season while freshman Lou Rosselli (98) and junior Jim Johnson (132) both

earned runnerup honors. Johnson, who was 22-7 last year, is already 7-0 in non-league action this season as are Huntington who was 19-5-2 and Rosselli who was 12-5. Both 6-1 to date, Cunningham was 23-4 last season and Quackenbush 19-5-2. Career wise Johnson is now 58-20, Copella 55-25-1, Quackenbush 53-34-3, Cunningham 51-14 and Huntington 32-19-2.

"I'm very pleased with what I've seen so far," said R-H coach Joe Massaro, "but we realize we'll have to work even harder to stay No. 1.

Also back with some varsity exerience are sophomore Jeff Yates (119) who is now 3-2 and freshman Dave Edmister (155) while junior Ken Schwab (215) along with freshmen Nelson Colley (98), Dave Lyndaker (105), Mark Baehr (112) and Brian Hale (126) help round out the starting lineup. Baehr is now 4-4 on the young season.

Also vying for starting spots are seniors Chris Peccorraro (155) and Eric Schumacher (215), junior Mark Ackerman (155), sophomore Mark Silsby (119), freshmen Mark Fragale (105) and Dan Gardner (145) as well as eighth graders Todd Fragale (91) and Aaron Schumacher

"We're very young again with only two seniors in the starting lineup but I expect it to be a very exciting season again this year,' said Massaro, whose charges have posted a 3-1 record to date against non-league foes. The Rams also garnered a third place fniish in the Newfane Tourney

Medina Mustangs Bols ered by a good turnout of 40,

which is double that of a year ago, the Medina High grapplers look to continue building in 1985.

The Mustangs who were 24 in league action and 6-10 overall last season, return a good nucleus of seven regulars including senior tricaptains Tony Lucas (145), Chris Fuller (132) and Jon Rizzo (177) along with juniors Wes Askew (112), Scott Schickling (119), Mike Dunham (132) and E. J. Reese (167). Lucas, who shared the N-O League title at 138 last year, is undefeated at 9-0 already this season while Rizzo is at 9-2 and Askew 7-1. Lucas was 24-4overall last season. Askew, who finished second in the league at 112 lb., and Rizzo were both .500 in duel match competition with 8-8 and 7-7 records respectively. Schickling was fourth in the league a year ago at 119

"We'll pay our dues this year but we've got a good turnout and some good, promising kids for the future," said MHS coach Joe Bujalski whose Mustangs are 2-5 to date including a second place finish to Lyndonville in the second annual MHS Team

Helping to round out the MHS lineup are freshman Bill Morgan junior Lawrence Humbert (119), senior Paul Russo (126), junior Herb Oberther (126), freshman Tom Fenton (138), junior Scott Markle (155) and sophomore Kevin Heideman (177). Russo is now 6-4 on the season and Heideman 3-3.

"It's a building year," said Bujalski but we're right about on track and we should be very tough next year.

Albion Purple Eagles Strength in the lightweights looks to key the fortunes of the Albion High matmen who finished second last season at 4-2 after capturing the N-O crown the year before.

Seniors Mike Conn (105) and Joe Christopher (119) along with juniors Todd Spencer (112), Rawn Mitchell (126) and Jeff Harding (177) provide the nucleus for the Purple Eagles.

Conn and Mitchell are both two time defending N-O champions while Spencer, who sat out last season, claimed a league title as a freshman. A gold medalist at last summer's Empire State Games, Conn has won 71 varsity matches while Mitchell has 58 career wins including 28 last year. Christopher finished fourth in the league at 126 lb. last season.

"We've got three guns in the lightweights in Conn, Mitchell and Spencer but we've got a lot of young kids in the upper weights," said Albion coach Keith Piccirrilli who is looking for Harding to anchor that end of the Eagles lineup.

Mitchell is 6-0 to date this season and Spencer 5-1 while Christopher and Harding are both at 4-2 and Conn

Also returning with some varsity experience are sophomores Brian Strasburger (98) and Mike Salvatore (98) along with juniors Bob Rice (119) who was fourth in the N-O loop at 98 lb. last year, and Carmine Calabria (145).

Also seeing action during the early non-league portion of the schedule have been seniors Jason Powley (215) and T. J. Hooker (138) along with juniors Dave Coville (132), Dave Slocum (155) and Bernell Moyer (167), sophomore Pat Boland (138) and freshman Mark Farone

"We have a good mixture of returnees and young wrestlers," added Piccirrilli who looks for Albion to be among the top three teams in the final N-O standings. The Purple Eagles are now 1-2 against non-league competition.

Akron Tigers

The return of half a dozen grapplers who placed in the top three at last year's All-League Tourney looks to make Akron a contender for the N-O title if the Tigers can shake off a rash of early season injuries.

Coming off a 5-1 league season, the Tigers who have never won the N-O title, return seniors Ron Smith (126), Randy Sanger (167 or 177), Chuck Yaeger (145), Larry Kopacz (138) and Sean Regan (132 or 138) along with junior Tom Smith (105).

Tom Smith took the N-O title at 91 lb. last year while compiling a 25-3 overall record while Regan was runnerup at 126 lb. with a 22-9-1 overall mark and Yaeger second at 138 lb. with a 23-8 record. Third place finishers at the All-League Tourney Kopacz was 21-8 overall, Ranger 18-10 and Ron Smith 12-8.

With the injuries we've had it's really hard to predict how we'll do," said Tiger coach Jerry Drayer whose underclassmen dominated squad numbers 42.

Starpoint Spartans

Absent from the N-O title circle since the late 1960's, Starpoint also looks to challenge for top honors as the Spartans return a good nucleus.

Sophomore Joe Finley (112), who took the N-O 98 lb. title last year while compiling a 25-6 overall record heads the Spartans' returning contingent.

Senior Steve Hill (155), who was runnerup at 138 lb. last season also returns as do seniors Dan Bright (215), Mike Sheeler (167) and Eric Maerten (138) along with juniors Jerry Farnham (119), Jim Taber (126) and Mike Barone (145) and sophomores Kevin Gfroerer (132) and Mark Lutz (215). Hill was runnerup last season at 138 lb. while Taber, who was 22-7, took third place at 112 lb. and Maerten fourth at 119

"We've got new kids at the very lightweights and at the upper weights so how well they do will be the key for us," said Starpoint coach Roger Gately who noted that the Spartans have also been hampered somewhat by injuries.

Starpoint posted a 3-3 record in N-O duel matches last season.
