Two state champions among 14 of high school wrestling's top stars in Rochester area

The members of the Democrat and Chronicle's first-ever allstar wrestling team have been teammates before.

All 14 represented Section 5 at the state high school tournament in Syracuse three weeks ago.

As a group they nearly claimed the state championship for Sec. 5. They failed when Sec. 11 (Long Island) came from behind in the last four matches to claim the team title by just 41/2 points, 2151/2-211.

"I was surprised by these kids," East Rochester Coach Don Quinn said this week. "I thought we (Sec. 5) had a pretty good team, but I didn't think we'd do as well as we did.

"I didn't figure we'd take eight to the finals," the Democrat and Chronicle Coach of the Year added. "I don't think we've ever done that before . . . I don't think anyone has done that

Two of the Democrat and Chronicle's all-stars - Canandaigua's 119-pound Marty King and Pittsford's 250-pound John Brennan — were state champions. Six others were state finalists.

Those second-place finishers were Canandaigua's Butch Hibbard (98 pounds) and Paul Lamphier (105), McQuaid's Bob Zoeke (91), Spencerport's John Suhr (145), Brighton's Brian Kurlander (155) and East Rochester's Chris Schojan (177).

Angelo DeAngelis of Spencerport placed third in the state at 132 pounds, Steve Salzman of Brighton was fourth at 167 and Canandaigua's T.J. Mincer finished fifth at 138.

Rounding out the Democrat and Chronicle's all-star team are Ted Pittinaro (112) of Webster Schroeder, Tim Quinn (126) of East Rochester and Steve Matthews (215) of Le Roy.

Eight of those 14 individuals will return next year, too. "Never in all the years I've been here have we had this many

underclassmen (reach the state meet)," said Quinn, who has coached at ER for 25 years. "I think it's because so many teams go out and get good competition. Canandaigua goes all over, we go all over, Spencerport's not afraid to wrestle anyone, McQuaid will travel and Brighton's got an excellent program."

Canandaigua, which finished the season ranked behind No. 1 East Rochester and No. 2 Spencerport in the Democrat and Chronicle poll of Sec. 5 teams, placed six individuals on the all-star team. In addition to four first-team members, the Braves had seniors Dan Scheele (126) and John Bradshaw (250) picked for the second team.

East Rochester, the Democrat and Chronicle's Team of the Year, had three all-stars. Tony Rossi, a 215-pound senior named

to the second team, joins Tim Quinn and Schojan.

East Rochester, a seven-time Section 5 champion, finished the season with an 11-2 dual-meet record. The Bombers defeated Canandaigua (13-5) in the regular-season finale, 24-23.

"I was very happy with our season," Quinn said. "We lost our first two times out (against Sec. 3's Fulton and New Hartford), but after that we just kept getting better."

Fulton (17-0) finished the season ranked No. 1 in the state sportswriters' poll, New Hartford (12-2) was No. 9, East Rochester No. 10 and Canandaigua No. 11.
