Gladioux, Ted Lansky, Thiessen, Wright, Hess Are Raider Champions; Horton Is the 178 King

Taking five of the 11 individual crowns, Scarsdale High School captured the Section 1 wrestling team honors here Saturday at Fox Lane High School.

The Raiders, who split with White Plains for the team trophy last year, outscored second-place New Rochelle, 65-60. White Plains was third with 50 and Fox Lane, the Northern Westchester champion was fourth with 38. Points were scored on a 10-7-4-2 basis.

Pins were at a minimum in the deciding day of competition. Only one pin was achieved in the finals, that going to Bob Horton of White Plains, who subdued Austin Clarke of Yorktown in the 178-pound class.

There were many surprises. Of the three defending champions, only one came through, Gladioux. He beat Don Fiaco of John Jay in the semi-finals, 6-1, and defeated Lou LaRegina, one of Coach Arnie Berg's Fox Lane standouts, 6-3.

The other two, Pete Carissimi (123) of White Plains and Charlie Hayes (136) of Sleepy Hollow ere upset by Hess and Umstead in the finals.

The Carissimi-Hess battle was the most thrilling in the finals. Hess held leads of 2-0 and 4-2 before Carissimi took a 5-4 lead with 20 seconds left in the final quarter. With seven seconds left Hess broke

loose to tie, 5-5. The boys failed to score in the overtime session and the three judges voted Hess the winner.

Hayes fell behind by 1-0 in the second period and Umstead held the champ to the mat in the last period for the close decision.

Another surprise came in the 106-pound match. Dowd, only a sophomore, was a decided underdog to Neslie Gunthrope of New Rochelle, runner-up in the same class in '58.

Ted Lansky, the 106-pound champ last year, maintained his perfect record but not after a long and bitter struggle with Al Rende of New Rochelle. Rende had a 4-2 margin after two periods.

However, Lansky, never beaten in his career, made it 4-3 and gained a tie when official Marty Todd awarded a point because of stalling on the part of Rende. Lansky pulled ahead to win, 6-4. New Rochelle's other two crowns

came in the 130 and 148 brackets. Olie Davis decided George Nichols of White Plains, 3-1, in the 130 and John Bracey beat Larry Skinner of Fox Lane, 1-0, in the 148. Skinner's twin, Jim, bowed to Thiessen, 5-0, in the 157.

Cordell Berman of New Rochelle was a favorite in the 157 class but he ran into hard luck. He lost by a judges' decision in the semis to Skinner and forfeited in the consolation because of an injury.

Tom Rogers, a 157-pound champ in '58, failed to don the 168 crown when he became a 5-1 victim to Mahopac's Castegner. In the unlimited bout, big Bill Wright of the champion Raiders halted Lincoln's one-man team, sophomore Ted Cosmos, 5-2.

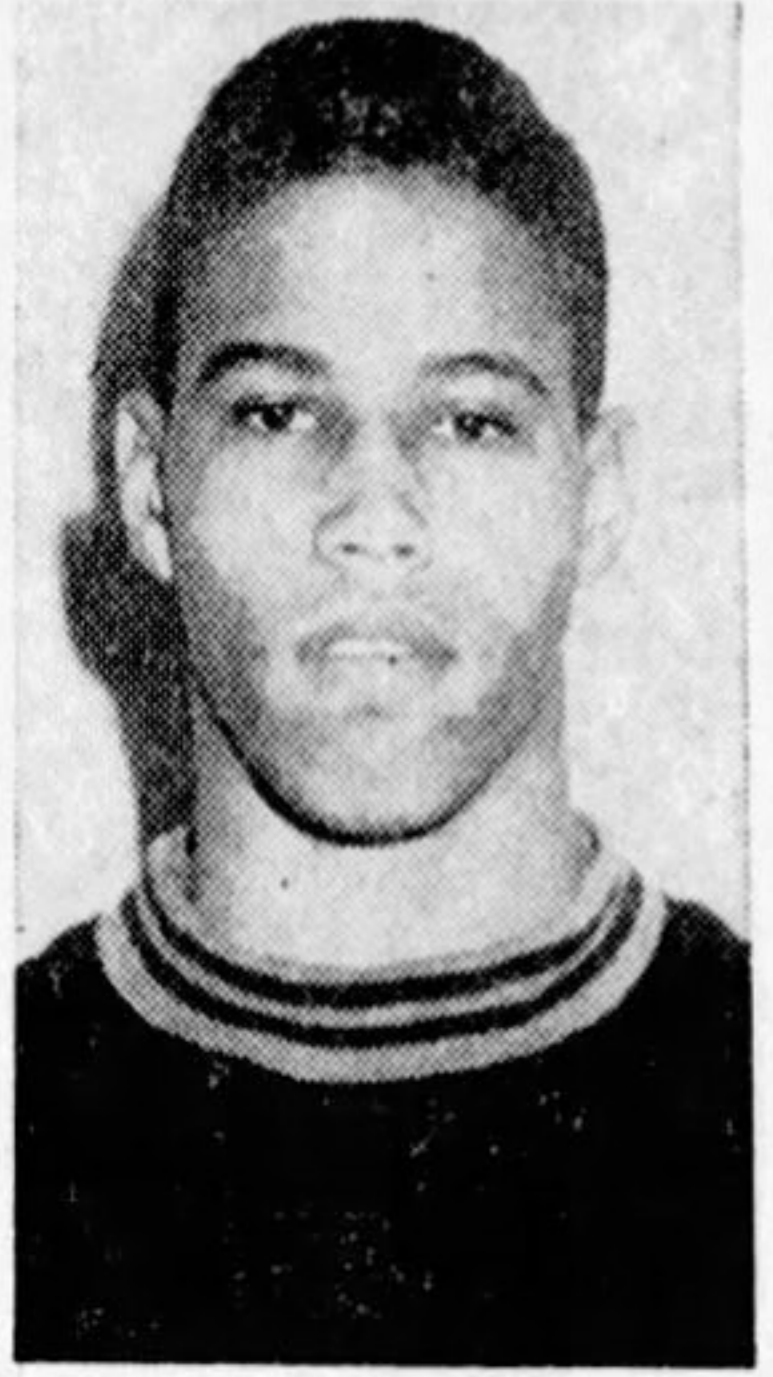
