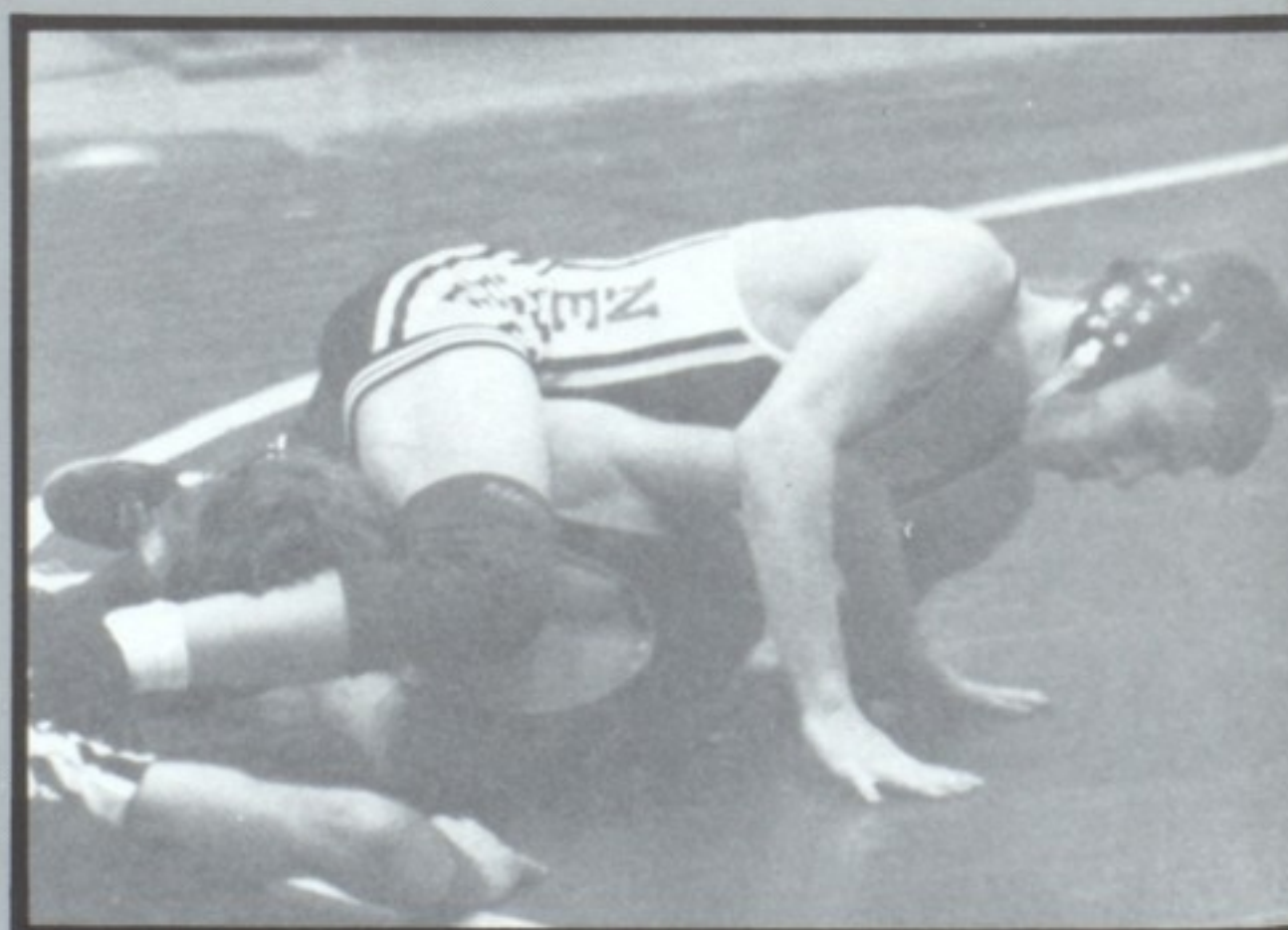


NEWARK VARSITY WRESTLERS WIN GENESEE VALLEY TOURNAMENT FOR SECOND STRAIGHT YEAR

1990-1991 Wrestling

In a season when Newark Basketball seems to get all the attention and in a year when all Newark athletic teams seem to be having terrific seasons, there was one team that was quietly lurking and practicing hard beneath the halls of Newark High School. This team was the outstanding Newark High School Wrestling team. Many people didn't know it, but this team was just as successful as the Basketball or Football team was. The wrestlers spent long hours sweating, pumping iron, doing stairs, jumping rope, and wrestling in the cellar of our school. And when they finally emerged from the cellar for their tournaments, they simply overpowered all others. This year's team comprised a dual meet record of 12 — 2 and an unbelievable overall record of 84 — 6. The team took 2nd in the Newark Wrestling tournament with a field of ten and second in the Watkins Glenn tournament with a 26 team field. They were the best of the New York State teams at that tournament. Probably the best accomplishment of this team was winning the Genesee Valley Wrestling Tournament for the 2nd year in a row. This tournament is the largest tournament in New York State with a field of 32 teams and Newark came out on top.

This team had a number of great individual wrestlers this year. In fact, the Finger Lakes times has said, "Newark has six of the finest wrestlers you'll find anywhere." Both Tim Steingass and Jason Sutton were sectional champions this year and Jason Sutton, Tim Steingass, Mark Johnson, Robert Farnsworth, and Jack Fisher were voted first-team all-league.

Mark Johnson had 109 career wins this year (2nd highest in school history) and Tim Steingass had 103 career wins (3rd highest in school history). In addition, Jack Fisher holds the school record of having 4 tournament championships. It was truly a remarkable season.
