Will the Green Wave Defend?

With two-time Empire State champion Carl DeStefanis of Locust Valley leading the charge, green-uniformed Section Eight scored 212.5 points and won team honors at the New York State Intersectionals last March. It marked the ninth time in 18 years of State Meets that the boys from Nassau County captured the team title.

Now, defending state 98-pound champion Al Placio of Long Beach leads another edition of the strong Section Eight contingent. Will the Big Green be dethroned?

Placio will be ably assisted by his older brother, Leo, among others. Al wrestles at 105 nowadays while Leo will attempt to muscle his way to the 126-pound Empire State title. The Placios, who arrived at Long Beach from Colombia, South America, seven years ago, both boast perfect 30-0 records as they arrive in Syracuse.

Section Eight also points to talented athletes such as returning Don Ophals (21-1) of Berner at 98, Matt Doherty of Berner at 138, Chris Bevilacqua of Berner at 145, returning Keith Cavayero of Bellmore Kennedy and rugged Andre Cox of Freeport as potential state champs. Ophals was 3rd at 91 last March, Doherty was "MOW" of the Section Eight tourney as he beat defending section king Rich Lithgow of Baldwin, Bevilacqua is the senior son of veteran Massapequa High and Hofstra U. coach Al, Cavayero hails from a long line of Cavayero family state place-winners, and Cox is also highly-touted.

If the Green Wave goes under, look for top contenders Section Eleven (Suffolk County, L.I.) and Five (Rochester region) to bid strongly for first place.

Section Eleven's veteran lineup is headed by 12 seniors, from 105 to 250 pounds. That talented bunch begins with 105-pounder Mike Murnane of Bayport, the 1979 state 91-pound champion here. Furthermore, Eleven also returns Ed Morales of Sachem at 112, Dan Hopkins of Commack South at 119, Ted DiPasquale of Deer Park at 132 and Bob DeSoto of Newfield at 250. Hopkins was runnerup at 112 last year, the others went unplaced but gained valuable experience at the '80 States.

Eleven also owns 126-pound Pete Mankowich (27-0) of Commack North, brother of 1979 third-place finisher Mike Mankowich.

Chief challenge to Long Island's musclepower may be furnished by the Rochester delegation, led by the winningest matman in New York State history, 112-pound Tony Cotroneo of Irondequoit, Cotroneo, third last year at 112, is now 34-0 with a career mark of 160-15. Last Saturday, he broke the state record of 158 wins, set by state king Clar Anderson of Olean-6 here in 1980.

Rochester also points to last year's 91-pound runnerup, Marty King (33-1) of Canandaigua, scrappy 119-pound Tim Lehmann (35-2) of Irondequoit, the appropriately-named 132-pound Matt King (35-0) of Canandaigua, Trevor Graham (29-3) of Spencerport at 138, All-State football player Scott Kay (30-2-1) of Fairport at 155, former state king Bob Button (33-0) of Newark at 215 and powerful Joe Kuras (28-1) of Canandaigua at 250. Cotroneo, Graham and Button are all making third treks to the Intersectional Meet. As Rochester Times-Union writer Tom Batzold observes, "This is the most experienced team Section Five has ever had. If we don't win this year, we never will."

Frustrated Section five was team runnerup in 1972, 1974 and 1976 but has

never entered the winner's circle. Maybe this time . . .

Host Section Three was runnerup last March and hasn't finished lower than third since '76. The current gold-uniformed CNY team features 126-pound Mike Catania (33-0), third at 119 last year and the winningest wrestler in Section Three history (125-8). Also returning are NYS fifth-place 132-pounder Marty Lynch (32-1, 109-14-1) of Jordan-Elbridge, state 138-pound runnerup John Pickard of four-time state poll champion Baldwinsville, and little 98-pound Wes Hood (27-1) of Canastota. Pickard, younger brother of former Empire State "MOW" of 1978, Tom, was voted Section Three's most outstanding matman one week ago on these mats.

All-State football player Tim Green (31-1) of Liverpool beat defending Section Three champ Terry Bernat of Lowville to reach the States. Green lost only to state champion Andy Schwab of Elmira Southside-4 this winter, and seeks a semifinal rematch here Saturday morning with the powerful Schwab.

Other solid section teams entered appear to be Two (Capitol District) and Four (Binghamton area).

Section Two features career-wins recordholder Paul Diekel (129-9-1) of Whitehall at 167, super-soph John Cardi (33-0, 82-6 career mark with two years to go) of Burnt Hills at 145, unbeaten Joel Feingold (32-0) of Niskayuna at 132, returning John Placek (31-2-1) of Niskayuna at 126 and returning Joe Wilsey (30-1) of Saratoga Springs at 112. Toss in unbeaten John Gallo (30-0) of Mohonasen at 177 and you have a Section Two team to be reckoned with.

Followers of Section Four like the caliber of Brad Penrith (16-0) of Windsor at 98, Jim Lateer (31-2) of Johnson City at 126, Tod Northrup (30-1-1) of Waverly at 155, Jeff Webb (27-1) of Bainbridge-Guilford at 167 and state champ Andy Schwab (19-0) of Elmira Southside.

A longshot might be Section Nine, headed by Brian Keyes (25-3) of flood-plagued Port Jervis at 105, Gary Fischbein (29-0) of Monroe-Woodbury at 132, Bob Judge (27-1) of Nanuet at 138, "MOW" Earl Lynch of Monroe-Woodbury at 155 and All-State footballer Kirk Butryn (30-0) of Minisink Valley at 177.

This weekend, we welcome champions from the Catholic High Schools Athletic Association (CHSAA) and the Public Schools Athletic League (PSAL) of New York City. Both groups are competing here for the initial year.

Among the awards at stake will be a school trophy, for most points scored by one school. In contention should be Niskayuna-2, New Hartford-3, Bainbridge-Guilford-4, Canandaigua-5, Iroquois-6, Peru-7, Berner-8, Ramapo-9 and Bay Shore-11. All those schools qualified at least three athletes for a Syracuse trip.

To the outstanding wrestler will go a trophy, awarded jointly by the New York State Sports Writers Association and the New York State Wrestling Coaches Association, for the 12th straight year. (See list of winners.)

Again this year, no pre-meet seedings were issued. Pairings were drawn from a box, with returning 1-2-3-4 placemen separated by brackets. This practice is the fairest possible since no seedings can apparently be agreed upon. Wrestlebacks were introduced to the tournament nine years ago to give defeated wrestlers a chance to place third, and score team points.

Today, to all teams and wrestlers, we in Central New York extend our congratulations for having earned a trip to the 19th New York State Tournament. Good luck, and we hope everyone enjoys your state finals, win or lose.

A Vote for Heavyweight?

When it's time to vote for "Most Outstanding Wrestler" at the New York State Interregionals, guess who usually receives zero votes? That's right, the husky gentlemen at 215 and 250 pounds. The heavyweights.

It might be different this weekend, because 1980 heavyweight champion Andy Schwab of Elmira Southside-4 is returning, unscored-upon all winter, to the Onondaga County War Memorial. Big Andy, a 6-foot-4 senior who has already signed a letter-of-intent for football at Wake Forest, had pinned all except one opponent as of mid-February and had hiked his career record to 94-5 with 73 pins heading into the Section Four finals.

Included among Schwab's victims was one of Central New York's finest heavyweights, All-State football player Tim Green of Liverpool. Green's only loss of the winter came via a first-period pin against Schwab in the Spencerport Christmas Tournament.

But, here's the rub. Even though Schwab is a reigning state champion and unscored-upon, many of us don't believe he'll repeat! That's how strong the 1981 heavyweight class at the 19th New York State tournament looks.

If Schwab loses, look for his nemesis, Bob Button of Newark-5 to rule the heavyweight class. Button, runnerup at 215 as a sophomore, 3rd to Schwab in 1980, is determined to become No. 1 in 1981. A year ago, Button was upset, 8-5, by Schwab in the quarterfinals. Since that aggravating defeat, Button has lost just one more match—in the nationally-devised (on cable) finals of the U.S.W.F. Junior Nationals at Iowa City last summer. Even then, in the USA finals, Button was ahead until the last 15 seconds, when a reversal cost him the crown.

Also last summer, Button decisively won the gold medal at the Empire State Games here in Syracuse. In all, Button has beaten Schwab in two of their three meetings.

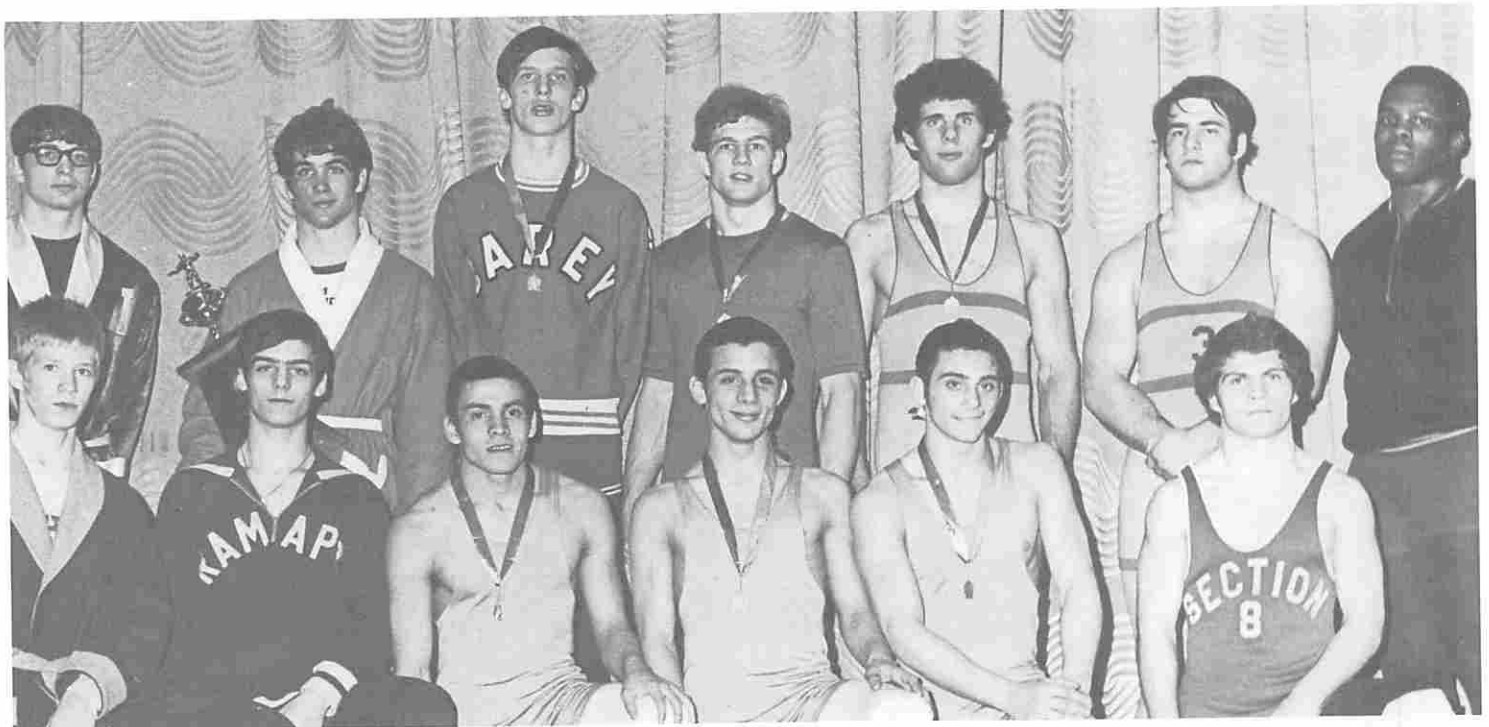
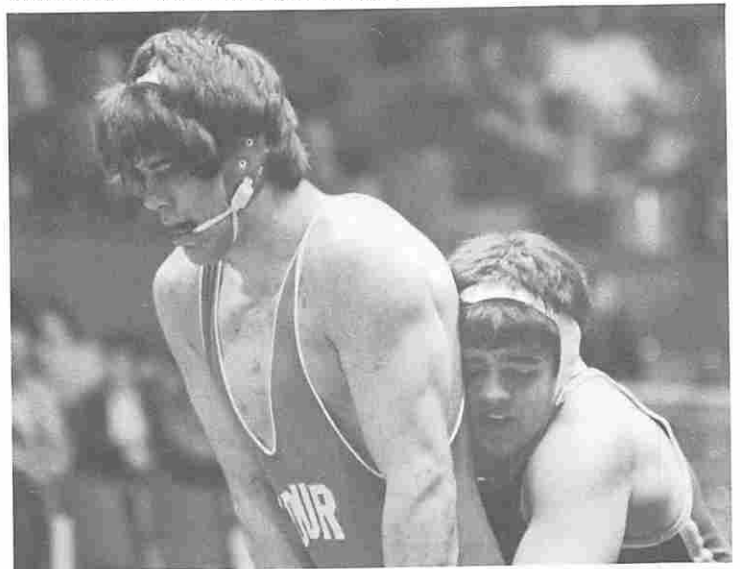
According to Elmira Southside coach Darrel Wright, Button reportedly told Schwab after their Empire Games' showdown, that, "You better go to 250 for the 'States' next year if you want to win again." Reportedly Schwab just laughed at that idea.

Frankly, however, Newark's Button is not to be laughed at. Through his first 28 matches this winter, Button was 28-0 with 21 pins and seven decisions by forfeit. At mid-February, his career record was 131-11 with 82 pins. The only aspect of his record that upsets Button is the numerous victories by forfeit, a frustration that no doubt is encountered by most of the state finalists in Syracuse this weekend. "The thing that bothers me the most is that a wrestler improves by wrestling somebody better than he is," says Button.

"I took my licks," added Button, noting a loss to state champion Tim Dunster of Auburn-3 early in his career. "It's just pretty unbelievable that someone would work out all week at practice and then forfeit a match. I can't respect a kid who refuses to go out and wrestle."

Button, who may attend Oklahoma, Tennessee, Utah or Syracuse next season, won't have to worry about forfeits this weekend, because the heavyweight class is L-O-A-D-E-D. But, many of the experts expect Schwab and Button to collide Saturday night for the New York State heavyweight wrestling title. If they meet, coaches and writers are advised NOT to cast their ballots for "Most Outstanding Wrestler" until the husky gentlemen are finished. These heavyweights may be worth voting for.

MAT MATTER—Schwab ranks 26th in a class of 390 and has career Regents Examination score under 90 in his career (an 88 in Physics) . . . Button, whose coach is Jack Fisher, began varsity wrestling as an eighth grader, compiling a 14-4 won-lost record that year. He has improved to 21-3, 32-2, 36-1 and 28-0 in succeeding years . . . Schwab has signed to attend Wake Forest, but is still weighing offers from other colleges.
