LOCKPORT WRESTLER ADVANCES ★

Ron Mott Beaten, But Gains Intersectionals

Kenmore East and Williams-ville tied for the Class AAA Section VI wrestling title Saturday at Lockport Senior High School, but the big wars were in the individual competition.

Kenmore East and Williams-ville were match 61 points, the 183-pound class had a final that still has wrestling fans licking their chops and wondering who won.

The officials awarded Neil Bateman of Maryvale his fourth consecutive championship. Bateman defeated Lockport's Ron Mott on a 10-9 overtime decision. Many Lockport fans thought Mott had won.

Perhaps Mott's strength and mauling attack were more than the officials gave him credit for Sunday, the Maryvale coach announced that Bateman was injured and would not be able to compete in the Inter-Class Sectionals next Saturday and the Intersectionals in March.

"Mott out - wrestled, out-hustled, and out-mauled Bateman," said Lockport coach and tourney chairman Bob Ames. "That isn't sour grapes, either."

Mott apparently injured Bateman when he slammed him to the mat on a near-pin. Mott was leading on points (he had Bateman in a predicament) 6-1, but Bateman held Mott for a "near-pin" and was aided by two penalty points to earn a tie at 8-8 after regulation time.

Bateman won the decision in overtime 2-1 with the help of another penalty point. Mott picked Bateman up, but when he held him off the ground the officials penalized him for "stalling" and that cost him the match. Mott posted three pins in gaining the final.

In the 115-pound bracket, Lockport's other seeded wrestler, Dana Rising, placed fourth. Here's how Lockport matmen fared:
