Starpoint, Medina Split Mat Honors In N-O Loop Meet

MEDINA — Starpoint and Medina copped eight of 12 individual championships Friday in the first Niagara-Orleans All-League Wrestling Tournament.

In the regular season, Starpoint finished with a 7-0 mark good for first place. Medina compiled a 6-1 mark, their only defeat coming at the hands of Starpoint.

A pair of brothers, Mike and Pat Hagan of Starpoint, grabbed two individual championships as Mike won in the

138-pound class and Pat victorious in the 148-pound division.

The tourney attracted a large crowd as the league's top grapplers met for individual honors.

All four Medina winners finished the season unbeaten. They were: Sam George, Jerry Weese, Dennis Higgins and Bill Denson.

Barker's 106-pounder, Paul Harvey, also was unbeaten. Akron's Tim VanBuren was unbeaten, but tied once at 168-pounds.

For Starpoint, Mike Hagan finished with an unbeaten mark at 138-pounds, while Bob Manning was unbeaten at 157.

Graebner Takes Singles, Shares Doubles Title

BUFFALO, N. Y. (AP)—Clark Graebner nailed down the singles title after a three-hour match, then bounced back to join Chuck McKinley in taking the doubles crown Sunday in an invitational indoor tennis tournament at the Buffalo Tennis and Squash Club.

Graebner, a Beachwood, Ohio, resident and the nation's third-ranked amateur, defeated a stubborn Marty Riessen of Evanston, Ill., 3-6, 15-13, 6-0 in the singles final.

Then he and McKinley, a former Davis Cup competitor from Port Washington, N. Y., downed Riessen and Gene Scott of St. James, N. Y., 6-4, 15-13 in a 75-minute session for the doubles prize.

Graebner reached the payoff match in the singles by downing Ian Crookenden, a UCLA student from New Zealand, 7-5, 6-2, in semi-final play earlier Sunday. Riessen earned his title spot with a 6-1, 6-4 decision over McKinley.

Graebner was seeded first in the 32nd annual mid-winter tourney, while Riessen, rated seventh nationally, was placed in the second spot.
