Cardinals Win Two ★ Crowns In Sectionals

Randolph's Cardinals came up with two crowns and tied for third place with Pioneer at the Section Six Wrestling Tournament held in the RCS high school gym Friday and Saturday. Randolph and Pioneer each had 50 points. Portville, defending champion, won with 90 points and second place Cassadaga had 57 for a surprising finish.

Don Lerow, 150 lb. Cardinal, and Jeff Schulz, 136 lb., were Section 6 Champions again for Randolph as Lerow brought his season record to 20-0 and Schulz picked up his 18th win against one loss and one tie.

Randolph had two third place winners in Don McIntyre and Dave Lerow. John Shinn, Dave Covedill and Greg Luce all placed fourth among the 16 schools rep-

resented.

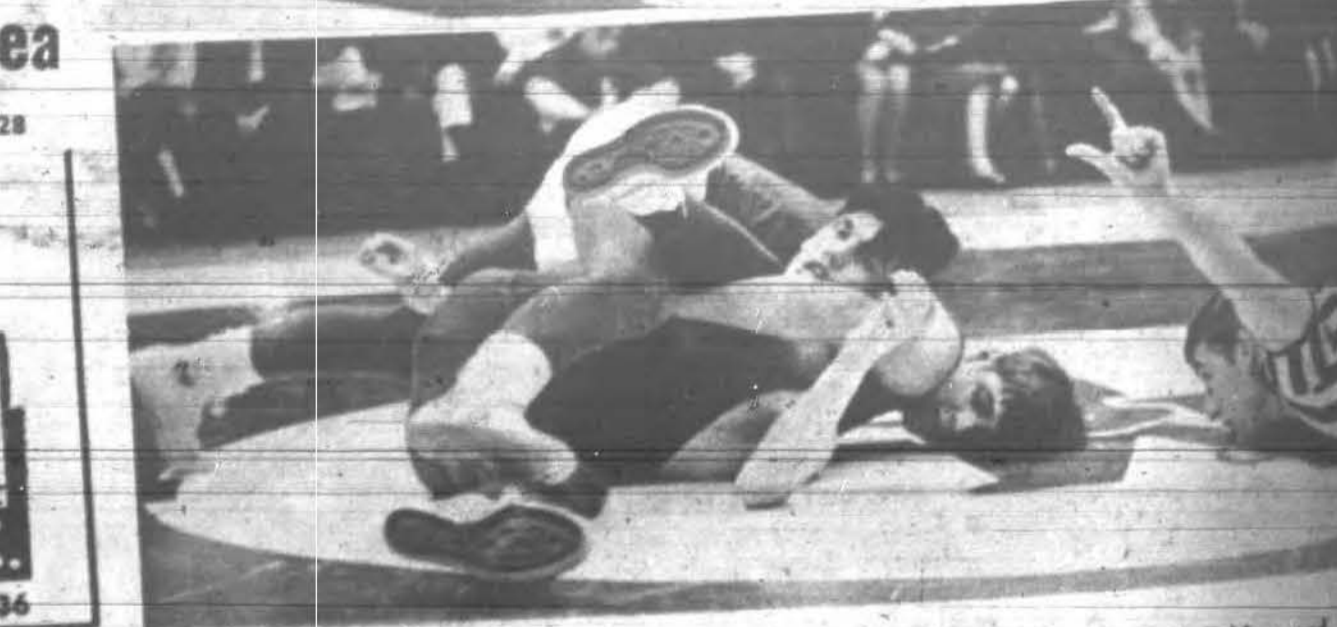
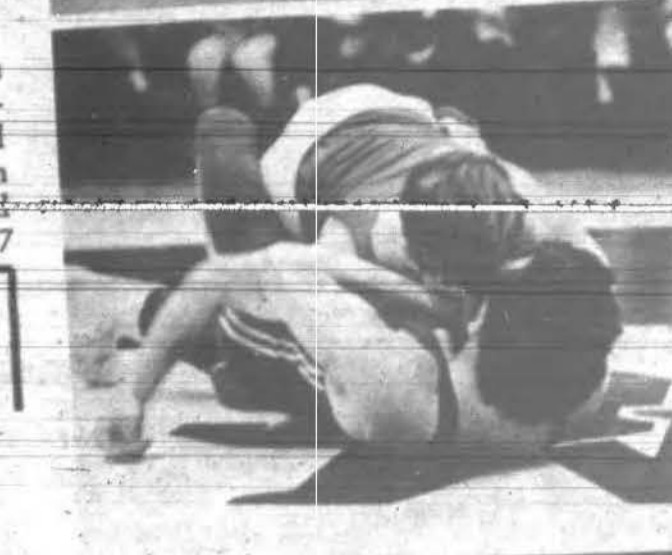
