

# Four Champs Give Kearney Mat Title

Bishop Kearney's Kings reign today as champs of City-Catholic wrestling.

Vic Druziako's 10-3 decision over McQuaid's John McGuire in the 167-pound class insured that last night and gave the Kings their first crown in three years.

Until Druziako's win, Kearney and McQuaid were tied for first with 138½ points in the 10-team competition. With Druziako joining Steve Stadmiller (91 pounds), Rory Legacy (98) and John Walsh (155) as individual winners, Kearney wound up with 152½ points to 148½ for McQuaid.

Individual champions for McQuaid were Rob Starkweather (105), Paul Nesser (126) and Mike Morone (138).

Other champions included heavyweight Willie Nesmith of Franklin; East's Maverick Franklin at 132 and his teammate, Terry Roe, at 112; Darrell Leslie of Madison at 119, and Charles Hill of Edison at 177.

Tom Heindl of Mooney won the 145-pound division by default when East's Leonard Barber injured his shoulder.

Stadmiller pinned McQuaid's Andy Springer at 3:22 and Legacy, who is 21-1 for the year, pinned Steve Nally of McQuaid in 3:04. Morone, 24-0-1, edged Toulie Sarkis of Jefferson 4-2 in his final.

Monroe County's Western Division put 18 men into tonight's finals of the league wrestling competition being held at Webster Schroeder. The finals start at 7 p.m.

Three top-seeded wrestlers, however, lost last night. Nate Cole of Churchville-Chili lost 11-7 to Rick Benson of Spencerport at 148, Mike Stuyer of Fairport lost to Pat Cosmano of Spencerport 8-6 at 158 and Jim Mooney of Schroeder lost to John Zito of East Rochester 5-0 at 170.

Spencerport led team scoring in the West with 112½ points and Fairport topped the East teams with 99½.

Marshall's Chris Root set two swimming records last night in City-Catholic competition at East, winning

the 200-yard individual medley in 2:09.2 and the 100-yard backstroke in 1:00.2. McQuaid's 200-yard medley team of Marty Mahoney, Ned Nicosia, Dave Allen and Jeff LiButti set a record of 1:48.8, breaking its own mark of 1:49.4 set Wednesday.

Mahoney also won the butterfly and Nicosia won the breaststroke.

McQuaid's Neil Brophy won the 200 and 500-yard freestyle as well as the 400-yard freestyle relay.

In Skiing, Gene Habeck of Fairport won the slalom and giant slalom races in a Monroe County meet held at Swain. Penfield took the team title in slalom and Pittsford Sutherland in giant slalom.

In basketball, George Slade scored 28 points but Rush-Henrietta Sperry scored a large assist last night as Fairport whipped visiting Irondequoit 75-62 to clinch a tie for the Monroe County East title.

Fairport's victory, combined with Sperry's 50-42 upset over Brighton, clinched the tie for the Raiders. Fairport is now 13-1 in the league and 15-1 overall. Brighton is 11-3, 13-3 and has a date with Fairport next Tuesday.

Elsewhere, East Rochester beat Pittsford-Mendon 63-58 at ER. Penfield nudged Eastridge 59-49 at Eastridge. Rush-Henrietta Roth overcame Webster Schroeder 64-49 at Schroeder. Batavia nipped Churchville-Chili 40-37 at Churchville and Wellsville beat Charlotte 77-73 in a non-league game at Charlotte.

Mike Magoon had 23 points for ER (10-5, 11-5), who trailed briefly in the third quarter but pulled away to a 10-point bulge entering the fourth. Rick Roehow's 20 points were tops for Mendon (3-12, 5-12).

Jim Schumacher (15), Tim Sayer (14) and Dave Hitchings (13) led a balanced Penfield attack as the Chiefs (9-5, 11-5) won. Eastridge (0-14, 1-15) was led by Duane Utter with 18. Penfield outscored the Lancers 21-8 in the final quarter to win the game.

Bruce Howlett had 23 points and Jerome Ward added 14 to pace the Roth Royals (12-4) over Schroeder (1-14). Kevin Smith's 16 were high for the Lions.

In the City-Catholic League, Franklin won its fourth straight game by beating host Monroe 74-69 and top-ranked Madison breezed over Edison 84-56 at Madison. In the City-Private, it was Marshall over Harley Allendale-Columbia 74-56 at Marshall.

Franklin (9-6) rallied from a 10-point deficit in the third quarter. Boone McFarland, who led the Quakers with 13 points, hit two foul shots in the last minute to secure the victory. Charles Griffin added 12 points and Clyde Williams 10. Kevin Stokelin of 68 Monroe took game honors with 15 points.
