What were the odds? Who believed in him? Who had hope? His total Varsity record to date was now 11 wins and 14 losses. He had lost his last three straight but this was the County Tournament and no other four year man had ever failed to make the All County Team

Rick came back winning in the Consolation Quarter-finals by decision and won again in the Semi-finals. The door was open he could make All County

He not only won the Third place medal and made the All County Team - but he broke the School all time record for takedowns in a single match

The following weekend at the Section V Championships Rick continued pounding his way through and defeated the City and Finger Lakes Champions on his way to the Section V finals to finish with a career record of 16 and 15 All County All Sectional

Rick Hoppe never made All America - never even won a Championship match - but he will never be forgotten at Irondequoit - he lived "The PROUD TRADITION"

ALL AMERICA

An indication of the caliber of the wrestling program at IRONDEQUOIT HIGH SCHOOL is the fact that the INDIANS have produced more HIGH SCHOOL ALL AMERICA wrestlers than ANY other high school in NEW YORK STATE. Three wrestling periodicals select annual teams: *Amateur Wrestling News* selects the National Wrestling Coaches Association Team, *Wrestling U.S.A.* selects the PEPSI/W.U.S.A. ALL AMERICAN TEAM, and *The Young Wrestler* selected the College Coaches All America Team until it went out of business in 1982.

IRONDEQUOIT'S SELECTIONS:

TOM BORSHOFF

- was Irondequoit's first Section V Champion and later became the school's first ALL AMERICA. Tom was a three-time ALL COUNTY and was COUNTY CHAMPION once and SECTION V CHAMPION once. His final VARSITY record was 66 wins and 6 losses. He later wrestled for Springfield College.

LANCE WHIPPLE

- was a three-time ALL COUNTY and COUNTY CHAMPION twice. He amassed a record of 63 wins 4 losses and 2 draws in four years of VARSITY competition. Lance was the first I.H.S. wrestler to place in the COUNTY TOURNAMENT four times. He won the Sectionals as a Senior. He won the Niagara District Senior Men's A.A.U. Championship in 1966 as a High School Junior. After graduation Lance joined the U.S. Army and won the BRONZE STAR for heroism in Viet Nam.

JOHN OLESIUK

- was a three-time ALL COUNTY and COUNTY CHAMPION twice. His three-year VARSITY record was 79 wins and 5 losses. John was a Sectional Champion once and was chosen for the Junior World Team tryouts in the summer of 1967. He later wrestled for Duke University.

GARY ST. JAMES

- was a two-time ALL COUNTY and COUNTY CHAMPION once. His three-year VARSITY record was 55 wins 5 losses and 1 draw. He was the master of the stand-up and the single leg. He later wrestled for Monroe Community College.

KURT BLANK

- was three-time ALL COUNTY two-time COUNTY CHAMPION and was voted OUTSTANDING WRESTLER TWICE. He was also a two-time SECTION V CHAMPION and two-time A vs. B CHAMPION. Kurt was IRONDEQUOIT'S first NEW YORK STATE CHAMPION as well as the first IRONDEQUOIT wrestler to be selected to BOTH ALL AMERICA Teams. Kurt later wrestled at Ohio University where he again attained ALL AMERICA recognition by placing in the N.C.A.A. Tournament where he defeated the N.C.A.A. defending Champion and other ALL AMERICA wrestlers enroute to his honor.

RORY WHIPPLE

- was a three-time ALL COUNTY two-time COUNTY CHAMPION and was the first wrestler to become a Caledonia Tournament Champion THREE TIMES in the history of the tournament. Rory won the 155 lb. NEW YORK STATE CHAMPIONSHIP to conclude his high school competition with a record of 80 wins 10 losses and 1 draw. The following summer he won the NEW YORK STATE GRECO-ROMAN CHAMPIONSHIP to become Irondequoit's first two-time STATE CHAMP. He represented New York State in the National Championships in Ames, Iowa where he placed THIRD in the NATION. Rory later wrestled for the defending National Junior College Champions at Farmingdale Junior College where he again gained ALL AMERICA honors by placing in the Junior College Nationals. He later wrestled for Cortland State College where he gained N.C.A.A. ALL AMERICA honors as a Senior. He is now a coach at Hartwick College.

TIM BORSHOFF

- was a two-time ALL COUNTY and COUNTY CHAMPION once. He was a SECTION V CHAMPION and ALL STATE as a Junior and was ALL STATE in FREESTYLE as a Senior. He represented New York State in the NATIONAL FREE-STYLE CHAMPIONSHIPS during the summer of his Senior year. Tim wrestled often on the Varsity as a Freshman at Binghamton State College. He really blossomed as a Sophomore and climaxed a great season by becoming the first Irondequoit High product to ever wrestle in the N.C.A.A. NATIONAL FINALS.

TONY OLIVERI

- was a four year letterman an ALL SECTION FIVE a two-time ALL COUNTY a three-time D-DAY winner, a two-time Caledonia Tournament champion, an ALL- LEAGUE First Team selection, the team Captain, and won 56 bouts as an Irondequoit wrestler. He became the first Irondequoit graduate to become a FOUR time ALL STATE college wrestler while competing for the University of Buffalo. He made ALL AMERICA when he won the bronze medal in the 1986 Espoir Greco Roman Nationals at 125.5 pounds. Tony later became the first Irondequoit product to compete in the FINAL OLYMPIC TRIALS also in 1976. Tony is now the owner of Physical Therapy Associates in Rochester.

TONY COTRONEO

- wrestled Varsity for IRONDEQUOIT as an eighth grader and that spring he won the NATIONAL U.S.W.F. NORTHEAST FREE-STYLE CHAMPIONSHIP. He repeated the feat again after his Freshman year. During his FIVE YEARS as a Varsity wrestler he registered 86 falls, 44 of them in duals as he compiled a record of 164 wins - a new STATE RECORD. He was undefeated in duals in grades 9 through 12 with a perfect 60-0 mark. He never missed a competition in five years and won 11 individual tournament titles in the 12 invitational tournaments he entered. He was a FOUR-TIME COUNTY CHAMPION, a THREE-TIME SECTION V CHAMPION, and a Dream Team member. THREE-TIME ALL STATE WRESTLER. Probably his most amazing feat was at the Caledonia Tournaments where he won FOUR titles and 11 of his 12 wins were by a fall. He ended his career at Irondequoit as the 112 lb. STATE CHAMPION. He did his collegiate wrestling at Syracuse University where he became the first Syracuse wrestler to win over 100 matches in college, was ranked number one in the Nation, made the USAW All American Team, was a four-time New York State Collegiate Champion, an Eastern Champion and was the first Eastern wrestler to ever win the Midlands Tournament while still a college student. In addition he was the team captain and the Academic Athlete of the Year. He served as an Assistant Coach at Syracuse University while attending law school and is now practicing law in Rochester.

C.J. DOMINICK

- was a member of IRONDEQUOIT'S 1980 Section Five Championship team and a member of the County championship team in 1981. He was the 177 pound champion in the Brockport Tournament in 1980. C.J. was a two-time letterman for the Indians. An amazing fact is that C. J. never wrestled until his sophomore year and yet just four wrestling seasons later he became Irondequoit's 20th All American. C.J. finished his Freshman year at Monroe Community College with a season record of 37-5 and was named to the National Junior College Athletic Association All America team when he placed 4th in the Nationals.

SHAWN CAVANAUGH

- has possibly the most amazing of all of Irondequoit's All American stories. Shawn did not wrestle varsity until his junior year in high school. He wrestled on the varsity as a freshman at Brockport State and then red-shirted his sophomore year. He transferred to Cortland for his junior year and had to sit out the first semester. With only 3 1/2 years of varsity competition, Shawn won All American honors at the NCAA championships. In his senior year he again became an All-American. He joined Tim Borshoff as an Irondequoit matman who became a NATIONAL FINALIST. At Irondequoit, Shawn was a JV County Champ as a sophomore, a two time All County, two time All Section Five, four time All State in Freestyle, and All State in Greco Roman. He was also a Monroe County and Section Five Champ and had a career record of 65-11 in high school. He is now the Assistant Coach at Webster High.

BRIAN PINTAGRO

- became the Indians first true Collegiate Academic All-American his sophomore year at R.I.T. Brian was a 3-time All-County, All-League, and All-Section 5. He represented Section 5 in the States in '91, wrestled for Cortland in '92, and starred on the mats and in the classroom in '93.

NATE BADER

- astonished the wrestling world when in only his third year of varsity competition and his freshman year of college he placed fourth in the N.C.C.A.A. national wrestling championships. The real thrill had to be that the host school was Baptist Bible College of Pennsylvania in Clark's Summit, Nate's own school! This small college of only 570 students (260 males) literally jumped to the forefront of Christian College Wrestling partially due to the performance of Nate Bader: All-American.

ARKEE ALLEN

- became Irondequoit's first N.C.A.A. Division I Rookie All American team member as a freshman at Columbia University. He registered a 26-8 record and reached at least the semifinals at each tournament in which he competed during the regular season. In high school he had done it all having won 9 tournament titles, having broken ALL of the four-year takedown records, and having won the ALLS - County, League, Section 5, and State. He was also honored as the Ivy League Academic Athlete awardee. Arkee's accomplishments at Columbia University include: State Finalist, Eastern Finalist, Captain and MVP, Ivy League Champion, 4 time Columbia Duals Champion, 8 time Tournament Finalist and ranked 11th in nation in the 142 lb weight class.

INTERNATIONAL WRESTLERS

FOUR Irondequoit High grapplers have been invited to (and have attended) the **UNITED STATES OLYMPIC DEVELOPMENT TRAINING CLINIC**.

The Olympic Committee selects 50 wrestlers from college clubs and high schools in the East each year and they are trained in the Olympic or international styles of wrestling by national coaches for one week during the summer months. The wrestlers' expenses at the clinic are paid by Olympic Committee funds attained by donations to the Olympic programs. A similar clinic is held in the far West.

The four IRONDEQUOIT HIGH SCHOOL wrestlers chosen were:

Tom Borshoff	1965
Don Menges	1966
Lance Whipple	1967
Kurt Blank	1971

The U.S.O.D.T.C. Camps were terminated in 1972, which left Irondequoit High School as the **NATIONAL LEADER** in production of individuals selected for these clinics.

RICK ZWEIG, a State place winner for Irondequoit High in 1969, became the first product of this school to represent the **UNITED STATES** in international competition when he competed in the U.S.A. vs. U.S.S.R. dual meet on March 30, 1974 in California. Rick attained two take-downs against the defending **OLYMPIC CHAMPION** in an electrifying bout before losing in the closing seconds - a truly great showing for the former Indian. He won the silver medal in the Maccabiah Games in Israel in 1977 at 198 pounds.

TOM BENEDETTO was invited to the Regional Olympic Team Trials at Binghamton State at 114.5 pounds in 1976. At the time Tom was a junior and was one of the very few high school athletes to have been invited. He wrestled very well considering the level of competition and placed sixth in the tournament.

TONY COTRONEO was chosen to travel to Japan in 1977 for an A.A.U. Cultural Exchange where he attended wrestling instruction sessions directed by Japan's National Coaching Staff. He also wrestled in six dual meets against the Japanese - won five and defeated the **WORLD CHAMPION** - Tony was a 14 year-old 8th grader at the time.

TOM LEHMANN was also invited to go to Japan in 1977 - one of 45 American youths to do so. The states of California and Oregon were limited to five wrestlers each while **IRONDEQUOIT HIGH** had **THREE** wrestlers on the Wrestling Exchange Team - indeed an honor for Tom and his school. Tom dominated his Japanese opponents going 4-0 with one fall, an 11-1 decision, and a 6-0 decision. Tom was undefeated on the tour and cites the dual between the U.S.A. High School Team vs. the Japanese College All-Stars as the highlight of the competition.

TONY OLIVERI, former Irondequoit superstar, was a **TEAM LEADER** on the trip to Japan while a sophomore wrestler at the University of Buffalo. Tony was an excellent choice as a **LEADER** in that he and his family have been involved in freestyle wrestling for years.

TONY OLIVERI qualified for the 1980 **OLYMPIC TEAM** trials in Madison, Wisconsin by winning the 125.5 pound Championship in the **REGIONAL OLYMPIC TEAM TRIALS**. The former four-time Collegiate **ALL STATE** wrestler was the first Irondequoit product to qualify for **OLYMPIC TEAM FINAL TRIALS**.

TONY COTRONEO was chosen to attend the **OLYMPIC 200 Camp** at the United States Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs, Colorado to train under the tutelage of the Olympic Team Coaching Staff in 1980. The invitees were the top 200 teenage wrestlers in the nation - quite an honor for Tony and Irondequoit.

KRIS NEU was sent on a Tour de Monde wrestling team trip to Europe during the summer of 1996. Kris had already been a four-year letterman, a county champion, and was in range to win over 100 matches in high school, all of this *BEFORE* his senior year.

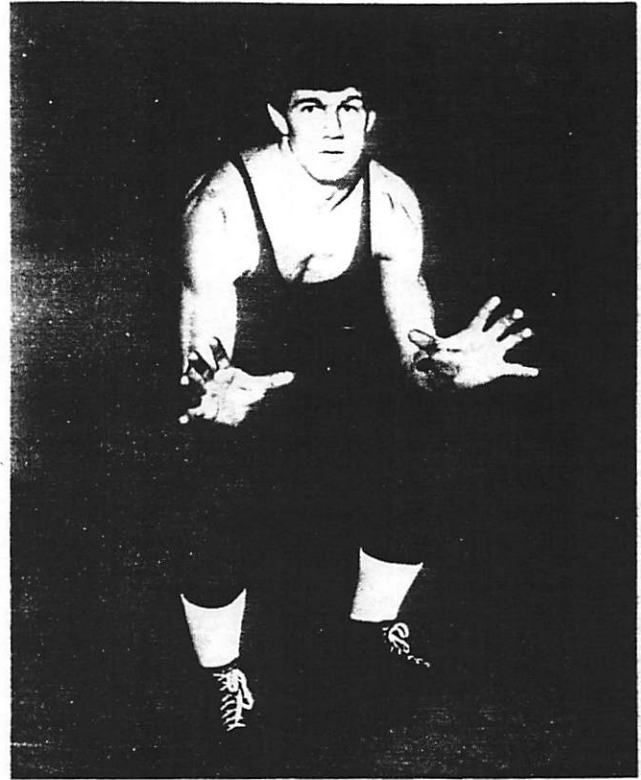

NUMBER ONE !

He had been here before and this was his last chance. A year ago Kurt Blank had dominated his weight class in Section V and had come to wrestle in the States. A year ago he had lost on a questionable call on Friday night and here he was again - Friday night. The word came as good news - he had a bye and would not have to wrestle until Saturday.

KURT BLANK



Saturday morning came and Kurt made weight with his slacks and boots on. He was ready. His first opponent, Kevin Young from Sleepy Hollow had won by a fall on Friday night. They shook

hands and came forward. Kurt looked up and Young shrugged him for a takedown in the first two seconds of the match. They went out of bounds and Blank was down. He EXPLODED to come out for an escape. When the dust had settled, Young staggered back to his coach - BLANK HAD WON - SEVENTEEN to TWO.

The State Semi-Finals have to tighten you up - but Irondequoit had been here before and Kurt was prepared. He unleashed another furious attack and reached the FINALS with a ELEVEN to FOUR decision.

The lights dimmed and the spotlight came on. It was time for the introductions of the FINALISTS. "From Section Five and Irondequoit High School, KURT BLANK. His opponent, from Section Six and Niagara Falls, Willie Hunt." The scene was set. This was it. Irondequoit's first State FINALIST.

Both Willie and Kurt display magnificent defense during the first period which ends scoreless. Kurt is down in the second period and he executes a 'perfect' stand-up for a one point escape. He gets in DEEP twice but is unable to take Willie and his Whizzer down.

Period three begins with Blank on top. He clamps on his ride and is doing well when BAM - Willie is out - score 1 - 1. Kurt shoots and Willie blocks. Willie shoots and Kurt sprawls. WHISTLE. A POINT for Willie - Blank is stalling. HMM. . . . same ref as last year . . . HMM. Time is running out - less than a minute - LOOK OUT WILLIE - the FAMOUS BLANK CARRY - spin, spin, spin. TWO - takedown. Blank leads 3 - 2 with seconds remaining. Willie hits his Whizzer but Blank scoops the ankle. Hang on - hang on - BUZZZZ - its over. KURT BLANK IS IRONDEQUOIT'S FIRST STATE CHAMP.

He calmly removes the anklet and hands it to the ref with a smile. He turns and walks two steps and then breaks into a run. He had done it - he had won the States. . . . WOW! He meets his coach in mid-air for the long awaited RIDE. KURT BLANK - STATE CHAMP.

A few months later he heard that he had made Amateur Wrestling News Honor Roll Team. But the best was yet to come. At the senior awards assembly he was awarded the WIRQ Athlete of the Year Award. He turned to leave the stage but was asked to sit down. A Representative of a Congressman read a letter. "Congratulations Kurt Blank . . . for being selected FIRST TEAM ALL AMERICA . . ." The letter was signed: Richard Nixon - PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES. Kurt had been informed from the President that he was:

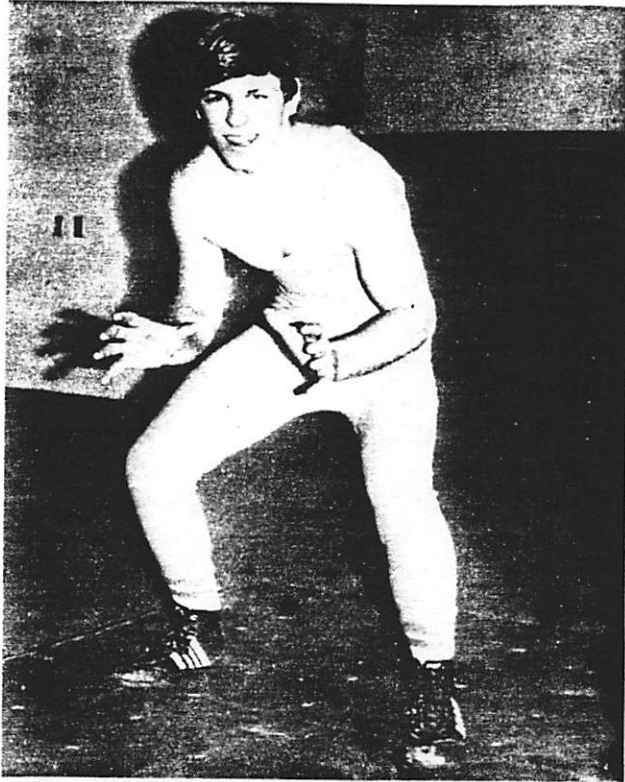

RORY WHIPPLE

With four seconds remaining - trailing by one - but knowing he had riding time, Rory stalked Willie Manning of Ramapo. He had trailed 6 - 5 going into the third period and now it was tied. Whip shot his best - a single - and Manning dove for the side-line. Whip pulled him back by the ankle and dropped on top for TWO. He let Manning go at the buzzer as the crowd went wild. Rory Whipple was State Champ. Years of ardent work and dedication had paid off and waves of joy and ecstasy flowed through his body.

It showed in his face and in the dance he performed in the center circle. It showed as he bounced from the mat to his coach and moments later when he embraced the members of his family. He will relive those final moments of his High School wrestling career as will those who witnessed that final battle. But those feelings - in total - can never again be experienced. It truly was worth it - the years of training and he had done it - he had won the States.

Rory Whipple had become immortal in the annals of Irondequoit Wrestling. He was the first THREE TIME Champion in the history of the Caledonia-Mumford Tournament, Irondequoit's first Windsor Tournament Champion and the first wrestler from Irondequoit or even from Section V to win TWO State Wrestling Championships in one year. Yes, two Championships - for in the summer of '72 Rory won the New York State Greco-Roman Championship. He had Captained his team to the 100th duel meet win for Irondequoit and had inspired hundreds by his deeds and leadership. He later became the first Irondequoit High athlete to make ALL AMERICA in TWO sports: Wrestling AND Lacrosse.

Yes, Rory's magic number was certainly TWO. He won the States with a takedown for TWO. He was the second Irondequoit Wrestler to beat an opponent named Willie with a takedown in the final seconds. He was the second Whipple to make ALL AMERICA and he became Irondequoit's second National place winner when he took a Bronze medal at the United States Wrestling Federation Tournament in Iowa. He was the second Irondequoit Wrestler to be awarded a flag which had flown over the Nation's Capital in his honor and a letter of congratulations from the President of the United States.

All this goes to prove that the mathematicians are not always right - because Rory proved that if you add enough TWOS together, you will wind up being:

His name was STEVE OLESIUK - and yes, there was pressure being an Olesiuk - his brother had been an All American and another brother had been a team captain and here was another Olesiuk and yes, people did expect him to annihilate every foe.

Steve made the J.V. team as a Freshman and won the Webster Tournament and people started to notice - this kid was "slick".

As a Soph he again wrestled J.V. and this year he won the Eastridge Tournament - but you could see the disappointment in his face - he was the first Olesiuk not to letter as a Sophomore - PRESSURE! He had to do something big

His Junior year it started to fall together - a Varsity Letter - an East - West Day winner and three big announcements for "O": "The 1975 team captain will be STEVE OLESIUK" (applause) and, "Steve Olesiuk set a new school Takedown record this year with 39 (more applause). Beginning next year, the United States Wrestling Federation will honor the High School National Takedown Champion in each weight class." A GOAL - a secret for now - but a GOAL

The head snap and the single leg he had started to make famous were drilled in earnest now - at school and in the family room converted into a gym - every day - A GOAL — A GOAL Nobody knew — but A GOAL

The coach caught on by the third meet - 5 takedowns against Newfane, against Fairport 3 takedowns, against Rush - 3, Eastridge - 6 - 6 more against Mendon, this kid had a GOAL. Coach never said anything but "O" knew - he'd hear the voice: "O", let him out - now hit it, hit it, let him out again" The kid had a GOAL

In addition "O" had chosen the same weight class as the defending STATE CHAMPION who was in our league. "O" went undefeated in league duels, won against at East-West Day - smashed his own school takedown record and when the Counties were over - the State Champ was second - the NEW Champion was STEVE OLESIUK - But was that enough??? After the Sectionals it was just wait

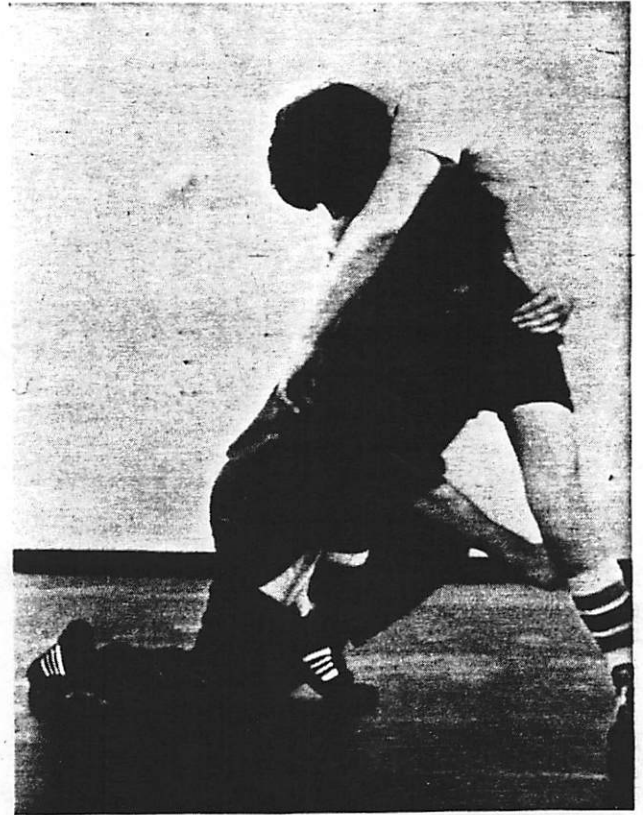

"This is the first year the United States Wrestling Federation has recognized the National High School Takedown Champions!"

The list of twelve champions began - total takedowns, weight, name, school and hometown for each champion (Hey; They skipped 138 - how about "O"?)

And now, ladies and gentlemen, the top three takedown champions in the nation - third place (Aw, the kid from Hadley, Pa.) The runner up with 61, Tom Smith from Bullock Creek High, Midland, Mich., and with an astounding total of 93 takedowns (93 - that's "O" - faces tighten, chins and lips quiver and tears come to the eyes - he did it - he reached the GOAL) 138 pounds, STEVE OLESIUK of IRONDEQUOIT HIGH SCHOOL, Irondequoit, New York is the

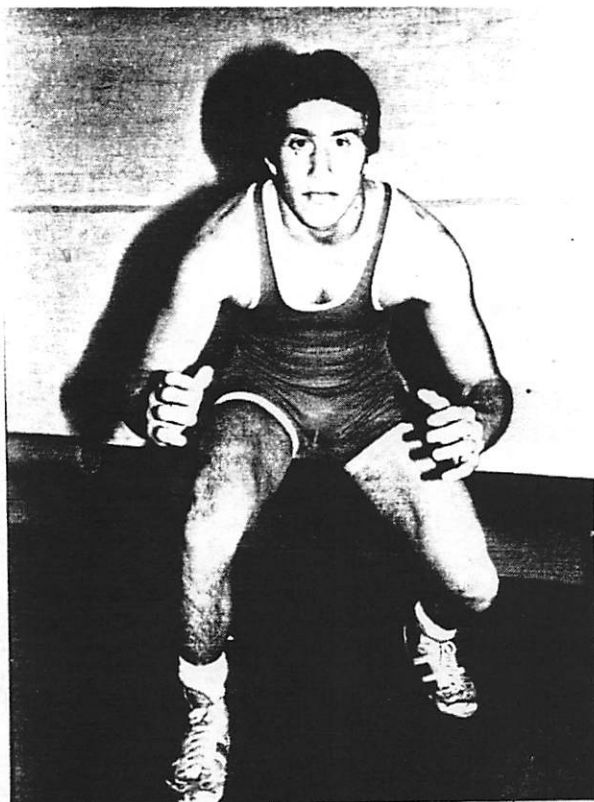

"..... representing Section Eleven, a senior from Sachem High School, introducing Ed Morales. Representing Section Five, an 18 year old senior from Irondequoit High School with a season record of 37 and 0, fourth in the State in 1979 at 105, third in the State in 1980 at 112, coached by Art Connorton, with a State record of 163 wins - **TONY COTRONEO.**"

The elbow injured in practice THREE weeks ago was wrapped and taped, but still hurt as Tony stepped forward to shake hands. Moments later, when the whistle blew the hurt was forgotten - only the job to be done - the title to be won.....

This was his THIRD trip to the States. He had won THREE Section Five titles in THREE years. He was the THIRD Cotroneo to be a successful wrestler - cousin Keith had made it to the finals here in '72 and brother Craig had been great at Bishop Kearney. He was the THIRD wrestler to break the state record for wins since he had started high school - AND he was Irondequoit's THIRD State finalist. The first two had won.....

Morales reaches to tie up ... elbow throw bye executed to perfection ... but no opening. Morales reaches again - post-level change - double - sprawl - turn the corner - **TAKEDOWN** Cotroneo Morales goes butt up - legs - drops off to a near side cradle (he had learned that from Wade Schalles) leg scoop - scoop - scoop - he's **TURNED**..... but he goes belly down - the cradle is still on - Tony turns him and scoops again - again he is **TURNED** - again he goes belly through and again Morales is **TURNED** and again he goes flat.....

THE BOUT IS STOPPED - WHY? Tony starts up - legs - Morales stands up - Cotroneo drops to a single (learned that from Mike Sager) and hangs on - **BUZZZ** - period. Score-Cotroneo 4 - Morales - 0. Tony had turned him THREE times.....

The toss - Tony loses - but it's O.K. - he had chosen bottom all year just to prepare for this moment. All the camps - the trip to Japan - the weeks at the Olympic Training Center in Colorado - the training - the drilling - the lifting - he **MUST** get out.....

Tony sits in - turns in - **ESCAPE!** Morales is charging now - once - twice - **THREE** carries - all blocked. Cotroneo is warned for **STALLING!** Comes the flurry - Morales another carry - Tony is on his hip - he cuddle - flanker - spin - spin - Morales stands - single - change off to a double - whizzer - back to the single - pick the ankle - go behind - **TAKEDOWN** Cotroneo - 9 seconds left - crab - **BUZZZ** - period. Score - Cotroneo 7 - Morales - 0. The **THIRD** and final period.....

Tony starts up - crab - to a cross body - Morales goes butt up - legs and a crossface cradle - **WHISTLE!** Morales is awarded a point - Cotroneo is nailed for **STALLING!** No pressure - it's part of the game.....

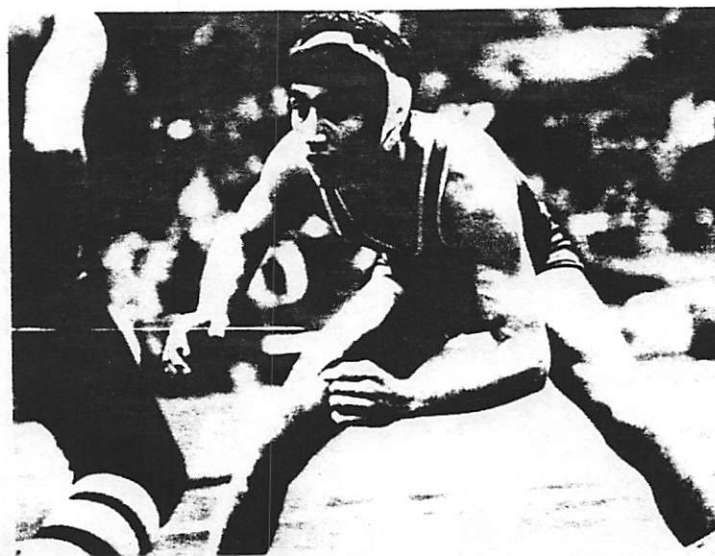
Morales stands - single - hmmm - **THIRD** time he tried that - Tony again drops to a single - cross body and a quarter nelson - Morales steps and turns in - can't let him get that elbow through - **WHISTLE---** **STALEMATE...**

Twenty two seconds - crab - fifteen seconds - cross body - Morales runs the pipe - **REVERSAL** - **BUZZZ** - it's over.

Tony jumps up and raises his thumb high in the air..... He had won - seven to **THREE!**

"The champion at 112 pounds, the winningest wrestler in New York State history - **TONY COTRONEO!**"

Remembering this moment - these feelings - will occur and reoccur for years to come but remembering is easy when you're

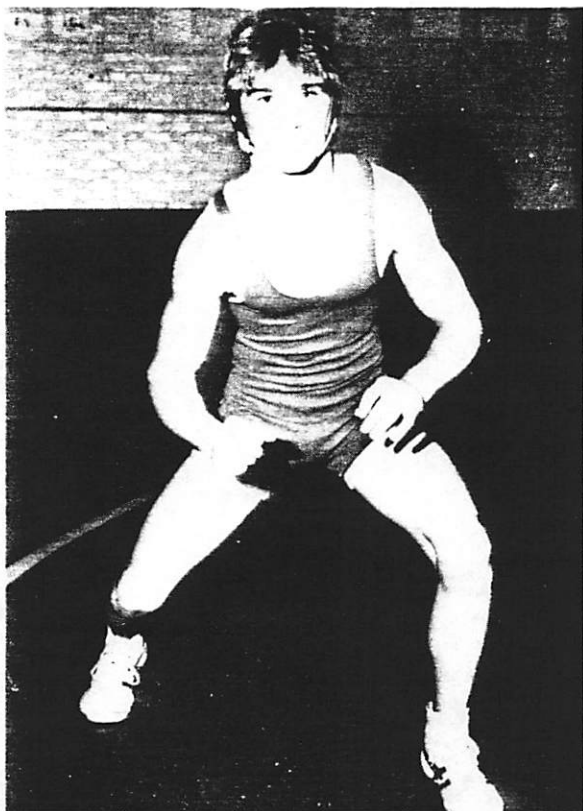

A PIECE OF THE TRADITION



CHRIS MOORE

As he reached forward to receive the coveted John Griffin Memorial Trophy, the last presentation given at the Wrestling Awards Banquet, CHRIS MOORE was about to perform his final act as a member of the Irondequoit wrestling team. He had been a part of the program for EIGHT years, nearly half of his life, and now it was over. The coach had just finished his twenty fifth year as Irondequoit's head mentor and Chris had been a part of the program for nearly one third of that coaching career. Emotions were reflecting between these two men as the crowd applauded. They both were mentally recalling the great moments of this era of Irondequoit's proud wrestling history.

CHRIS MOORE was the team manager as a fifth and sixth grader, continued as the manager while he wrestled for the Junior High, and had wrestled on the Varsity for four years. He had lost his first Varsity bout against Fulton, the number one team in the State as a Freshman and he had lost his last bout in the sectionals as a Senior, but in between he sandwiched a legacy which many will remember for years to come.

As manager and wrestler, Chris had been a part of ninety dual meet victories, twenty seven team titles including League, County and Sectional Championships and a fourth place finish in the State Championships. He had been an All Section Five wrestler along with thirty six of his teammates. Chris made the All County team as a Sophomore and again as a Senior, as did thirty seven of his teammates during that time span.

With all if this, Chris' greatest triumphs occurred during his final season as an Indian grappler. He wrestled all fourteen dual meets and in all four tournaments and registered twenty six wins and a tie. He had many thrills while wearing the blue, like wrestling a hard

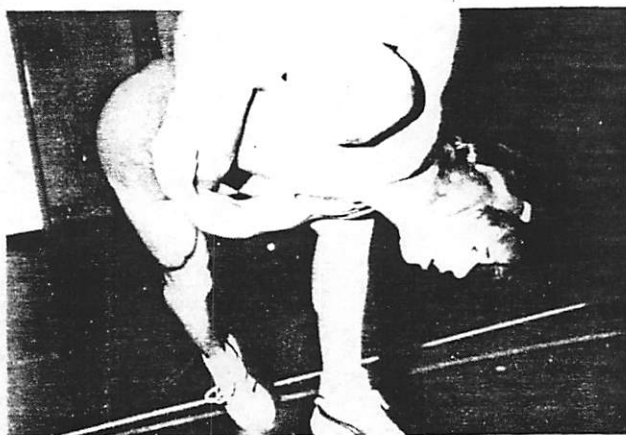
fought draw in Irondequoit's two hundredth dual meet win, or having won his bouts in East - West Day victories in his Junior and Senior years. He was elected Captain in his Senior year, only the twenty fifth ever and he was a unanimous First Team All League selection - the Indian's nineteenth. But his greatest hour as an Irondequoit wrestler occurred on the night of December 29th - far away in the finals of the Ninth Annual Waterloo Invitational Tournament.

As he walked out on the mat for the finals, Chris knew that Irondequoit had been assured of nine placewinners for the day and that his teammates, whom he had led so well, could do no more. If the pressure of being Captain and of being one of only three Seniors on the team were not enough, a team trophy for the school hung in the balance of the outcome of his match. Many times in the past he had watched one of the guys in the blue meet the challenge and win, when winning was a must. The fact that he had never won a tournament championship made no difference now. He was Captain and now his whole team was relying on him to take home the trophy.

The spirit of Irondequoit's twenty All Americans must have surged through his blonde headed frame as the match progressed. He was calling upon eight years of technique, strategy and savvy to win this one bout. The knee which had caused him problems throughout his career was injured again and time-out was called. As his coach administered to him and offered suggestions, a surge of energy - power - excitement thundred through his body. He returned to the mat to resume what had started as a game but was becoming an all out personal war. He was calling on the hundreds of hours of practice, the summer evenings with Tony Cotroneo, the All American, the spring and summer tournaments, the miles of running and tons of lifting in in these last few minutes.

Many heralded Chris as the greatest thrower in Irondequoit's quarter of a century of wrestling, but this was no time to be fancy or to take unnecessary chances. His single was perfect and as he turned the corner, he - and everyone else knew - the war was over - CHRIS MOORE had won HIS championship.

As the ref raised his hand, time froze for just a moment. Irondequoit had won yet another team trophy, another individual tournament championship and another thrilling bout. For this moment CHRIS MOORE was everything that the Indian's wrestling program was all about and only those who had been Irondequoit wrestlers, who had lived the agony of a day in the Pit, the dedication and the sacrifice, could even begin to comprehend his feelings. CHRIS MOORE was finally a champion - a living part of

LEO BERNABI AWARD
