

3 Braves in state semifinals ★

SYRACUSE — Three of the four Canandaigua wrestlers entered in the New York State Intersectional Tournament have reached the semifinals as Section 5 leads after the first day of the two-day event at the Onondaga War Memorial.

Butch Hibbard (98), Paul Lamphier (105) and Marty King (119) have all reached the semifinals, while T.J. Mincer (138) remains alive in the wrestlebacks after last night's competition.

In sectional scoring, Section 5, with all 14 wrestlers still alive in the event, leads with 90½ points. Sec-

tion 4 (Southern Tier) is second with 79½ points and Section 11 (East Long Island) is third with 70.

King, competing in his fourth state meet, had to win two bouts yesterday, while Hibbard and Lamphier both won one after first-round byes. King decisioned Patrick Jones of Massapequa-4 7-0 and pinned Jeff Waddington of Falconer-6 in 4:38.

Hibbard beat Philip Arisman of Queensbury-2 8-3 while Lamphier nipped Phil Consiglio of North Rockland-92-1.

Mincer won his first bout, beating

James Howe of Brewster-1 7-4, but lost 5-1 to Mark Sabo of Granville-2 in the quarterfinals.

In all, 10 of Section 5's 14 wrestlers have reached the semifinal round. Others include Angelo DeAngelis (132) and John Suhr (145) of Spencerport, Brian Kurlander (155) and Steve Salzman (167) of Brighton, Chris Schojan (177) of East Rochester and John Brennan (250) of Pittsford.

Competition continues throughout today, with finals scheduled for 8 p.m.

Marty King wins state wrestling title

SYRACUSE — Canandaigua's Marty King was one of two Section 5 wrestlers to win an individual championship at the New York State Tournament here Saturday.

King, a junior participating in his fourth state meet, decided Section 2's Pat Ferri 10-1 in the 119-pound semifinals before nipping Section 3's Kevin Johnson 2-1 in the championship bout.

King was one of eight Section 5 wrestlers in the finals, though the only other winner was 250-pounder John Brennan of Pittsford, who

decided Section 3's Randy Morrison 6-2.

Section 5 wrestlers who lost in the finals were McQuaid's Bob Zoeke (91), Canandaigua's Butch Hibbard (98) and Paul Lamphier (105), Spencerport's John Suhr (145), Brighton's Brian Kulander (155) and East Rochester's Chris Schojan (177).

Hibbard lost a 4-2 decision to Dennis Mejais of Section 8, while Lamphier lost a 12-4 decision to Bret Penrith of Section 4. Both Canandaigua wrestlers are sophomores.

Another Canandaigua sophomore who earned his way to the states, 138-pounder Tim Mincer, won his opening bout over James Howe of Section 1 before losing a quarter-final decision to Mark Sabo of Section 2. Mincer then won two matches in the wrestlebacks, defeating Section 7's Keith Provost 3-1 and Catholic Schools participant John Wood 5-1, before losing 2-0 to Section 11's Tom McSherry.

Section 5 led the team competition for most of the tournament, but eventually finished second to Sec-

tion 11, which compiled 215½ team points. Section 5 totaled 211, followed by Section 3 (170), Section 9 (155½) and Section 2 (152½).

Other individual champions were Section 8's Richard Pidgeon (91), Section 2's Jeff Clark (112), Section 8's Jeff Arena (126), Section 11's Peter Yozzo (132), Section 3's Brian Akley (138), Section 9's Gary Fischbein (145), Section 2's Jon Cardi (155), Section 11's Ron Hubbard (167), Section 11's Don Mayo (177) and Section 11's Ted Gregory (215).
