Wake Forest Scores Upset Win Over Duke

Mike Krzyzewski had been talking to us for awhile, and it seems we weren't listening.

The coach of the top-ranked Duke Blue Devils kept forewarning of his team's February schedule whenever talk of an undefeated NCAA championship defense would arise. That was before he lost his starting point guard to a broken foot.

Krzyzewski has two games left on that part of the schedule he so often referred to — Virginia at home Wednesday night and at UCLA on Sunday, technically the day after February. His team now has two losses — both during THAT part of the schedule, the second on Sunday at Wake Forest, 72-68.

The Blue Devils (21-2, 11-2), who still hold a 2½-game lead over Florida State in the Atlantic Coast Conference, struggled past Maryland at home on Wednesday by two points and then lost to the Demon Deacons (16-7, 7-6), who outscored Duke 15-1 over the final 5:19.

Duke, which committed 15 turnovers and led by 10 with nine minutes to play, led 68-67 on a free throw by Brian Davis with 1:45 left. Anthony Tucker put the Demon Deacons up for good 20 seconds later with a 12-foot jumper. Chris King made three of four free throws in the final 11 seconds to secure the win.

Rodney Rogers added 18 points for the Demon Deacons, while Thomas Hill had 20 points for Duke and Christian Laettner added 18.

No. 5 Arizona 66, Temple 60
Matt Othick tied a school record

with seven 3-pointers as the Wildcats (20-4) prevailed in the second game of a made-for-TV doubleheader at the Florida Suncoast Dome.

No. 7 Indiana 86, No. 6 Ohio St. 80
The Hoosiers (20-4, 11-2) did a lot with the win. They swept the season series from Ohio State, opened a 1½-game lead over the Buckeyes in the Big Ten standings and ended the Buckeyes' 30-game home winning streak. Indiana hit 10 straight shots at the end of the first half and start of the second for a 49-38 lead. Ohio State (17-5, 9-3) rallied to tie at 62-62, but Calbert Cheaney, who finished with 28 points, scored five straight and Damon Bailey added two more to break it open.

No. 9 Missouri 66, No. 8 Oklahoma St. 52

Jevon Crudup had 19 points and Jamal Coleman 18 for the Tigers (19-4, 7-3), who beat Oklahoma State at home for the 15th year in a row.

No. 13 Kentucky 84, Georgia 73
The Wildcats (20-5, 9-3) trailed by 13 when they went on a 15-1 lead for a 54-53 lead with 14 minutes to play.

No. 25 Georgetown 72, No. 17 Syracuse 68

Alonzo Mourning had 27 points and Joey Brown added a career-high 23 as the Hoyas (17-6, 10-4) held first place in the Big East by one-half game over St. John's. Brown had 10 of the Hoyas' last 14 points and he made eight of 10 free throws in final 3½ minutes as Georgetown won its fourth straight and handed the Orangemen (16-7, 8-6) their fourth loss in a row. Dave Johnson led Syracuse with 18 points.

Medina, Roy-Hart, Albion Matmen Claim Total Of 8 Titles At N-O Championships

Host Medina and Roy-Hart both had three champions crowned and Albion two at the 26th annual Niagara-Orleans All-League wrestling championships held on Saturday.

Medina's Eric Gross claimed a league title for the second year in a row while his teammates Eric Heveron and Binh Hua both returned to the victory platform after a year's absence.

Roy-Hart's Jason Collins captured an N-O title for the fourth straight year as his Ram teammates Jarrod Lake and Eric Guild both earned their first championships.

Albion's winners were Tom Moss, who earned the tourney's MVP honors, and Jeromy McVige.

Newfane, which captured the N-O team title this season with a perfect 6-0 duel match record, crowned four champions including Keith Jones (98), Craig Hinkley (112), Allen Gerhardt (145) and Jerry Babcock (177).

Rounding out the list of winners are repeat champions Aaron Class (155) of Starpoint and Daric Brege (250) of Akron.

Gross, who captured the 177 lb. title last year, registered three straight pins to claim the 167 lb. crown this season. In raising his season record to 27-1-1 and his career mark to 104-25-2, Gross pinned Starpoint's Greg Seefeldt in 3:08 in the title match. He pinned Wilson's Kevin Schendel in just 29 seconds in the semifinals and Akron's Nick Schmitz in 2:58 in the quarterfinals.

Heveron, who won the 105 lb. title in 1990, claimed that weight class again with a quick 38 second pin over Albion's Jim Papponetti. The bout was the only one on the day in the weight class as Heveron improved his season record to 24-3 and his career mark to 76-20.

Hua, who captured the 119 lb. title in 1990, earned the 126 lb. crown this time with a fast 46 second pin over Albion's Tom Rush. Hua, who is now 24-9 on the season and 90-40 for his career, also pinned Starpoint's Adam Barry in 1:16 in the semis and Roy-Hart's Kevin Nichols in 3:20 in the quarterfinals.

Improving to 30-4 on the season and 99-29-1 for his career, Collins claimed a fourth straight N-O title by pinning Albion's Cal Stinson in 1:46 in the 119 lb. finals. Collins, who previously won the 91 lb. title in 1989 and 1990 and the 105 lb. crown last year, also pinned Akron's Chuck Rebmann in 29 seconds in the semifinals and Medina's Dave D'Amico in 3:02 in the quarterfinals.

Lake, who finished second at 177 lb. in both 1990 and 1991, earned top honors at 215 lb. this year with a 15-1 decision over Starpoint's Craig Burns in the finals. Now at 29-3 on the season and 60-21 for his career, Lake advanced to the finals by pinning Wilson's Luke Cirillo in 3:53 in the semis and Albion's Bill Putnam in 3:03 in the quarterfinals.

In his first varsity season, Guild pinned Starpoint's Adam Stom in 2:53

to capture the 91 lb. title. He gained a spot in the finals by scoring superior decision wins over Newfane's Shawn Cleavelly in the semis and Starpoint's Jim Lewen in the quarterfinals.

McVige claimed the 132 lb. title by deciding Newfane's Tim Lukasik 19-7 in the finals. Going to 18-3 on the season, McVige pinned Wilson's Brennan McAvoy in 1:47 in the semifinals.

Moss outdueled Newfane's Tim DeGlopper 12-8 to earn the 138 lb. title and tourney MVP honors. Moss, who pinned Starpoint's David Kantor in 4:43 in the semis and decided Akron's Shawn Murray 11-3 in the quarterfinals, is now 16-6 on the season.

In notching title match victories for Newfane, Jones edged Albion's Eric Johnson 3-2, Hinkley blanked Albion's Mike Moss 5-0, Gerhardt pinned Starpoint's Bob Zavodny in 2:50 and Babcock outlasted Albion's Chris Vogt 13-11.

In repeating as N-O champions, Class decisioned Albion's Lenny Marszalkowski 6-2 and Brege pinned Newfane's Alex Benson in 1:50.
