

# Salamanca, Oswayo Valley Champs

## Big 30 Wrestling

Eleven Big 30 high school wrestling teams, 10 from New York, competed in tournaments this past weekend and two, Salamanca and Oswayo Valley, claimed team championships.

Salamanca, 4-1 in dual meets after dropping a 27-24 decision to Maple Grove last Tuesday, regrouped to win the 18-team Niagara Community College Officials Tournament, while Oswayo Valley (1-4) topped an 11-team lineup in the Franklinville Tournament.

Olean High had one champ and placed sixth in the 16-team Canandaigua Tournament, while Wellsville was third and Bolivar seventh in the 12-team Hammondsport Tournament.

LOCKPORT — Salamanca placed six wrestlers in the championship finals to become the first team to win this tournament two years in a row. It also gained some revenge against runnerup Maple Grove, the only team to beat it in dual-meet competition this season.

Ron Leder (17-0) at 145, Carl Muzi (14-3) at 177 and Ed Eberle (17-1) at 215 won individual championships for Salamanca, while Mark Sweich (5-1) at 98, Dave Givens at 105 and Joe Mohr at 132 were second.

FRANKLINVILLE — Chris Fuller (7-4 record) at 145, Dave Ahl (9-2) at 177 and Frank Dean (11-3) at 215 won titles to lead Oswayo Valley High School to the team title in the Franklinville Wrestling Tournament.

Overall, Oswayo Valley had nine place-winners while third-place Randolph was next with eight.

Fifth-place Allegany matched Oswayo's three-man championship list by getting titles from 91-pounder Tom Norton 5-4, 112-pounder Ray Ryan (11-3) and super-heavyweight Jack Peck (13-3).

Among the other champions were Randolph's Bill Young (13-0), Cattaraugus' Shawn Booth (11-4), Olean Walsh's Eric D'Arcy (11-3) and Rob Klucik (15-2).

Warsaw's 119-pounder Jeff Royce (7-0), with a pin in 1:47 over Randolph's Scott Gardner in the finals, was named the tournaments' Most Outstanding Wrestler. Pine Valley's 167-pounder Kip Gross (13-0) was recognized for having the most pins (three) in the least combined time (5:05).
