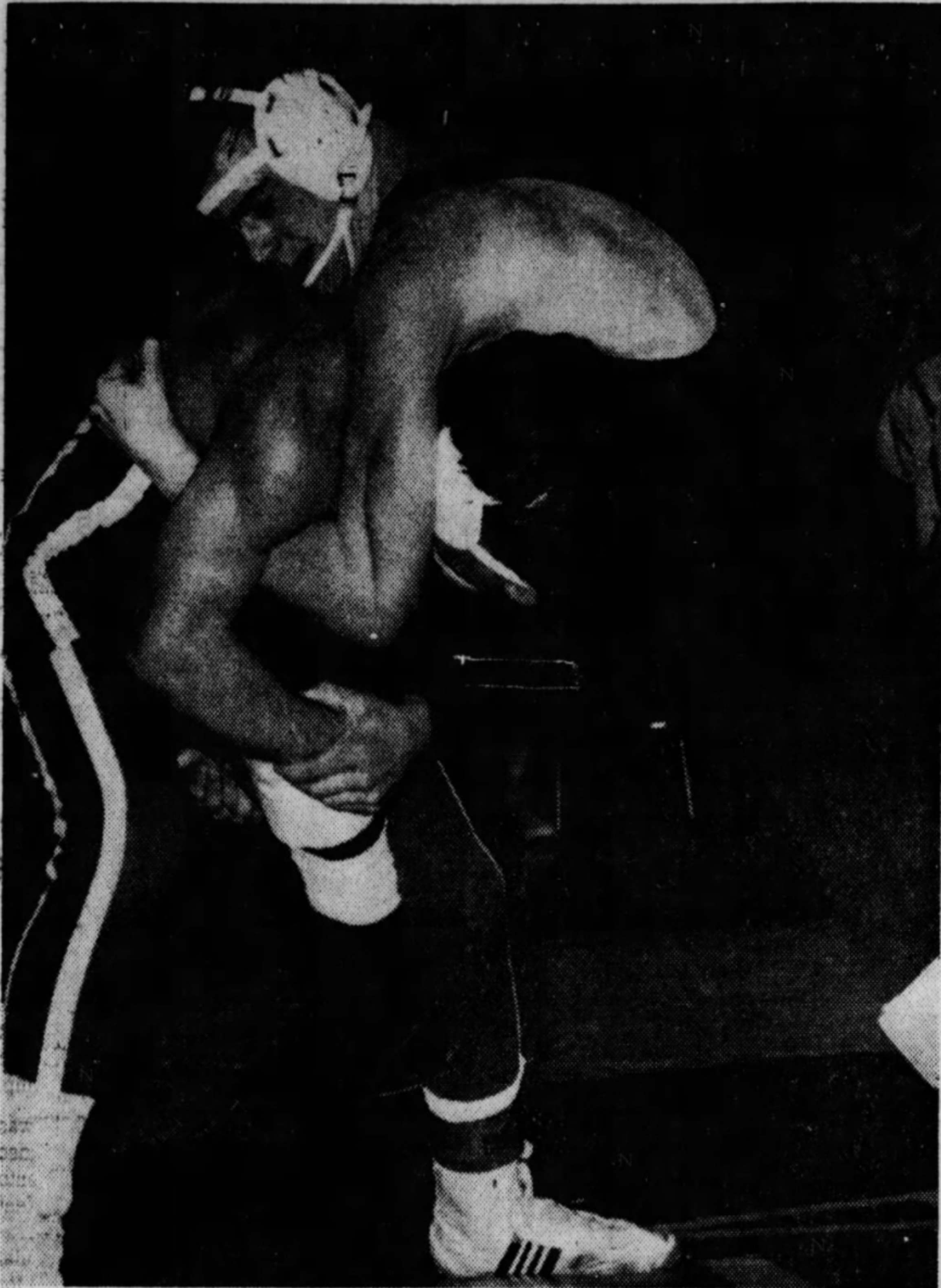


Laboy Mat Winner

John Laboy of Edison defeated Joe Johnson of West in the 119-pound match to highlight the finals of the 25th Annual City of Rochester Interscholastic wrestling tournament last night at East High.

Laboy, 13-0 this season, decided Johnson 10-4, in a battle of defending champions. Johnson won the 105-pound title and Laboy won the outstanding wrestler award.

The match itself was tight through the first two periods. Laboy led 2-1 at the end of the first period and 5-3 at the end of the second period.

In the final period he applied pressure and expanded a 6-5 lead to a 10-4 lead with 45 seconds left. Two takedowns iced the win.

Martin Cangialosi of Jefferson scored a comeback victory in the 155-pound match. Cangialosi, first-seeded in the 155-pound division, defeated John Lawson, 11-1 of Edison. Cangialosi is defending 145-pound champion but moved up one class this year.

Tom Rossi of Jefferson upped his record to 14-0-0 with an overtime win over Jerry Rogers in the 167 pound match. This match was the only one to go overtime in this year's finals.

Dwight Wilcox, last year's 165-pound champion looked overpowering as he won the 177-pound bout over determined Randy Kramen of Edison. Wilcox controlled his opponent throughout the match but Kramen never quit.
