Two East High Grapplers Capture Titles in Scholastic Meet at Monroe High

Tech High grapplers featured the final round of the city high school individual wrestling tournament yesterday afternoon at the Monroe High gymnasium, three wearers of the maroon and gray winning titles in their respective classes. Two wrestlers from East High also won championships, while one man from each Monroe, West, John Marshall and Charlotte were able to win gold medals.

MECHANICS QUINT TO MEET ALUMNI

Ryan Boxing Instructor of Auburn Athletic Club

Auburn, March 23. — William "Spider" Ryan, Auburn's favorite fly-weight boxer, is once more in the public eye here, having accepted the job of boxing instructor for the Auburn Athletic Club, which has opened a gymnasium over the century-old Brister mill in Genesee street. As a side partner of Ryan, Johnny Burke, another of the best fighters this city has ever turned out, is coaching club members in the manly art.

Starting Friday night, the club expects to put on weekly exhibition bouts at the gym to stimulate greater interest in boxing as a means of self defense and physical conditioning.

The feature match of the day showed Williams, Monroe, and Felli, West, in action in the 175-pound event. Williams retained his title as champion after 15 minutes of the fiercest kind of giving. Williams had Felli in a bad way near the end of the match, but the West High entry managed to slip off the mat.

Feary, Tech 135-pounder, and Holloway, Charlotte staged a merry scrap in that event, with Holloway winning the decision after 9 minutes. Feary won the championship of the class last season.

The only fall of the day came in the 118-pound scrap when Pressburg, East, threw A. Bates, West, after 6 minutes, 48 seconds had elapsed. The bout was fairly even until the end came.

Aggressiveness enabled Charles DeCarlo, who wrestles in the 126-pound class for Tech, to get the judges decision over Sam Rosenthal, Monroe after 9 minutes. Rosenthal was on the defensive all through the battle.

A good deal of humor was injected into the meet when "Packey" MacFarland, Monroe, and Matakie, East, met in the unlimited affair. Matakie, who was allowed to enter the meet at the last minute, won the decision after 9 minutes of flopping and floundering.

A crowd of about 200 witnessed the affair, which was held under the direction of Albert Makin. All the winners will receive gold medals, with the losers getting silver medals. Summaries:

SCHOOL WRESTLERS IN FINALS TO-DAY

Five Monroe Men Survive Semi-final Round

★ Five wrestlers from Monroe High, four from Tech, three from West, two each from Charlotte and Marshall and one from East High survived the semi-final round of the local high school individual tournament at East High School yesterday afternoon and will enter the final round, to be held at the Monroe High gymnasium this afternoon starting at 3:30 o'clock. The small East gym was packed for the exhibitions yesterday.

Sammy Rosenthal, Monroe 126-pounder, sprung the surprise of the tourney yesterday when he eliminated Shapiro, East, after 10 minutes of furious grappling. Rosenthal, who is the "dark horse" of the meet, will meet DeCarlo, Tech, for the championship of the class this afternoon.

The feature match of the finals this afternoon is expected to come when Williams, last year's 175-pound class champion, who wrestles for Monroe, and Felli, West, who won the title in the 160-pound division a year back, come together in the heavyweight event. Both men won their matches yesterday in easy fashion, Williams downing Rogers, Tech, after six minutes and Felli beating Dankoff, East, also after six minutes.

Steljes Wins Three Matches

Steljes, last season's champion in the 147-pound event, won three matches yesterday. He will meet Seibert, Monroe, in an attempt to retain his title in that class to-day.

Selkirk, Tech, and Sandholzer, Charlotte, are also expected to produce plenty of fireworks when they meet in the 160-pound final. Selkirk downed his team-mate, Zimmer, after 1 minute, 25 seconds yesterday, while Sandholzer took the measure of Aronowitz, East, after 10 fast minutes. Summaries:

VETERANS WIN IN MAT COMPETITION

Semi-final Round of High School Tourney To-day

★ All of the veteran wrestlers came through in the preliminary rounds of the local public high school individual grappling meet, which was run off at the East High gymnasium yesterday afternoon. The semi-finals will start this afternoon at the East-side institution, with the finals to come off to-morrow afternoon.

Sammy Rosenthal, Monroe 126-pounder, showed good form in his victory over Doyle, Tech, after 5 minutes, 55 seconds of fast and furious grappling. Rosenthal was the aggressor all through the bout and had his adversary in several tight places before the end came. Sol Saperstone, also from Monroe, who usually wrestles in the 112-pound event, sprung a surprise wrestling bout of his class, when he defeated Moore, John Marshall 118-pounder, after 6 minutes.

Feary, Tech 135-pound grappler, had an easy time in downing Sargeant, Monroe. Sargeant was forced to give up after about 4 minutes. Robinson, 112-pounder for Tech, made short work of his fellow team-mate, White, downing him after 2 minutes, 14 seconds.

Harold Hendricks, Monroe 105-class man, who has not been defeated all season, was not allowed to enter his event because he "boiled down" in an effort to get down to weight. There is no rule against this form of losing weight and why Elmer K. Smith, director of the meet, disqualified him is a question. Hendricks will compete in the 112-pound class. He drew a bye yesterday.

Sam Paul, East High grappler in the 105-pound class, staked a merry battle with Fitelson, of the same team, Fitelson getting the decision of the judges after six furious minutes. Summaries:
