#### Two Bi-County champs

Alfred-Almond and Belmont each came up with two champion wrestlers at the Bi-County (Allegheny-Steuben) wrestling matches held at Canisteo Tuesday night.

Allegheny County won five of the 12 matches, which according to Coach Bill McAlee of Alfred-Almond, is the best showing that Allegheny County has ever made against Steuben County competition.

For Alfred-Almond, Larry Cornell in the 115 pound class, and a former Sectional Champion in a lighter weight class, decisioned Herbert (Campbell) 4-3, in what Coach McAlee said was a "really tight match."

Dave Davies in the 123 pound class, a newcomer to the Alfred-Almond squad this year, decisioned Blanchard of Avoca, 4-2.

#### Four didn't make it

The other four members of the A-A County Champions didn't fare as well: Ron Cornell lost to Stone of Campbell, 10-6; Jim Ninos was pinned by Tatro of Savona at 5:30; John Barron was pinned by Hotelling of Addison at 3:37; and John Hurne was pinned by Gunn of Canisteo at :33.

#### Other Allegheny wins

Chalmers Wolcott of Fillmore in the 168 pound class pinned McKee of Canisteo at :49. Swarthout (heavyweight) of Belmont pinned Cleveland of Campbell at 2:15; and Cooper of Belmont decisioned Buck of Campbell, 4-0.

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## Tops in County

Alfred-Almond's wrestlers, the top team in the county for two seasons, showed why Saturday in the county wrestling tournament at Cuba as they dominated the action most of the way.

In the total competition at night, following two afternoon sessions, the Eagle matmen of Coach Bill McAlee captured half of the championships and had competitors in 10 of the 12 classes.

A-A won the first four final-round matches with Ron Cornell (98) Jim Ninos (106), Larry Cornell (115), and Dave Davies (123) posting pin wins in the first and fourth matches and decisions victories in the other two.

John Davis of A-A, who has been out part of the season due to illness, lost an 11-7 decision to Joel Vanik of Cuba in the 130 class.

The Eagles' Bill Dobson was edged by Brad Cooper of Belmont 6-3 in overtime.

John Barron and John Hurne took the other two championships in the 141 and 183 pound classes.

In one of the upsets of the tourney, Cuba's John Lawton pinned A-A's John Woodruff with just eight seconds left in the match. Woodruff had defeated
