STATE UNIVERSITY HIKES FEES

Undergraduate tuition for the State University of New York should be raised \$150 next fall, the executive committee of the university board of trustees recommended Wednesday.

The hike would bring in an estimated \$20.4 million, the committee said. The extra income would be used to restore some of the cuts in faculty, staff, equipment and services proposed

Undergraduate tuition for New York state residents would leap to \$1,050 a

year under the plan, while tuition for graduate, law and pharmacy schools would go up \$300, to \$2,500. Medical school tuition would go up \$1,000, to \$4,300.

The trustees voted last month to raise SUNY dormitory fees \$150 next fall, to \$1,100 a year.

Tuition for SUNY freshmen and sophomores was raised by \$150 in the fall of 1979 to conform to the \$900 fee for juniors and seniors.
