Rutgers Team Dethroned As Allentown Squad Scores In Seven of Eight Divisions

Muhlenberg College dethroned Rutgers University as Middle Atlantic College Wrestling Association champions last night at the Haverford College gym, walking off with the crown for the first time after four unsuccessful attempts.

Scoring in seven of the eight divisions, the Allentown team, coached by Carl Frankett, posted a winning total of 32 points. Rutgers with three individual champions failed to count sufficiently

in the second and third place finishes and had to be satisfied with second-place honors with 25 points.

HAVERFORD SHARES 3D

Gettysburg and Haverford each collected 11 points to share third place, followed by Ursinus with 10, Lafayette, 7 and Swarthmore (a new entry in the title tourney this year), last with 3.

Although Warren Nafis, 128pounder, was the only Muhlenberg matman to gain an individual crown, the "Mules" scored heavily in second place finishes with six and registered nine fall triumphs to compile their winning total.

PATERNO WINS EVENT

Rutgers' three champions were. Santo Paterno, in the 145-pound division; Vince Murray, who retained his title in the 165-pound class and Bel Riger, in the unlimited group.

Blackburn Joslin, Haverford's 121pounder, also defended his 121pound crown, scoring a fall over Swarthmore's Bill Huston in 3.55 in the final round.

An unfortunate ankle injury sustained by Haverford's Charley Rose after 1.40 of wrestling caused him to devault in the final round to Murray. Joslin and Murray were the only last year's title winners on hand to defend their crowns.

URSINUS STAR CROWNED

Other champions crowned were Dick Schellhase, Ursinus, a 7-5 decision winner over Muhlenberg's W. C. Evans in the 136-pound final; Al Hart, Gettysburg, who rallied to defeat Rutgers' Ben Ford 7-6 in the 155-pound division, and Bob Gibson, Lafayette, easy 6-2 victor over Muhlenberg's W. T. Evans in the 175pound class.

Schellhase, who performed brilliantly throughout the two-day meet, was voted most outstanding in the tournament and awarded a trophy.

The big upset of the eight annual meet occurred in the semi-final round yesterday afternoon when Swarthmore's Don Kelley, former P. I. A. District 1 champion at Cheltenham High, had his shoulders pinned to the mat for the first time in three years of competition.
