It could be said that James A. Beichner was born to wrestle and coach. He burst on the scene in the late 1970's, wrestling for Cassadaga Valley H S, in NY State Section VI. Jim quickly distinguished himself as an exceptional athlete. With an overall four year record of 130 -18 -1, he placed three times in the NY State High School Wrestling Championships [5th, 4th, 6 2nd]. As one would suspect, Jim Beichner became a highly recruited wrestler during his senior year. When the "dust settled," He chose to attend Clarion University and grapple for hall of fame coach Bob Bubb. JIm went on to have a terrific wrestling career at Clarion. He won 125 matches. In doing so, he won four Pennsylvania State Conference Championships and was voted OW in 1986, won the Eastern Wrestling League Championships in 1984 and 1985, was a two-time (1984 & 1985) NCAA Div. I All American, at 190 lbs. (5th 6 6th), was captain of the only Clarion wrestling team in history to complete an undefeated dual meet season at 17-0. In addition, the team was ranked as high as third in the NCAA Div. I NWCA East vs West All Star Classic in 1985 and 1986.

Mr.Beichner began his wrestling coaching career in 1986 when he assumed an assistants position at his alma mater, Clarion University. The following year, Jim accepted a job as assistant wrestling coach at the University of Pittsburgh. He remained in this position for seven years. During this period, Pitt produced several wrestling All Americans and enjoyed seven straight winning seasons. It was not long before Jim became highly sought after by colleges and universities looking for a good head wrestling coach. Not surprisingly, Mr. Beichner accepted the head wrestling coaching position at the University at Buffalo (UB) in 1995. Jim quickly went to work building the foundation for a wrestling program that would be recognized and respected nationally.


Jim Beichner accomplished a great deal during his 18 years at UB, both on and off the mat. He was named Rookie Coach of the Year by Amateur Wrestling News (1996), twice voted NY State Collegiate Wrestling Coach of the Year (1995 & 2004), East Coast Conference Coach of the Year (1996), Mid-American Conference Coach of the year (2011), served as president of the of the NY State College Wrestling Coaches Association (2000 - 2001) and the National Wrestling Coaches Association (2008 - 2010). In addition, his teams won two NY State Collegiate Championships (2003 & 2009), won the Binghamton Dual Meet Tournament (2000) and the Bloomsburg Invitational (2000 & 2001). Also, Jim gave UB it's first in history NCAA Div. I wrestling All American, Kyle Cerminara, 8th at 190 lbs. (2004).

Mr. Beichner's positive impact was not only experienced by the UB Athletic Department but was also felt by those who live in the greater Western NY community. His work in the community included co-founding an annual fund-raising event called Takedown Cancer that raised over \$98,000 for Carly's Club of Roswell Park Cancer Hospital (2009 - 2013). In addition, Coach Beichner and his wrestlers spent a great deal of time interacting with cancer patients at Roswell Park. The local media outlets gave a great deal of coverage for the good deeds Jim and his wrestlers were doing on behalf of others. Mr Beichner also led several other local fund-raising initiatives for individuals and families in need. Because of their efforts, the UB wrestling program was viewed by others with a great deal of respect and admiration.

2013 saw Jim accept a job as Director of Athletics for Team Penske Auto Racing. A hands-on supervisor, he managed the efforts of eight professional fitness coaches and staff members. Over a nine-year period, Jim Beichner trained pit crews have been chosen as the Top Pit Crew ten times in races that include the: INDY 500, Daytona 500, Brickyard 400, Monster Energy Cup and the X finite Owners Championship. The Penske Team has won these races multiple times as well as others. It seems obvious that Mr. Beichner's presence has been impactful on the success of Penske Auto Racing.

Jim has been a loving father. A parent of three adult children, his two sons, Jacob and Sam, wrestled in high school [Williamsville East], with Jacob making it to the States and wrestling for Cortland in college. Daughter Grace excelled in high school soccer at Williamsville East as well. Recently becoming a grandfather, Mr. Beichner lives in Salisbury NC with his wife Delaney.

Bill Doran was a stand-out runner at North Syracuse Central High School, holding a school record in the intermediate hurdles for many years. But during his freshman year, he was "encouraged" to join his high school's wrestling team when two of his best friends – then members of the team – began a habit of kidnapping him after track practice, tossing him in the showers and refusing to let him exit unless and until he acquiesced to their demands that he join them in the wrestling room.

The extortion worked.

Bill's wrestling journey officially began after he was "persuaded' by the same two pals to attend a Lake George wrestling camp in the summer of 1973.

Bill went on to wrestle three years on the varsity for North Syracuse, then known as the Northmen (before that high school recombined with Cicero High to form the C-NS NorthStars). He graduated in 1976 as a tri-captain of the wrestling team - together with those same two friends.

Bill continued his wrestling career with two years at Morrisville Community College and completed his run as a participant for Region 5 in the 1979 Empire Games. During the early 1980's, he became the first North Area Wrestling Club Coach, a program which drew hundreds of youth wrestlers from North Syracuse, Cicero and Liverpool, many of whom went on to enjoy highly successful high school wrestling careers.

At this time, Ron Roch, Bill's high school wrestling coach and friend Gene ("Butch") Meyle both suggested that Bill consider joining the Syracuse Wrestling Officials Association (SWOA) and the Eastern Intercollegiate Wrestling Officials Association (EIWOA). Doran ended up officiating for both associations for more than forty-three years and, during his time with SWOA, served that organization variously as president, vice-president, member-at-large and rules interpreter.

Bill was selected many times to officiate the class tournaments, sectional finals and the Dual Meet Finals. He was also chosen to officiate the New York State Championships four times and was ranked as that tournament's top official in 1999 – an outstanding achievement.

As a college official, Doran officiated no fewer than five national championships. Major highlights of his officiating career included being selected to officiate a Division 1 tournament, three Division 2 and one Division 3 tournaments. In addition, during his officiating career, Bill worked seventeen Division 1 national qualifying tournaments, thirty-five Division 3 qualifying tournaments, two Division 2 qualifying tournaments and twenty-eight New York State college championship tournaments.

Bill was also selected to officiate the first ever collegiate wrestling matches held at Madison Square Garden for the Beat the Streets' "Grapple at The Garden" dual between Cornell University and Oklahoma State. He was an active member of the EIWOA Executive Board for fifteen years and the assignor for the New York State SUNY schools and Ithaca College wrestling teams.

In 2022, Bill capped his officiating career by being chosen for induction into the Hall of Fame for both the Eastern Intercollegiate Wrestling Officials Association and Section III Wrestling. He continues to remain involved in our sport as the SWOA rules interpreter, organizing training programs for new officials and as assessor for the New York State weight certifications.

Bill's professional career included working as a business analyst for the Kimberly-Clark Corporation for nearly thirty years. During his spare time, he enjoys golfing. Bill currently serves as vice-president on the Kanon Valley Golf Course Executive Board.

Bill states his involvement in officiating would not have been possible without the love, support and understanding of Roxanne (Rocky), his wife of over thirty years, his son Nicholas, a Federal Bank Examiner for the United States Treasury and his daughter Jessica (ex-wrestling score keeper), a physical therapist assistant for SOS and personal trainer. And, of course, without the "encouragement" associated with being tossed in the showers by his North Syracuse High School buddies.

Congratulations Philip "Red" Fedele on receiving the Outstanding American Award from the National Wrestling Hall of Fame

From your friends and fellow Kiwanians we are extremely proud of your accomplishments!





Philip "Red" Fedele started wrestling in a very interesting manner. Red was a very good athlete and actually played basketball as a freshman but beginning his sophomore year at Madison High School in the Rochester City School system. The basketball coaches decided Red's playing days were limited (he was only 5 feet tall) and wrestling coach "Bozo" Snider asked Red to give wrestling a try; however, at first Red was not excited about the sport. Eventually he started to enjoy the sport and became the starter at the 95-pound weight class. In the 1950's the Rochester City Schools were the dominant league in most of the sports in the section. In his first year of wrestling Red was already excelling and was able to win the prestigious Rochester City League championships in 1954. This achievement qualified Red for the Section V tournament where he was a finalist. Red would go on to win two more city championships and 2 Section V championships as well. Fedele gives Coach John Spencer, another Hall of Famer, credit for his development as a wrestler. Additionally, he indicated that his Madison High team had a great group of guys who to this day still meet every month at his restaurant to reminisce about the "old days." Some of those teammates include Frank Marotta and Lou Fusilli. To advocate for the sport Red had provided a space on the walls of his restaurant to commemorate Section V wrestling and the Section V Wrestling Hall of Fame.

After high school Red secured a job working at Xerox and had a very successful career. However, after his retirement he decided to venture off to develop another business of his own. Thus, the Red Fedele's Brook House Restaurant was born. Red had no previous restaurant experience but he believed in himself and was determined to make a go of it. Red stated that the sport of wrestling helped him in his business in many ways. The life lessons of perseverance, never giving up, and having courage enabled him to establish a thriving business. And this business has now become a family centered enterprise that a few generations of Fedeles work and love. Well into his 80's Red still plays a very active role in the business – he welcomes guests and makes his way around the restaurant chatting with the patrons to check to make sure everything is satisfactory.

Furthermore, Red has taken a very active role in his community giving back in many ways. In 1972 Red was the leader of the City of Rochester Narcotic and Guidance Council which reached out to individuals who needed help with addiction problems. Red is a "Paul Harris Fellow" which is the highest form of recognition a Rotary Club can bestow on a member. Accordingly, Mr. Fedele has been awarded the George Hixson Award from the local Kiwanis Club for his work with its Children's Fund. Red received the Youth Advocate of the Year Award, the Spirit of Chamber of Commerce Award which is presented to an individual who has volunteered and made business contributions to the betterment of their community. His annual Brook House golf tournament has generated a significant amount of money that goes out to families in need of assistance ... another example of his generosity and giving back motto that he represents. His family also has been the recognized with the Family of the Year Award for community service by the Greece Central School. It is easy to ascertain that Red and his family are advocates for their community and the children in it.

Additionally, Red has received the Greece Business Man of the Year Award, Greece Beautification Award, the Citizen of the Year Award from the Civic League and numerous other awards. Consequently, he has been inducted in several area Hall of Fames ... including Section V Wrestling Hall of Fame, City-Catholic Wrestling Hall of Fame, the Italian Sports Hall of Fame of Rochester and was the recipient of the Terry Justice Award for his many contributions to wrestling in Section V.

His teammate and close friend Frank Marotta states, "Words cannot describe the impact this man has had on and continues to have on so many. He is truly an outstanding person and an Outstanding American." For these and many more reasons the Upstate New York Chapter of the National Wrestling Hall of Fame proudly award our Outstanding American Award to Philip "Red" Fedele.



2024 National Wrestling Hall of Fame Inductee Lifetime Service Award

Mike Frood

Mike Frood had wrestling in his blood and was destined to be a wrestler and coach. His father, Sheppard, encouraged Mike to wrestle as a young boy. His father had wrestled on the first team at East Hampton High School in the 1930's which was coached then by the legendary coach, Frank "Sprig" Gardner. Sprig would later become the celebrated coach of Mepham High School and a Distinguish Member of the NWHOF.

Following a stellar high school career at East Hampton High School on Long Island, Mike would attend Cortland State and wrestle for Vince Gonino. During his student teaching Mike would teach and coach at Mynderse Academy in Section V and begin to develop his talents as a high school coach. In 1977, he became the high school wrestling coach for Jordan-Elbridge and would guide the Eagles to a 144 - 22 record in Section III. Coach Frood achievements at Jordan-Elbridge are many and included 10 league tournament championships and six Section III Class C Championships. Additionally, the Eagles were runner-ups two time under the mentorship of Frood and he would coach 12 Section III champions who went on to represent JE in the NYSPHSAA Championships. Furthermore, Coach Frood would guide fifty-eight wrestlers to individual League Championships and forty-one Section III Class C individual championships. Perhaps the highlight of his coaching career was in 1986 when his Jordan-Elbridge team would be ranked number 8th in the state and finish second in the sectional tournament. This team tied a Section III record by having four sectional champions and three of those wrestlers would finish 2nd, 3rd and 4th in the state tournament at the Onondaga Memorial Arena. Coach Frood is quick to point out that he had surrounded himself with three very good coaches who helped pilot the Eagles to success. He referred to them as the 3 "w"s. The first "w" was Ken Wilson, a Jordan Elbridge graduate and a standout All-American wrestler at Syracuse University, who served as his assistant coach; the second "w" was Allen Webster, who coached the junior high team and the third "w" was Lonnie Warner, who helped to individualized the instruction. In addition, Mike would also coach two other sports besides wrestling at Jordan-Elbridge football and lacrosse.

Coach Frood stated that, "the sport of wrestling teaches hard work and how to deal with adversity in one's life. And never giving up notwithstanding of the situation."

Not only was Frood an outstanding coach but he also was an exceptional wrestling official. Mike would work as an official for 28 years for the Syracuse Wrestling Officials Association. He would officiate eleven Section III Finals tournaments and twelve Sectional Class events. During his illustrious career officiating Frood would be selected to officiate in three NYSPHSAA tourneys as well as act as the Vice President of the Syracuse group. Upstate New York Chapter's Hall of Famer, Fred Brown, stated this about Coach Frood, "Mike was an exceptional coach and steered his small school, Jordan-Elbridge, to many league titles. He certainly was not afraid to grapple with any school regardless of their size. His teams wrestled tough and fought to the very last whistle irrespective of the score. After he finished his career as a coach he became an excellent official and held every office in the Syracuse Wrestling Officials Association except the treasurer/ secretary position. Furthermore, Mike has given back much to his school and community. This is demonstrated by the fact that Mike still works as a coach for both wrestling and lacrosse. Section III should be honored to have such dedicated people in the section."

Mike and his wife, Joan, live in Elbridge and are the proud parents of two sons, Brett and Jared.

The Upstate New York Chapter of the National Wrestling Hall of Fame is extremely proud and privileged to induct Mike into its Hall of Fame. Mike's picture and bio will be enshrined in the Chapter Room of the National Wrestling Museum in Stillwater, Oklahoma.



Len Gadway started his wrestling career in the 5th grade when his physical education teacher, Stan Riggs, presented a unit on wrestling. This was the beginning of Len's love and passion for the sport. Stan Riggs would go on to be a Hall of Fame coach for Peru High School and Len will join his mentor and coach into the National Wrestling Hall of Fame today. In high school Len would win two Section VII sectional titles for the Peru Indians. In 1973 Gadway won the 155 pound title and then in 1975 Len would repeat his sectional title at the 167 pound class. Len would travel on to Syracuse to represent the section in the NYSPHSAA wrestling championship and become the first Peru and Section VII wrestler to finish in the runner-up position on the podium. Len pinned his way to the championship match but would be defeated by Chris Lawson from Section VI.

Len credits Coach Riggs for his development as a wrestler but also gives an enormous amount of credit to Jack Hogan, father of another Hall of Famer Mike Hogan, for all that he did for him in wrestling. Len stated, "Jack Hogan carted us (Mike Hogan and Len) around the state to wrestling events and was very instrumental in my development as a wrestler and person. I owe him a huge amount for his effort and generosity."

Following his high school wrestling career, Len would journey to Northern Adirondack High School, one of Peru's biggest rivals in the Champlain Valley Athletic Conference, to become an assistant coach. Coach Gadway would remain there until 1982 when he started his head coaching position at Beekmantown. Coach Gadway's forty some year career at Beekmantown is something to be very proud of. Gadway has won 482 dual meets at this time and still counting ... it is not sure when Len will end this remarkable run as a coach. During this period of time, Len's Beekmantown teams have won seven Section VII team championships (1985, 86 and 2004,05,06,08 and 2009) as well as six Champlain Valley Athletic Conference championships. In addition, Coach Gadway has been named the Coach of the Year five times during his illustrious career with the Eagles. One of the biggest honors that Len has had is the coaching of his son, Chris, to three Section VII titles in 1999, 2000 and 2001. And in 1999, Len had his two sons, Lee and Chris, win a Section VII title and wrestle in the New York State Championships together. Further, Coach Gadway has coached many individual wrestlers to championships including Hayden Head to a state title in 2012 and Jason Lapham during his career at Beekmantown finished 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th. He has coached 142 Section VII individual champions and numerous other sectional place winners, too numerous to mention.

Furthermore, Chris Gadway, son of Coach Gadway, had this to say about his father, "It isn't always about winning and losing for my father. It is how you won and lost that was important to him. My father stressed that his success as a coach was not what happens on the mat but off the mat. Dad is highly respected in the Section VII wrestling community for his success and the way that he conducts himself and his squads."

Len has indicated that some of the life lessons that he attempts to teach his student/athletes are the same ones that Coach Riggs conveyed to him at Peru. Those lessons include a wrestler should never quit and that hard work and self-confidence will enable a wrestler to achieve anything that they strive to do. Jason Cook, one of Len's former wrestlers, stated this about Coach Gadway, "He was old school and would push all his athletes to do their best. But he would make sure that all his wrestlers were taken care. He would give them money to eat with at tournaments, make sure that they had rides home after practices and contests. And would provide the wrestlers with off season practices and competitions to help them get better at the sport. I feel privileged and honored to have wrestled for Len Gadway."

Len Gadway has given over 40 years of commitment and service to the sport of wrestling. And for this dedication the Upstate New York Chapter is honored to enshrine him into the Upstate New York Chapters Hall of Fame now and forever. Congratulation Len!

2024 National Wrestling Hall of Fame Inductee Lifetime Service Award

Mike Howard

After his 34th season as the head wrestling coach at SUNY Oswego, Mike Howard will be inducted into the Upstate New York Chapter of the National Wrestling Hall of Fame for his lifetime service to wrestling on September 29, 2024 at the Double Tree Hotel in East Syracuse.

Mike started his wrestling career on the mats at Oswego State where his father Jim Howard was coaching the Lakers. Jim would later be inducted into the Chapter's Hall of Fame in 1997 following a stellar career of coaching. During Mike's high school wrestling career, one of his highlights was when he won the first Section III title that Oswego High School ever had. While at Oswego High School Mike wrestled under the guidance of Elmer Akley, another Hall of Famer, who later would become his father-in law. In addition, Mike won many local scholastic high school tournaments and was highly regarded by many excellent collegiate programs.

Howard began his collegiate wrestling career with the University of Buffalo, and wrestled there from 1981-1983 before transferring to SUNY Oswego where he wrestled from 1984-1986. During his time with the Lakers, Howard wrestled in the 167-pound weight class and was a two-time co-captain.

After spending three seasons as the assistant wrestling coach for the Lakers Howard was hired by SUNY Oswego in 1989 to be the associate head coach with the Oswego State wrestling program. Howard and the Lakers has had a lot of success from the start, making 20 straight team NCAA championship appearances from 1990-2009 and 27 appearances total throughout his tenure. During this time, he has had 72 NCAA championship individual qualifiers.

Howard has been named Empire Collegiate Wrestling Conference (ECWC) coach of the year on two separate occasions, once in 1996 and again in 2001.

The wrestlers he has coached over the years have racked up a high number of accolades under his command. He has had 22 individuals earn All-America honors, 26 conference champions, and 199 conference place winners. Five of his wrestlers have been honored as the Conference Most Outstanding Wrestler and two have earned Conference Rookie/ Freshman of the Year awards. Eight individuals have won the New York State Collegiate Championships with 130 total NYS place winners. Since 2013 when the NCAA created regional competition in the sport of wrestling, he has coached three regional champions and 34 regional place winners. Twenty-eight of his wrestlers have been named to the National Wrestling Coaches Association Division III Scholar All-America team. Mike Howard has certainly carried on the torch for the Howard family at SUNY Oswego.

Furthermore, Mike has been a very successful coach of golf at Oswego State. In 2019 and 2022, Howard was selected as the Empire 8 Conference Coach of the Year. During his 28 years at the helm of the Lakers golf team, his team has won numerous championships to add to his remarkable coaching resume.

During his tenure Howard has also served as the Chair of the NWCA Division III Ranking Committee and served multiple years on the NCAA Championship Seeding Committee. In 2022, Coach Mike Howard was recognized by the SUNY Oswego Alumni Association with the Oswego Impact Award, which is given to an individual who has made outstanding contributions to the college and the students. A very fitting award to such a deserving coach and leader.

For all that Mike Howard has accomplished in collegiate athletics, the Upstate New York Chapter of the National Wrestling Hall of Fame is pleased to enshrine him into the State Chapter Room of the Hall of Fame and Museum in Stillwater, Oklahoma



Bill Hadsell came from a family of seven boys and wrestling was a way of life for the Hadsell family with all the boys wrestling. His brother Dick was a member of the first Section V team representing the section at the NYSPHSAA championships in 1968. Additionally, brother Bruce was a New York State Champion in 1973 and brother Robert finished 3rd in 1973 and 6th in 1976. Bill would place 4th in the 1980 state championship for Canandaigua Academy and all the boys wrestled for legendary Coach Weldon Canough. While in high school Bill served as the team captain for the Braves, who were Section V team champions in 1977, 1978, 1979 and 1980, and he was selected as the Most Valuable Wrestler for Canandaigua in his senior year.

Bill would start his collegiate career at the University of Buffalo for Hall of Fame Coach Ed Michael in 1980-81. Then finish up his college wrestling career grappling for another Hall of Fame coach, John Murray, and the Ithaca Bombers. His 1989 and 1990 Ithaca College teams were Division III NCAA champions and in 1991 Bill would become an All-American for the Bombers finishing eighth in the 190 pound weight class. Furthermore, he was selected the Most Outstanding Wrestler and served as the captain of the squad.

Coach Hadsell started his coaching career in the Geneva City School system in 1993. He served as the coach at Geneva from 1993 to 2009 and during his tenure there he was named the 1996 Section V Coach of the Year. In addition, Coach Hadsell guided his first state champion, Bill Payne, to the 155 pound championship for the Panthers. Bill would later coach Owen and Craig Scott to state championships at Pal Mac in 2011. In his illustrious coaching career, he has coached 12 NYSPHSAA place winners including five finalists. On the sectional level Hadsell has coached 34 class champions as well as numerous champions of local wrestling tournaments. As result of his distinguished career as a wrestler and coach, Bill has been selected to the Canandaigua Academy Athletic Hall of Fame, the Geneva Sports Hall of Fame and last year he entered the Section V Wrestling Hall of Fame. Coach Hadsell has also coached girls' soccer, girls' and boys' tennis. Recently he has guided the Fishback brothers, Ryan and Drew, to inspiring finishes in the NYSPHSAA Tennis Championships – Ryan finished 1st in 2019 and 4th, and Drew placed 3rd last year as a sophomore. This year Bill guided Drew to the NYSPHSAA Championship at USTA National Tennis Center in Flushing Meadows, the home of the US Tennis Open. Hadsell has truly made an impressive impact as a coach at many sports and levels.

On the administrative level of the sport, Bill has served as the Finger Lakes League Chairman and the Section V Class chairman for 10 years where he established an extraordinary record. His work as a class chairperson enabled him to make a seamless transition into the role of the New York Public High School Athletic Association's Section V Wrestling Coordinator. There he has established himself as a highly respected and esteemed coordinator. Kathy Hoyt, Executive Director of Section V, stated that "his positive rapport with all – athletes, coaches, officials, assignors, committee members and administrators is exceptional." And "all sectional tournaments are run efficiently and effectively each year." Bill record is impeccable!

Bill has indicated that he owes a great deal to his high school coach Weldon Canough and his collegiate college John Murray. These men were very instrumental in his development as both a wrestler and person. In addition, he gives credit to all his brothers but especially Bruce, who helped with his growth and maturity. He feels that the most important life lesson that wrestling teaches is that of "taking responsibility for yourself."

The Upstate New York Chapter of the NWHOF is privileged and proud to welcome William Hadsell into their Hall of Fame for all that he has done for wrestling in his section and state.



Carl Koenig

Carl Koenig's years of commitment and dedication to the sport of Wrestling epitomizes his numerous accomplishments in our great sport.

Carl has left an indelible mark on the mats as a wrestler, coach, official and President of the Upstate New York Chapter of the National Wrestling Hall of Fame.

On the wrestling front, Carl's achievements are equally noteworthy. Carl wrestled three seasons collegiately at Oswego State from 1965 to 1968 and then started coaching in 1969. He coached Oxford HS in Section 4 to an undefeated mark in the 1973-74 season in addition to coaching 3 Class Sectional championship teams. After his retirement from coaching, Carl started officiating wrestling in both the high school and college levels. Carl's excellence as an official led him to officiate elite events such as 13 appearances in the EIWA College Wrestling championships, many NYS Collegiate Championships, SUNY Conference, Junior College and NCAA Division III Championships. At the high school level Carl officiated every Section 4 Tournament Championships from 1974 to 2010. Carl is a member of both the Section 4 and EIWOA Halls of Fame.

Beyond his personal accomplishments, Carl's dedication to Wrestling is absolutely remarkable. Carl formerly served on numerous boards that included President and Vice President of the New York State Wrestling Officials Association, President and assignor of the Section 4 Wrestling officials association and currently serves on the Finger Lakes Regional Training Center Board, Vice President for the EIWOA and serving outstanding leadership as President on the board for the Upstate New York Chapter of the National Wrestling Hall of Fame. His leaderships on the boards he serves on are beyond noteworthy as Carl`s excellence continues in his unwavering journey.

Carl Koenig's professional career included Teaching at Oxford MS; in addition, he served as an administrator at both Oxford and Greene school districts.

Carl presently serves as an educational consultant and hearing officer for superintendent hearings at DCMO BOCES, in addition to serving on the Oxford Town Board of Directors and Chairs the Oxford Academy Hall of Distinction Committee.

In addition, during the summers Carl worked under the direction of Ben Nelson at Camp Dudley along with his friends Charlie Stratton, Mike Marks, Don Cooper and others. Camp Dudley played a special part in his life.

The chapter acknowledges the many earned outstanding accomplishments of Carl Koenig and welcomes him into the Upstate New York Chapter of the National Wrestling Hall of Fame in Stillwater, Oklahoma.



2024 Swimelar Award

The 2024 Swimelar Volunteer Award is given each year to a person or in the case of this year's recipients a group of people who have given their time freely to help better the sport. The "Tracy Ladies", Judy, Laurie and Gail, have certainly had a significant impact on the sport. Their connection to wrestling has been meaningful in many ways ... their work as score keepers, timers or any other activities at a wrestling tournament has ensured that wrestling would be done in a timely, efficient and professional manner. High school athletics are very dependent on volunteers to ensure the smooth operations of an event and volunteering enables them to fulfill the main missions of the section or host group. Wrestling tournaments could not be done if it wasn't for this core group of people – thank you Judy, Gail and Laurie!!!

The Tracy Ladies began their involvement in the sport back when their brother, Gene, was wrestling at Fulton High School. Mom and Dad made it known that the girls were expected to go to matches to support their brother. With this early parental indoctrination, the girls soon learn to enjoy the sport and all it offered. Judy pointed out that witnessing Gene cutting weight was not always easy but the end result of winning was always rewarding. As the girls grew older and entered high school many of their friends were involved in wrestling so the ladies continued with their attachment with the sport. Gail became a "wrestling maid" for the Raiders and continued the close involvement of the family. The initial connection with volunteering to assist at wrestling tournaments began in 1995 when all of the girls helped the Section III wrestling officials with their annual "Blind Men's" tournament at Oswego State. This event was a large fund-raising tourney for the officials who used the money to help outfit the Section III team at the NYSPHSAA championships. After that the girls were all in with helping with the functioning of tournaments.

The ladies thoroughly enjoyed the work and began to develop a great knowledge of the sport. They were also a joy to have at a scoring table and began to do such things like developing a system of evaluating the officials. Their brother was an outstanding official and this proved to be the guideline that they used. It was always done in good fun to help pass the time during a long day at a wrestling tournament. The wrestling officials also began to appreciate the good job that they did. Officials are always concerned about the caliber of work done by the table help and the "Tracy girls" never failed to be up to the task. Brad Hamer, Section III Wrestling Chairman, stated this about them, "for thirty some years the "Tracy girls" have been helping with wrestling tournament in Section III and all the long days working for no compensation was greatly appreciated. They were always on point and provide a fresh break from all the seriousness of competition." The girls also got engaged in assisting at the Section III golf tournament. They could be seen helping at registration, selling raffle tickets and anything else that was needed. Now they have created their own foursome and play in it. The girls have worked Sectional finals, class sectional championships, and have aided on the state level with the Boy's Dual Meet Championship as well as the Girls State Individual Championships at the SRC Arena in Syracuse.

Judy stated that what has been very rewarding to the sisters has been the camaraderie they have developed between the coaches, officials, and wrestlers. Additionally, the respect and sportsmanship that they have seen displayed throughout the years. Furthermore, they have enjoyed seeing a young junior varsity wrestler mature into a sectional champion and in some incidents a state champion ... that has been particularly gratifying. It just great to see all of our friends in wrestling at all of the events each year. However, Gail did indicate that the travel did get a little scary on some of the blizzard like evenings in the area.



2024 National Wrestling Hall of Fame Robert Feldmeier Outstanding Wrestler Award

P.J. Duke

P J Duke's wrestling started early at Carmel High School where as a 7th grader he proceeded to accomplish what few people believed was possible. At 13 years of age, P J became the youngest Division I wrestler in NYSPHSAA history to win a state title. In his first varsity season, Duke was undefeated, won a Section I championship, an Eastern State Classic championship and capped it all off by winning the NYSPHSAA title at the MVP arena in Albany. In an interview in the Journal News newspaper that year, after he was named the Journal News/lohudWestchester/Putnam Wrestler of the year, J P humbling stated, "It's pretty cool to be a seventh grader and be named number 1 out of everyone."

From there PJ has had an amazing career at Minisink Valley Central school, where he was coached by 2023 Upstate New York Chapter Hall of Fame coach Kevin Gallagher. P J's career included many outstanding high school and international championships. Some of these include the Eastern State Classic, Section IX Sectional Championships, a Super 32 Championship, a Walsh Ironman Championships, a Fargo Championship and several NYSPHSAA championships as well. Furthermore, this year P J has indicated that he will be going to Penn State to join his former high school teammate Zach Ryder after his 2024-25 high school tenure. Upon committing to Penn State, Duke stated on his Instagram account the following, "I want to thank my parents for all the sacrifices they have made to make my dreams a reality. They are the reason why I am in this position today. They have been my biggest supporters since day one. Through the highs and lows, they stuck by my side and provided me everything I could ever need and more." In addition, Duke thanked KD Training Center and Total Fitness for everything that they had provide him. In concluding, he said that he is looking forward to joining Ryder at Penn State in the 2025-26 season. I bet Cael will like to see that as well.

On the free-style side of competition P J has also obtained many outstanding accomplishments as well. This summer Duke has won the U2O Men's Freestyle World team trials in Geneva, Ohio and then traveled to Peru and won the Pan American championships. Duke is quick to recognize the impact that the KD Training Center has provided him. Coach Khaled Dasson and Mike Macchiavello have been instrumental in his development both on the mat and personally. It should be noted that P J joined fellow Penn State recruits winning the Pan-Am Championship which includes Luke Lillidahl, Connor Mirasola and his former teammate at Minisink Valley, Zach Ryder – Penn State looks to be load in the next few years. For his exceptional showing at the world trial out he was named by USA Wrestling Athlete of the Week.

P J is just not an outstanding wrestler, he is also a valuable member of his team at Minisink Valley. Coach Gallagher had this to say about Duke. "He is just different, he is a really good kid. A lot of people see him out there wrestling but they don't see the kind of teammate he really is. And what a difference he makes in our wrestling room. He is an unbelievable wrestler but he is an awesome teammate." That description speaks volume for the type of individual that P J represents and Minisink Valley has had many like Duke.



2024 National Wrestling Hall of Fame Richard "Pete" Hausrath Outstanding Wrestler Award

Ousmane Duncanson

Over the last 30 years especially, the mighty Tioga Tigers wrestling program has asserted itself as one of the premier programs in New York State while producing dozens of elite athletes and championship teams. Since 1990, no team (large or small school) has more NYSPHSAA federation tournament place winners than the Tigers' sixty-one. Tioga ranks 4th in NYS in that same time in individual state tournament champions, with the Class of 2024's Ousmane Duncanson claiming three of those titles himself.

Ousmane began his wrestling career going to Union-Endicott peewee practices at five years old. After years of paying his dues through the youth wrestling circuit, Ousmane was elevated to the combined Spencer-Van Etten/Candor Eagles varsity wrestling team as a 7th grader at Candor Junior/Senior High School under head coach Ernie Marilley in the 2018-2019 season.

Ousmane reached the 20-win mark in his first varsity campaign and qualified for the Section IV Division II championships. In the following season as an 8th grader, he achieved over 30 wins on the way to taking 3rd in Section IV at 132-pounds.

Following the spring 2021 'pandemic' season, Ousmane moved to Tioga Center and enrolled at Tioga Central CSD where he would go on to have one of the most prolific careers perhaps in the history of New York State high school athletics.

In his sophomore, junior, and senior years Ousmane would play a major role on three consecutive NYSPHSAA Class D state champion Tigers football teams under head coach Nick Aiello. The New York State Sportswriters Association (NYSSWA) named Ousmane to the All-NYS Class D team in both 2022 and 2023 as 1st team linebacker.

Following three outstanding football campaigns that lasted well into the start of wrestling season, Ousmane would help lead the Tigers to three consecutive NYSPHSAA Dual Meet team state championships under head coach Kris Harrington before capturing three individual Section IV titles and three New York State titles in 2022, 2023, and 2024.

At the state dual meet championships in Syracuse, Ousmane and the rest of the high-powered Tigers lineup cruised to three straight NYS Division II team titles a month before the individual state championships in Albany. In those three dual tournaments, Ousmane posted a perfect 12-0 record picking up crucial bonus points by pinning in ten of his twelve bouts. As is expected of outstanding senior stars, he was 4-for-4 with pins in the Tigers' run to the 2024 small school state title in January.

Leading up to his first trip to the state federation championships in 2022, a loss in mid-January would be Ousmane's last defeat in high school as he would go on to win 92 consecutive matches from Jan. 14 to his third and final state title on Feb. 23, 2024.

Unbeaten junior (37-0) and senior (33-0) campaigns ended with back-to-back NYS small school 160-pound titles to cap off a remarkable athletic career and a final individual record of 175-25 with nearly 120 career pins, good for a 66% pin rate over the course of his career.

"He loves wrestling," said Harrington on Ousmane. "For him, he's 'any place, any time.' He's not worried about who he's wrestling...he just wants to wrestle."

"Ousmane, and this whole group, was more of a 'we instead of me' group," said Harrington discussing the 2023-2024 Tigers senior class. "There was never a question about when we put a lineup together. They are winners, and that's all they cared about. Ousmane's (and the whole group in general) had the philosophy of 'let's get the team titles and then refocus on individual wrestling after."

When reflecting on his high school career, Ousmane wished to especially thank Harrington, Jason Bellis, David Crow, Ryan MacWhinnie, Mr. Josh Roe, Carson "Cork" Armstrong, and all his other coaches for their guidance.





Stephan Monchery's High School career had all the makings of a Hollywood movie. It met all of the criteria one would expect to see - controversy, struggle, loss, injury, self-doubt and finally great success! Throughout the story Stephan was the foundation of a great run of success for his high school football and wrestling teams.

On the football field Stephan was a fierce competitor, a 4-year starter on both the offensive and defensive lines. Stephan was a 4x All-Section player capped off with an All-State selection his senior year as well as being voted Section IX's top linemen by opposing coaches. During his tenure on the gridiron he led his football team to 3 Section IX Championship appearances and 2 Section IX Championships. Stephan was simply unstoppable on the football field, his ability to make the plays needed at key points in huge games was motivational to all of his teammates. He was unanimously voted team captain by his peers and was the prototypical "lead by example" captain that every coach aspires to have to lead their team. A man of very few words who let his actions speak for him but when he spoke his teammates knew to listen.

As great as he was on the football field he was more so on the mat. As a 7th grader Stephan was brought up to the varsity team to wrestle at 285 lbs, something we have never seen at the Division 1 level in NYS. His first varsity match was a home match against Washingtonville where he picked up the first of 132 career pins. In his first tournament in Horseheads NY, he went 7-0 with 6 pins and was unanimously selected as the tournament's Most Outstanding Wrestler. He went on to have 29 wins his 7th grade season and earn his first of 6 All-Section placings.

As an 8th grader Stephan was ranked in the top 8 of NYS most of the season, he then finished as the Section IX runner-up. His freshman year was canceled due to COVID, but he was able to compete at the Journeyman NYS Championship where Stephan finished 6th and earned his first of 4 NYS Medals.

Stephan's sophomore year began with an unbearable loss as his oldest brother Stevie, passed away. This tragic loss delayed the start to his sophomore year but lit a fire inside of Stephan to reach new levels of greatness. By year's end Stephan had made his mark in NYS and nationally. After winning his first of 3 Section IX Championships he finished 5th in NYS. He then switched his focus to off-season wrestling where he finished 3rd at the NHSCA Nationals and 4th at the USAW Greco-Roman Nationals.

During his Junior season on the football field he took an awkward hit which resulted in a hlsach fracture. The injury persisted all football and wrestling season, but he never let anyone know the severity. During his junior season he set the program record for wins in a career, won his first of 2 Eastern States titles, his 2nd Section title and became the school's first state finalist in 23 years. Immediately following the season, he had surgery to repair the broken bone in his arm.

The senior season became Stephan's Hollywood ending, and no one earned and deserved it more. He started by leading our football team to its 2nd title in four seasons, being voted the Section's lineman of the year while also earning All-State honors. Then wrestling began and Stephan was on a mission. He helped lead the Middletown Middles to their first ever Section IX Dual Meet Championship. Stephan finished the season 42-0, and won the NYSPHSAA Championship. In the spring Stephan capped off the greatest career by a Middletown athlete and won the NHSCA National Championship. For his remarkable career the Section IX Wrestling coaches voted him the recipient of the Troy Bouzakis Male Senior Athlete Award.

It's hard to put into words what Stephan has meant to our community. He has inspired so many young Middletown athletes to see that they are capable of reaching greatness with hard work, dedication and loyalty. He recently committed to wrestle for Appalachian State and even while he is away, his career and perseverance serves as motivation that greatness does come from Middletown, NY.

Stephan was nominated by the Chapter for the Dave Schultz Award which was eventually given to another wrestler from Section V. The Chapter congratulates and acknowledge Stephan for his remarkable career.

Ragan Retell

There was no doubt as to the sound they heard – a low and menacing growl – a warning to keep your distance. This was Chris and Kevin Retell's first encounter with the six-month old who would be returning home with them to the Capital Region from the Central Asian Republic of Kazakhstan. As Kevin recalls, "[w]hen Chris I and first met Ragan, we knew right away she was right for us ... she was adorable of course, but the growl cemented the relationship, since Ragan would be joining a family with three rambunctious older brothers, all wrestlers. She would have to be tough."

And tough she would turn out to be. Dad Kevin coached wrestling, first at Shaker High and then at Tamarac High, and he and Chris spent many a weekend carting the boys and others to wrestling tournaments. By the age of six, Ragan insisted on joining in the fun, at first over the objections of mom and dad. After they grudgingly relented, Ragan started winning pee wee tournaments competing against boys. The winning continued, with Ragan placing four times at Fargo, third and second at Eastern States her, respectively, her junior and senior years, placing second in the first girls (unofficial) state championships and capping her high school career off with a state championship this past winter at the first official New York State Public High School Association state championships.

Ragan also found time to excel on her high school soccer team, where she played goalie and made the league All-Star second team, served on the Student Council, volunteered with her school's youth wrestling program, participated in 4-H and helped raise money for numerous charitable organizations, including the Humane Society.

These successes and achievements, together with solid grades and a winning and magnetic smile, garnered the attention of a number of college coaches in a sport exploding in popularity around the country. One of those was Elmira College, where Ragan has chosen to enroll and continue her studies and participation in our great sport.

Ragan journey from a Kazakh orphanage to success as a student-athlete in the United States is an inspiration to all. There is no doubt that Chris and Kevin, both teachers, instilled a respect for the importance of education, and that Kevin and her brothers, Blake, Riley and Bryce, all top wrestlers in their right, helped infuse her competitive spirit. However, the blood of those rough and ready ancestors from the Central Asian steppe seems to also play a continuing part in the story. When asked if there was anything in particular he remembers from the night Ragan won the New York State championship, dad's reply was "I could have sworn I heard that growl when she first stepped on the mat."






