Coach Don Testa's grapplers captured the E.C.I.C. Division I wrestling championship with a near-perfect record of 13 wins and 1 loss. After clinching the title, they lost their last match to Maryvale. Harold Bluestein (98 lbs.) was undefeated, while Dan Kathan suffered only one loss.

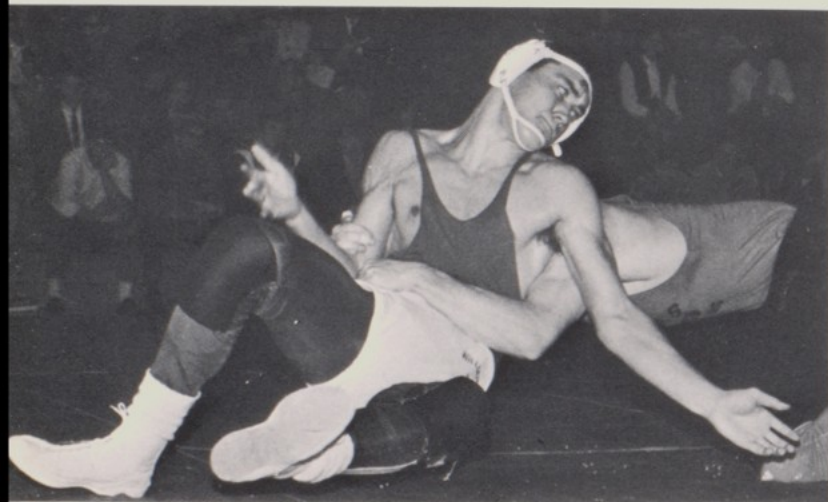
The team took second in the AAA sectionals, with Denny Brown placing first in the 148-lb. class. Upsetting Maryvale's John Blaszkiewicz, who had dealt him his only loss all season, Brown was named outstanding wrestler of the tournament.

Also placing in the sectionals were Dan Kathan, Bob Thompson, Milt Schoch, Harold Bluestein and Co-captains John Sarver and Mel Herberger. With the loss of only three seniors, Coach Testa should have no trouble next year defending his title.

Under Mr. Robert Snyder, new assistant coach, the B team kept pace with the varsity. Their only loss in 13 matches was by 2 points.

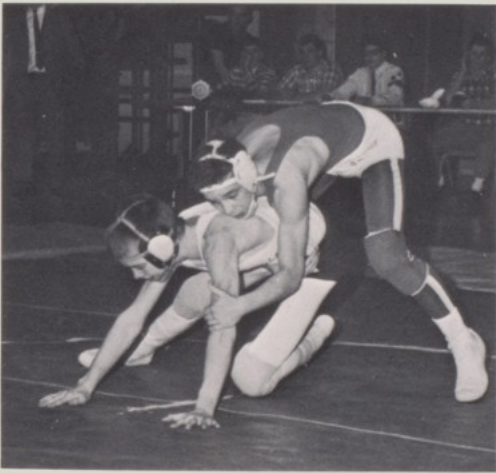

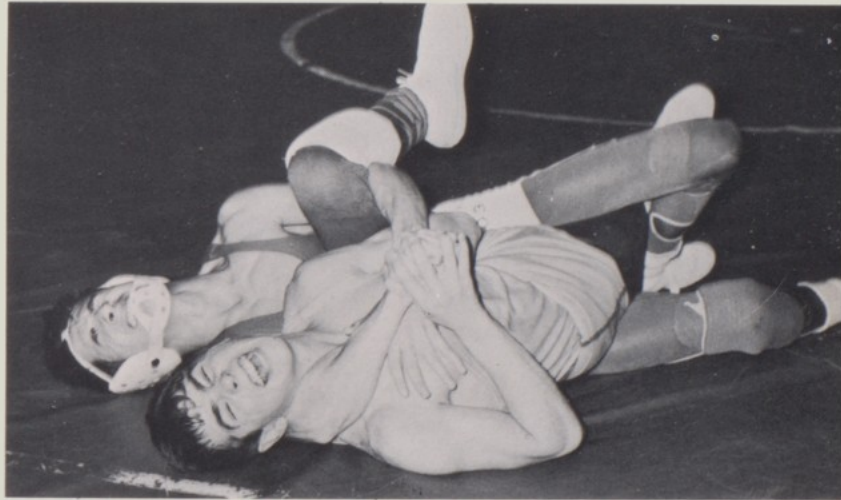

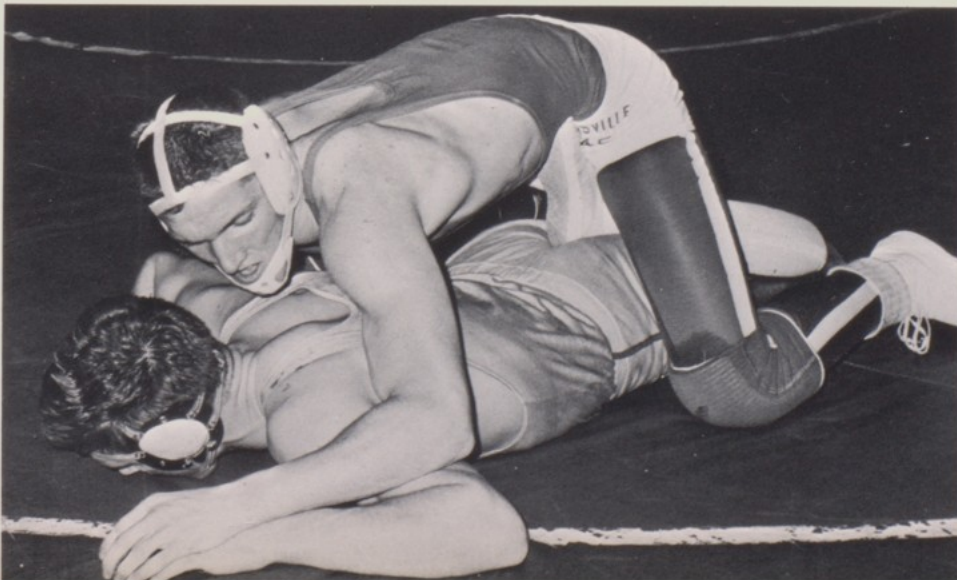
