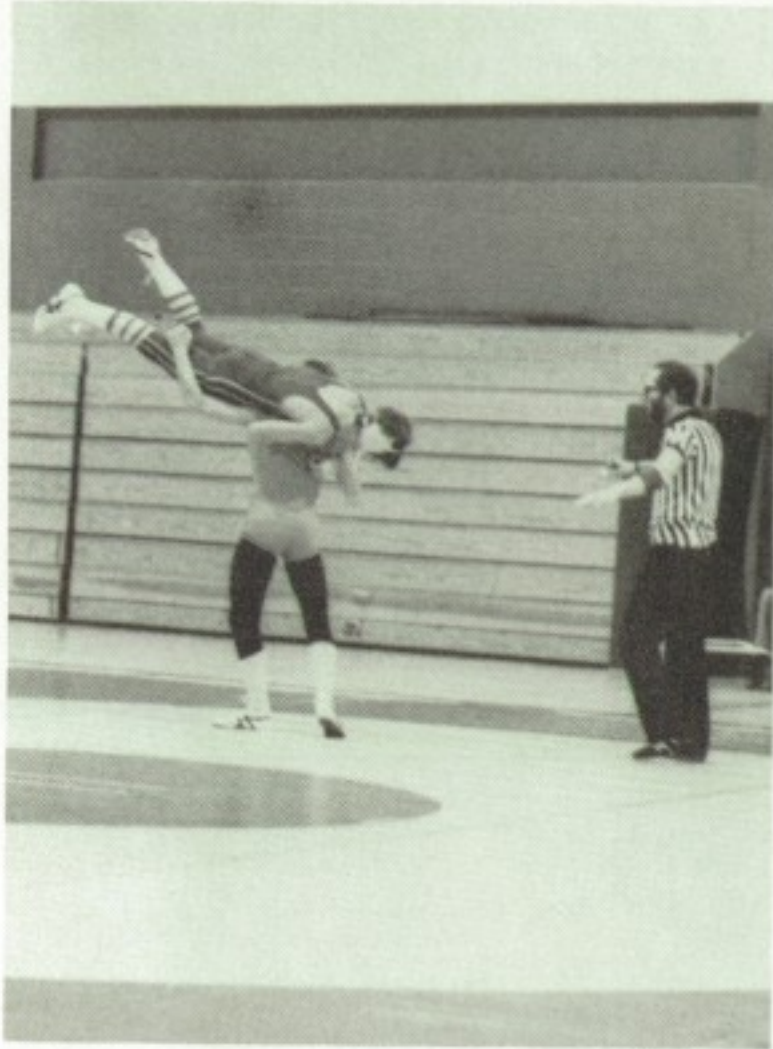


Jeff Girndt shoots from his target '22 in a prone position. Those are empty shells scattered all over. ▶

Senior Steve Rock kneels and takes careful aim at the bull's eye targets in a fall-out shelter at South H.S. ▼

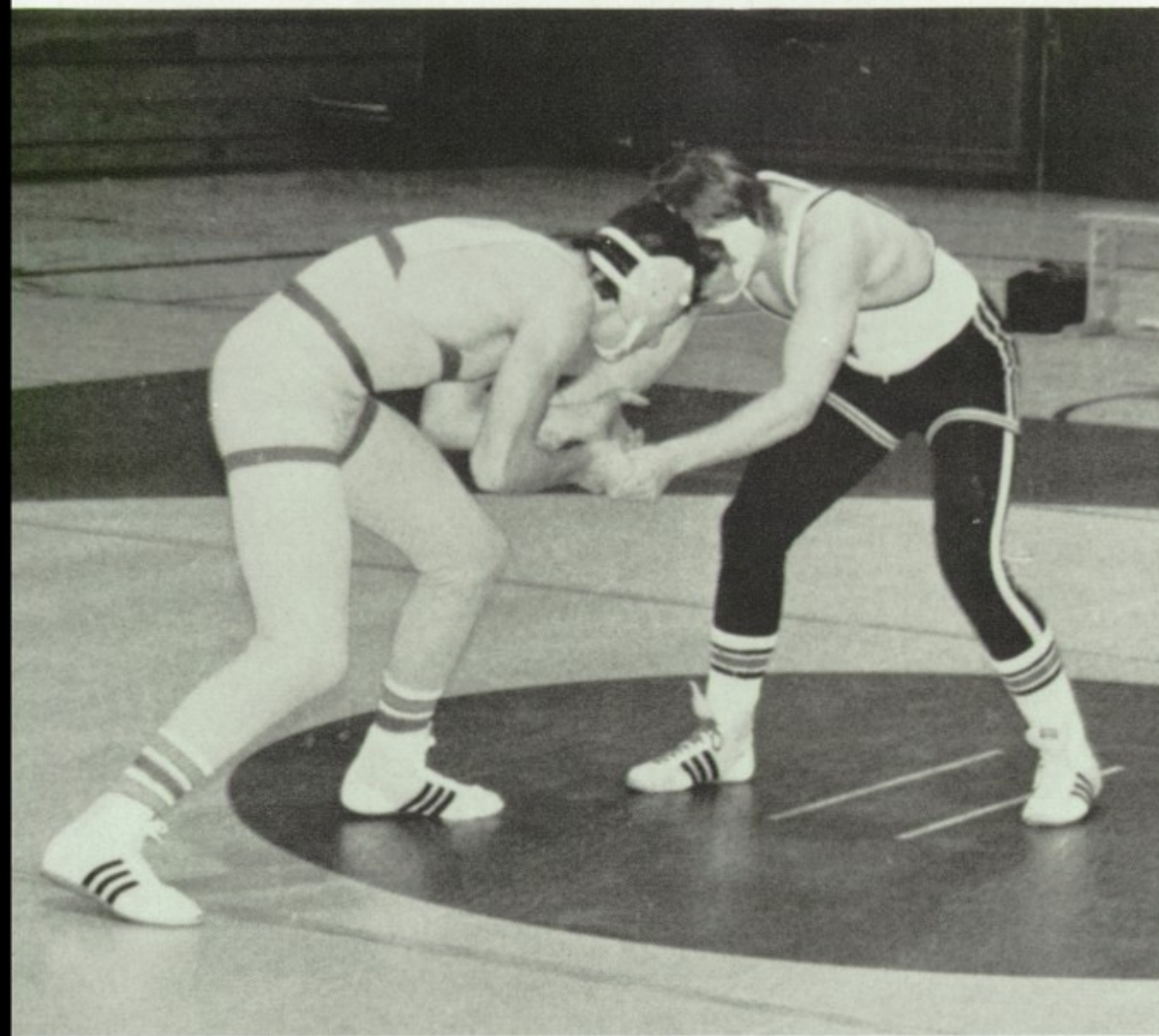

# Mechanical and Physical Power



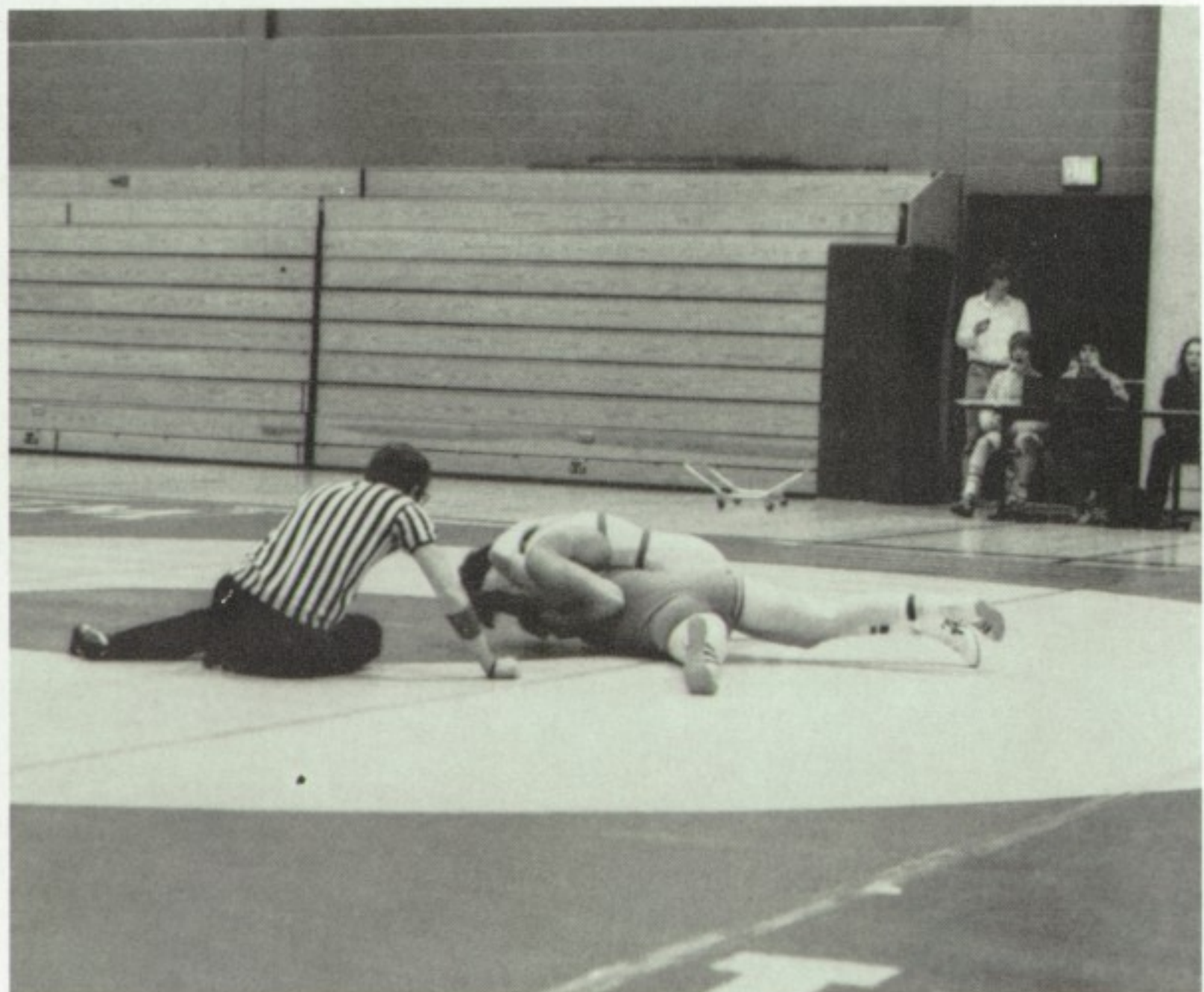
