The new team under the able coachmanship of Hayward "Red" Plummer and Mr. Hoover ended a successful '33 season. The inexperienced Paul Smith's team lost its first two meets to seasoned Champlain and Mohawk College outfits but as it gathered experience, defeated the veteran St. Lawrence University Junior Varsity team twice.

When Coach "Red" Plummer made the announcement that he was willing to coach the Paul Smith's College wrestling team, there were a number of contenders who went out for the team. Since most of the men knew little or nothing about wrestling, Mr. Plummer began by teaching them the wrestling. They learned sixtrophs, wings, wrist-holds, and stopovers. With the aid of experienced Tom Conley, 120 pound contender from Mohawk College, they prepared for the meet with veteran Champlain College, which had already engaged in five meets.

The team journeyed to Utica on February 25 to battle Mohawk College. They lost 20-0, but the score gave no indication of what actually took place. The wrestlers won their first two weights and lost the others by close decisions. The next men then pulled a surprise upset as they defeated St. Lawrence J V's 10-14.

On March 16, the team again defeated the St. Lawrence J V's 10-14, in an exhibition meet at Saranac Hospital in Tupper Lake, N. Y.
