The two met in last year's state finals, with Bena scoring a first round fall. Shifflet won state titles in folkstyle, freestyle, and Greco this year. In round three, Kent Maslin scored an 8-4 upset win over Shifflet. He lost his first match, though, to LaMountain, & took fifth.

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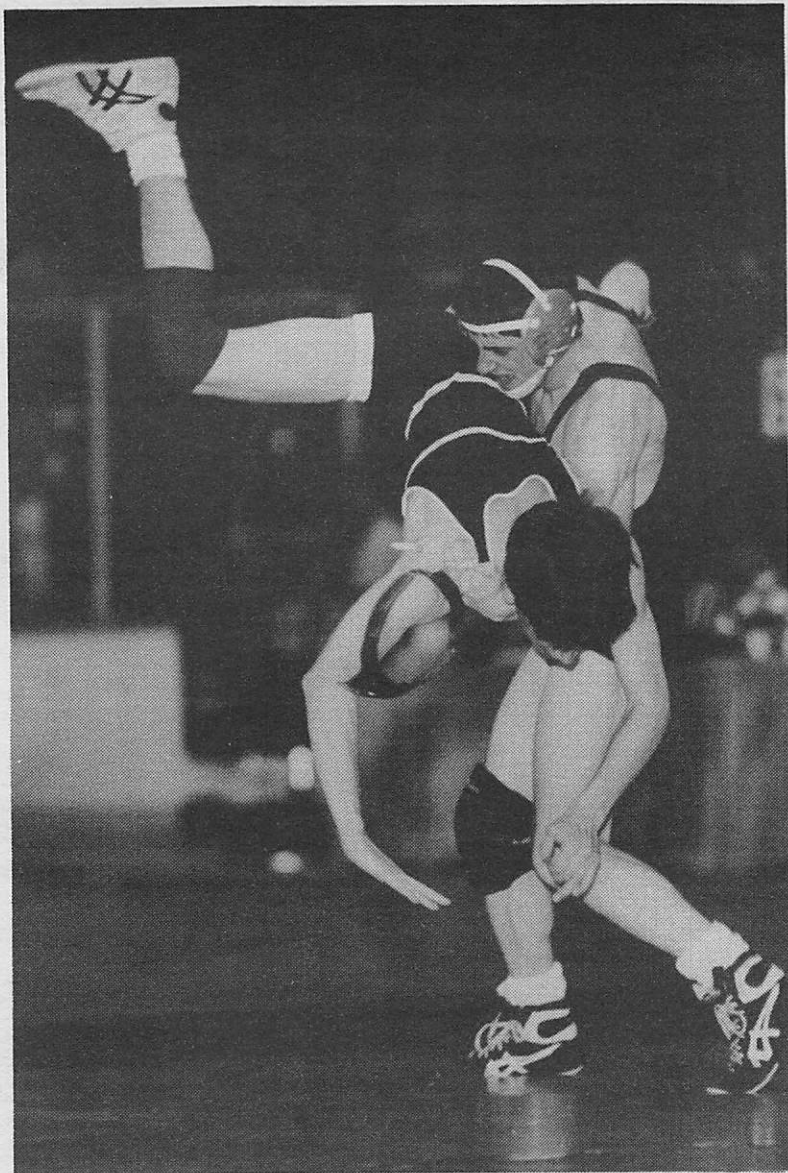
