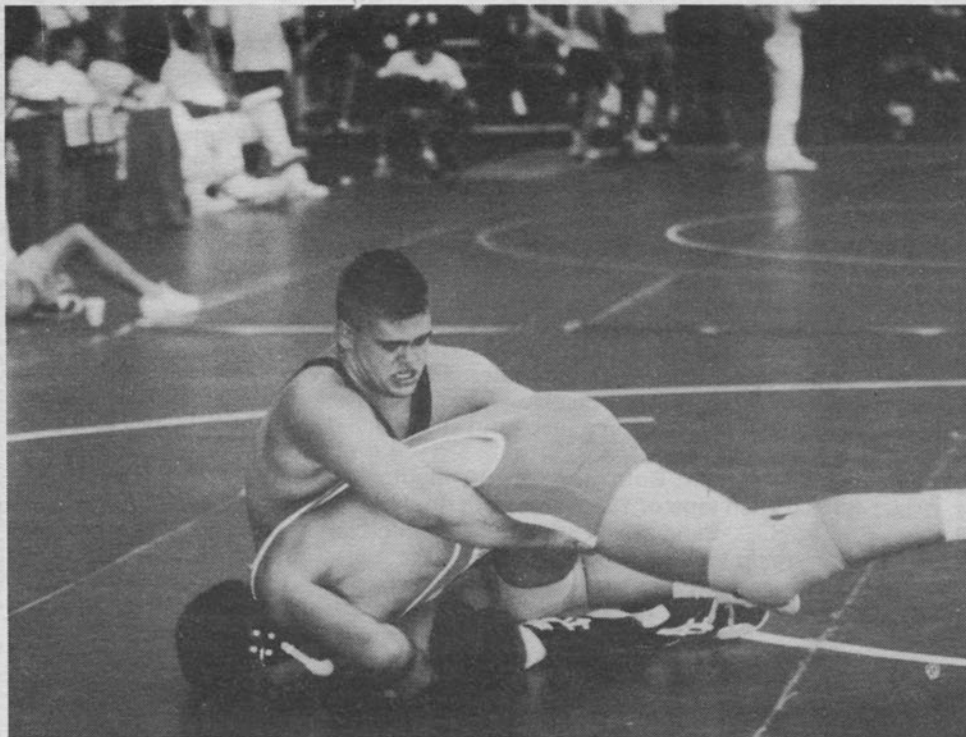

The surprise section here was New York City, which edged powerful Long Island by two points for second place. Adirondack, now most powerful in Greco, not surprisingly finished a distant last in the Open Freestyle

Adirondack, powered by the world-renowned Adirondack Three-Style Wrestling Association (ATWA), took top honors in a competitive event. Western Region was a close second, with Long Island a distant third.

The most competitive division of the Games

was the scholastic freestyle. Tied for first place was Central and Long Island with 85 points. Tied for second was Hudson Valley and Western at 73 points. Adirondack was a solid fifth with 42 points, while New York barely survived a shut-out by getting 3 points on the board.

Powerful Central gained nearly 100 points in clearly outdistancing the field for top honors. In a solid runner-up position was Long Island, with Western edging Adirondack by two points.

The always-strong Central Region (Syracuse and Central New York State) took the team title over runner-up Long Island.
